The DANISH GAMBIT

At Last, a Tactics Article in LSD!

As a Diplomacy game begins, opening negotiations may cause the German player to fear an alliance between England and France is certain. Perhaps he is too slow in his correspondence, has received sound information on their plans, or just has a very bad feeling from the letters they have sent. If he doesn't act quickly and effectively to break up, or at least slow down this alliance, our Kaiser will be the first to say auf Wiedersehen!

Germany has several possibilities for opening moves, each well known. Something they all have in common is the occupation of Denmark during the first two seasons, while trying to protect the French border. At the end of 1901 German lines are stretched. Even with two builds, defense is a guessing game of support: a game Germany eventually loses. fore, a smart Kaiser may benefit by completely ignoring Denmark for at least a year. This is actually a minor loss, since by trading it for Belgium, he gains a solid offensive position.


The Danish Gambit accomplishes two important things. First, England's attention is immediately diverted to the north, by offering a wide-open Denmark. The result is that England and Russia quickly become embroiled in a battle for Scandinavia, with little chance for a quick resolution. Second, by taking both Holland and Belgium in the first year, Germany is in a good position to begin negotiations with Italy. With German troops moving into France, Italy is much easier to sway towards a French assault. Thus, our Kaiser is able to sidetrack one enemy, and gain positional advantage to deal with the other.

If the war goes well against France, Germany may move on Scandinavia by allying with either England or Russia. This could be as early as S'02 if Italy has attacked Marseilles and plans to press an offensive against France. Generally it is better to side with the country losing the northern war, as the victor will already be a threat to Germany.

For an experimental Kaiser, planning to use the Danish Gambit from the beginning can be very rewarding. By informing Russia and Italy of German formed. Russia's A Mos-Stp and Italy's A Ven-Pie give the German moves much greater strength to carry an attack into France.

This opening should also be effective in Gunboat Diplomacy. Without negotiations, the chances of a joint E-F attack on Belgium and the possibilities for E-R peace terms vertually disappear.

Normally, every attempt should be made at the start of the game to ally with either France or England. However, if it appears that the E-F juggernaut will arise, the Danish Gambit can be a very effective defense where others fail.

Or maybe it just doesn't matter. At any rate, they have transformed their subzine into a full-fledged zine in its own right. The zine is called PERELANDRA, a place that doesn't exist, and the pubber is P. J. Gaughan. I saw Vol. 1, No. 0, which was a two-page flyer, but it looks promising. P.J. promises an 8-page digest at the rate of \$5 for ten issues. Since it is just starting up there are plenty of game openings so you should sample this one soon.

FAKES. Gary Coughlan's recent fake WHITESTONIA went right past me. Since John Caruso and I don't trade anymore, we exchange only an occasional issue, but I couldn't figure out why he sent me this one. He didn't. A closer look after reading about the fake in other zines finally clued me in. A pretty good effort, Gary! It really fooled me! ¶It was a little easier to spot DIPLOMACY DIGRESS as a fake (I'm not a total simpleton!), because it was so short and didn't have Mark Berch's trademark center staple. This was such a good fake that I'd be proud to take credit, but I won't. Too many people are doing that already. Is Gary C. responsible for this one too?



LSD#19 was fine, as always. I was glad to see the second installment of my "fictional places" article. I would like to update some information in it.

First, PELLENNORATH#6 is now out, as well as It is #5 which covers Graustark, Ruritania, and others, and a copy is \$1 from me. PELL#6 covers Utopia, Atlantis, Robinson Crusoe's island, and the "War of the Worlds" (Wells). That is also \$1, although any two or mre issues of PELL may be ordered for 80¢ each. In addition, there is PELLENNORATHa, which is a bibliographic checklist. It lists worls alphabetically by author in terms of one entry per fictional place. Each entry may have one or more works cited. It contains over 550 entries and is being updated in PELL#6 and the upcoming #7. PELLa is \$2. #7 will cover various Balkan places: right now I plan to cover Poderkagg, Maiacia, Orsinia, Calbia, and Hernia. The latter will be a reprint of a fannish item, portions of Fodor's Guide to Hernia by Terry Kuch. I don't usually reprint fannish material, but this is too good to pass up. It was originally in a Dipzine, THULCANDRA.

Second, I'd like to thank Steve Langley for his letter. The "Maiafrena" which gives Ursula LeGuin's novel its title is the Val Maiafrena in Mantayna Province of Orsinia; it is not the name of the country. Islandia appears not only in Wright's novel of the same name, but also in three novels by Mark Saxton: The Islar, The Two Kingdoms, and Chaos in Islandia. The last is being released this year--May, I believe. Mark is very close to the Wright estate and has access to the whole corpus of the latter's history, geography, etc. of the country (and the Karain Continent, on which it is located).

Orsinia, by the way, also appears in LeGuin's Orsinian Tales. People familiar with her work should be cautious about this and Malafrena. These are not fantasy nor sf books. They are mainstream fiction set in a fictional place. Orsinia is presently a People's Republic. The Tales derives from various periods in Orsinia's history, from the 12th century to the very recent past. But other than the fictional geographical setting, there is not a single element of fantasy in either book. Despite that, if you want

them, you have to go to the sf section of your bookstore (used copies are plentiful), because Ursula has been typecast by dealers.

