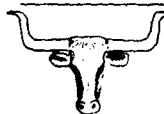

TWO POWERS TURN BACK ON ARMS
RACE AS EASTERN BATTLES LOOM

RUNESTONE RESULTS. Results of the Runestone Poll (of North American zines and GMs) have appeared. The top ten zines are EUROPA EXPRESS, DIPLOMACY BY MOONLIGHT, SNAFU!, JUST AMONG FRIENDS, APPALLING GREED, SLEEPLESS KNIGHTS, THE PRINCE, VOICE OF DOOM, DOGS OF WAR, and ENVOY. LSD dropped from 9th last year to 24th, which reflects the reduction in size and frequency of publication since last year. Only one zine from last year's top ten made it to this year's top ten: Gary Coughlan's EE. The top ten GMs for this year are Doug Beyerlein, John Daly, Bob Osuch, Dave Carter, Andy Lischett, Jim Meinel, Mark Larzere, Steve Heinowski, Gary Coughlan, and Ron Brown of Canada. I came in at 22nd, but I don't remember how I did last year, so I can't give you a comparison right now, but that probably represented a drop from the previous poll. In the two polls 57 zines and 57 GMs received votes.

INFLUENTIAL PLAYERS. Don (Dan?) Stafford has compiled a list of the five winningest players over the past five years (draws are also considered): Lee Kendter, Sr., Kathy Byrne, Jack Masters, Don Ditter, and Dave Carter.

I know you have many serious problems lately. I am sorry. I suggest you fold LSD rather than continue this way and ruin your reputation.

Concerning your postscript, I presume you mean that you mailed your orders for last season. Either I did not receive them, or they were mislaid. That constitutes an NMR, like it or not (I don't like it, but the game goes on). Publishing regularity has improved recently with the advent of 6-week turn periods. And finally, my adjudication (and/or misprints) is about as bad as it has been in the past--definitely not error-free. I'm sorry you feel you have to dissociate yourself from LSD, but I can understand your reasons. Since your country has only one unit, your resignation won't have a great effect on the game. Austria will be in civil disorder.
