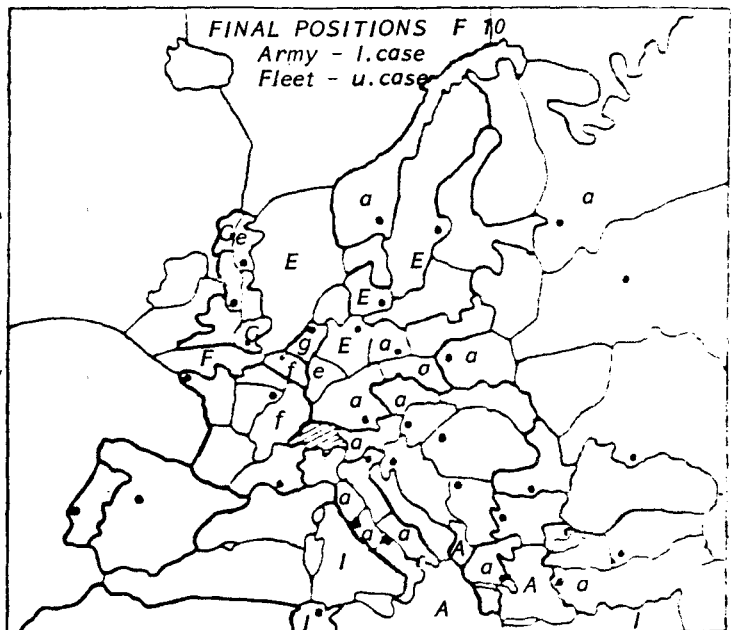
Germany: Al Giddings



What a game! I loved and hated this game, and in the same vein I'm both glad and sad it's over. In the 3+ years of my postal play I have NMRed twice, both in Derrick. This makes me sad, as in neither case did I forget to send in orders. The first, at a crucial time when England grew instead of me, was due to a foulup in my conditional orders. The second was even more of a surprise to me as the game ended in the process. But I never received LSD#26, and hearing in the delay that LSD might fold, I figured it either had folded or would be late, as Mike was ill. One should never assume, but such was this particular game.

From Germany's standpoint I tried to negotiate a central alliance from day one. That seems to be all I accomplished. It worked out, but my bounce of Russia in Sweden put me at war with him. The highlight of the game to me was a tossup between the enjoyment I had in screwing with France and England and the funny press from El Zappo. I was having such fun with bouncing from England's side to France's that I forgot about the real idea behind the game: winning. My perfidy in the West kept that portion of the board in a mess which would never clear up. But thanks to that and to my NMRs I finished low man on the survivor list. On the other hand, since Russia, England, and France all hated my guts, once Turkey was out, the winner would probably end up being Ned or Mark--at least a central power.

A funny thing happened around 1905. Italy & I were thinking (wishfully) that we were in the driver's seat and had grand plans to cut up Ned and Jack. My stab of England failed terribly, and I never recovered. At that time I remember France ha F Wal and F Lpl. England was in Nth, Eng, and Nat, with a fleet in Cly. I saw England moving Cly-Lpl with support from Nat and also Nth-Lon with support from Eng. I moved F Hol-Nth and F Den-Ska in hopes of taking Edi and Nwy in Fall. Instead, England moved Nth-Nwy and used Cly to support Nat-Lpl. Rats!



I really enjoyed the free-for-all in this game. Allies came and went with the wind--along with a fake or forged letters. What dirt bags this game attracted! To all who played: thanks for a good time. Keep El Zappo around, Luedi, but teach him how to spell. He uses too many Zs. Mr. Pierce, what can I say? Our relationship started out crappy, then got worse. So why didn't I take your last unit long before it went? I guess I wanted to keep the press war going. Mr. Henry, why is your handwriting almost as bad as mine? How old are you anyway? Does Jack Smith fully understand the rules of play? It was nice to see someone bungle as much or more than I did. Has anyone seen Bobby Stephens? Guess I should have acted more like a gentleman when we met in Dallas. Congrats, Ned, from your faithful puppet. Next time I hope it will be much different.

Italy: Mark Luedi

For those who had not yet figured it out, this was my first postal game. I made some rather crucial errors, and am probably lucky to have survived in this game. Most importantly, I learned that you cannot fight a two-front war in Diplomacy.

Al Giddings essentially controlled this game, at least from my vantage point. He got the AIG alliance going in 1901 and managed to get England and France to spar with one another in a classic cat and mouse game. At one point we entered into a two-way alliance which might have worked. But somehow England and France patched their differences, and Russian help against Austria failed to materialize. This happened all at once, and there went the two-way, down the drain.

After that, it was only a matter of time before Ned had the game wrapped up. I don't know what got Al and Jack Smith going at each other, but the Austrians might have been stopped if not for their continual conflicts.

Through 1905 this was a most enjoyable game. After that, it was merely writing on the wall. Congrats, Ned, on the victory, and thanks, Mike, for a well run game.

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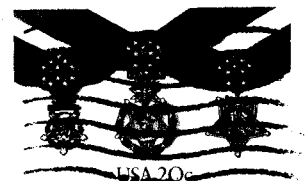