Third: a sample of a back issue of DIPLOMACY WORLD is indeed \$2-but a subscription is 4/\$6, or \$1.50 a copy. Subs begin with the next upcoming issue, of course. We think we're worth it.

In my opinion, LSD is one of the finest gamezines in the whole hobby, past or present. I would not hesitate to recommend your zine to anyone. It's a real pleasure to read every issue. I hope to see you in the very top group in the next Leeder Poll.



Shore Places That Don't Exist

THE DIPLOMANIACS CREATE THEIR OWN

Not content with the wide range of fictional places available already, Diplomacy players and GMs have over the years created their own. In the instances under discussion here, a considerable body of literature was written for each.

The first, and perhaps the best, was the Grand Duchy of Beaucouillon, created by John Boardman in GRAUSTARK. Beaucouillon was a sort of fantastic Monaco whose profligate ruling family had probably committed every sin known to man plus invented a few new ones. The primary industry of the country centered around its gambling houses. People from all over the world would come to bet on nearly everything, including the outcome of the current war (i.e., the game). Betting odds were posted on each nation each season, which in fact represented the GM's estimate of that country's chance of winning. A large number of segments of a history of Beaucouillon was also published in GRAUSTARK. Numerous press releases came from there, also.

A later Boardman creation was the "Four and One Half Kingdoms" of the Balkan Massif. These include: the Kingdom of Skandalutz, the Temporary Roman Empire, the Pravoslavnian Patrimony of Polykarp, the Grand Duchy of Wogastisburg-Schlämpenbüttel, and the People's Republic of Pundschdruk. A history of the four-and-one-half kingdoms was printed in several issues of GRAUSTARK in early 1971, with a considerable body of later updating material and a lot of press.

A locale similar to Beaucouillon was my Hitt-al-Gushurr, an Arab sheikhdom which made most of its income from its gambling establishments, notably the "Golden Tent".

Probably near the four-and-one-half kingdoms in the Balkans was Terry Kuch's somewhat earlier (late 60s) Hernia. Terry published the excellent if short-lived zine THULCANDRA. That name itself was taken from a work of fiction, C.S.Lewis' so-called "Ransom" trilogy. The name first appears in Out of the Silent Planet. Anyway, Terry published several sections from Fodor's Guide to Hernia, which were republished in EREHWON. Numerous press releases also


relate to the Duchy and to its ruler, Duke Nosebeard IX (actually, half-ruler: Hernia came out of the war divided as were so many nations, although there is no physical boundary; Hernia is simultaneously a Duchy and a People's Republic).

A strange hybrid is Poderkagg, with which I've been closely identified for years. It was taken from the book Adrift in a Boneyard, mentioned in the last article. However, I changed Taylor's Poderkagg to suit myself, including restoring the monarchy in the Person of King Pandemonium V (whose successor, Pandemonium VI is now on the throne). A map of the Kingdom was produced, also showing its detached dependency, the Autocephalous County of Lurch. A complete dynastic chart for the ruling family was produced, and a history of Poderkagg has been written and published, going through about the time of the fail of Constantinople to the Turks. A large body of press releases was also written.

Perhaps the most famous "fictional" country to arise directly from a game and its press releases occurred in 1966AA. Russia had been reduced to Sevastopol in that game and Charles Turner of Walnut Creek, California, took over the position. His state was proclaimed the Grand Empire of Sevastopol, ruled over by the Mad Satirical Monk, A.B.Swensonoff, and his bevy of 666 virgin feather-dancers (so-called because their feathers had not been used before). Usually a one-unit position like this goes under fairly quickly, but this one lasted 11 game-years! The body of press from the Grand Empire, apparently written jointly by several members of the Lafayette Tactics Association, is considerable.

This listing is probably not exhaustive, being partly compiled from memory and without direct access to much of the hobby material published during portions of the 70s. Anyone knowing other examples is more than welcome to write me about them, please.

To add to the 2nd article, we have one more movie: "Penny Princess", in which appears, or is mentioned, Lampedorra.



- I) The four individuals listed have names or nicknames involving colors: Eric the Red, the Black Prince, the "Red Baron", and William of Orange, respectively. The last may be a bit farfetched, since I'm not sure that the original Dutch meaning of "orange" had anything to do with color.
- 2) The first Queen of England who ruled in her own right was Lady Jane Grey, who ruled for nine days before being deposed (and later beheaded) by Mary I. Mention should be made, however, of Princess Matilda, daughter of Henry I. Henry proclaimed her as heir, but her claim was usurped by Stephen of Bois after Henry's death. Matilda struggled, but failed, to regain the Crown.

- 4) The "Oxford Parliament" was convened in January 1644 by Charles I. It was intended as a rival to the so-called "Long Parliament", Charles's opponent in the Civil War. It met in Oxford, which along with York was one of Charles's power centers.


