I will be contacting the few people I know in Britain to suggest an Associate Custodian; I'd appreciate it if you'd do the same.

NOTEE OF HEARING & CALL FOR EVIDENCE: ORPHAN GAMES PROJECT

Over the past few years, functionaries of the IDA have attempted to usurp or seize the functions or office of Raymond Heuer, Director of Orphan Games, Associate MNC and Head of the Variant Orphan Rescue Service. In addition, the IDA Treasurers have refused to honor outstanding subsidies to him for regular orphans placed. The excuse usually given for these acts is that Mr. Heuer is not performing his office.

The office in question is the placement of regular, variant, and other diplomatic games with a new gamesmaster or publisher when the old gamesmaster or publisher defaults or requests it, and the game cannot be placed by the gamesmaster or publisher, or by any regional game insurance group he belongs to.

Any person having evidence of failure of performance of other grounds for complaint should submit a detailed statement to myself, Robert Sacks, 4861 Broadway 5-V, New York, NY, 10034, as soon as possible, in no case later than 1 May 1980. A report of nonperformance should include the game identifier, number of times the orphan was reported to the Director of Orphan Games, how much information was reported to him, and a historaical description of the episode. A report of other grounds should be equally descriptive. Mr. Heuer will be given an opportunity to respond to any report, and the report is subject to independent verification by the Variant Ombudsman, Roger Oliver.

Should no detailed report of nonperformance or other grounds be submitted to me by 1 May 1980, this inquiry will be adjourned without further action, and a public report will be made to that effect. If any detailed reports are submitted, I will convene a commission of inquiry consisting of hobby officers who should be able to convene in person. The commission is planned as:

In addition, depending on circumstances, the Ombudsman or a ranking official of the IDA and/or the proposed NADF may be invited onto the commission. The commission will meet at some mutually convenient time with Mr. Heuer to determine whether there are any substantial valid complaints against him, and if so, what action should be taken. A public report will be made of the findings.
