I have experienced several incidents in which the mail service has broken down when corresponding to Whitt. I think this whole situation could be ironed out with a little Diplomacy.

I agree with your assessment that the USPS is probably the reason Whitt NMRed, although it is not impossible that his orders came and I lost them. At any rate, there seems to be little room for diplomacy in light of Whitt's decision to quit the game and cancel his sub to LSD. I respect his decision and have no hard feelings, and life goes on.

Dear Mike,

Regarding the rulebook changes, I am upset. I am upset that I don not read about them in the Avalon Hill General, the official organ in which such information is supposed to be released.

I am upset that new Rule XII.5 stinks. The old wording was clear, concise language. The example stunk, but the example and the commentary which follows it are unchanged. The problem before was that the example was a limited application of the rule and led many to conclude it was not intended to have general applicability, but only remedy the type of situation dealt with in the example and commentary. The new rule does not limit itself to the Brannan Rule (convoyed attack comes from space of last convoying fleet) to invoke Rule X (the general rule for cutting support). Far from it. The new wording leaves us open to bizzare situations in which A Lon-Den convoyed by F Nth does not cut F Den s F Ber-Bal.

I am upset by new Rule XII.6 requiring an assessment of what a player intended based solely upon the orders that the player submitted. If it were so easy to tell, such a rule would not be needed in the first place.

Think about it. An army is ordered to an adjacent province in the usual fashion, without elaboration: A Bre-Pic. Much to the consternation of the poor slob who has to adjudicate the mess, F Eng c A Bre-Pic fails because someone had the audacity to dislodge the fleet. There is nothing by which to judge the intent of the player who wrote A Bre-Pic unless he specified overland or by convoy. It was his failure to specify his intent that makes it impossible to be sure. The new rule does not say that unwanted convoys can be refused. Not saying so is not conclusive. Why not just insist that an army to be convoyed to an adjacent province be so ordered itself: A Bre-Pic by convoy? The game is one of skill, not

The game is one of skill, not chance. The best interest of the hobby is in working toward uniformity of adjudication, consistency, and the same result every time. Did the player intend a standoff with the unit in the adjacent province? Did the player intend that A Bre change places with the unit in Pic instead? If the player did not specify in his written orders to A Bre, how can you tell, even if F Eng is of another nationality?

I am upset by the outright reversal of Rule XII.4 regarding ambiguous convoy routes. Why not



require that all possible convoy routes except one be disregarded based on the intent as shown by the totality of the orders written by the player governing the army? That kind of hare-brained solution is found in new Rule XII.6, isn't it? Is it that unwanted convoys are okay if they cause the movement order of an army to succeed? Why not make Rule XII.6 consistent with the spirit of Rule XII.4 by providing that if the orders as writtin permit more than one route (overland or by convoy) by which the army can proceed, the order is not voided by the ambiguity and the army is not prevented from moving due to dislodgement of the fleet unless overland movement is blocked also? Why not?


