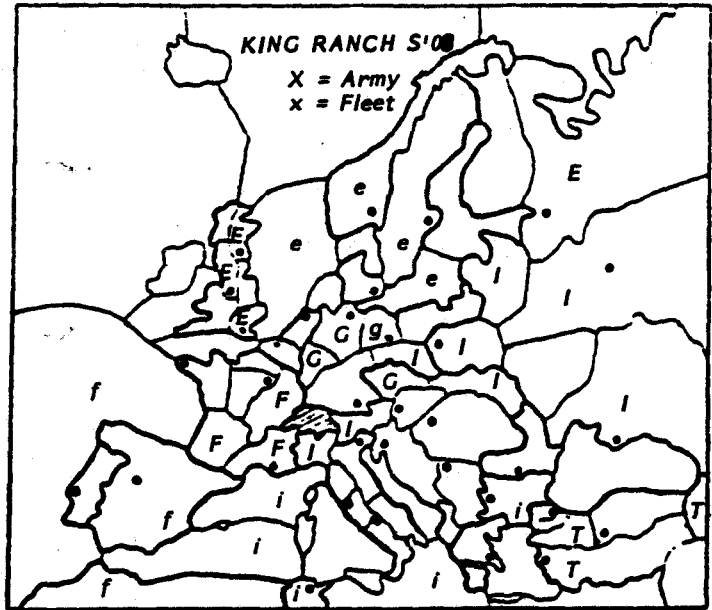

BACK TO THE WARS. I hope all of you enjoyed the holidays and are ready to get back to the Diplomacy boards. I spent a few days on the coast with my family for Christmas. The highlights included too much rich food and endless football on the tube. My best present came from my sister, who crocheted an afghan for me. Since I don't have Caruso to keep my lap warm when I type LSD, I needed another lapwarmer. I toasted in 1985 with out-of-town friends staying in the Hyatt. Pity the hapless folks boogying on the ground floor of the atrium. A lot of junk gets thrown from 18 floors of balconies on New Year's Eve. Thanks for all the holiday greetings. I especially liked the ones with photographs of your families.

LET IT SNOW. I've been translating a lot of meteorological research the last several months, and the latest data from Soviet researchers indicate that the recent spate of weird weather may partly be a consequence of the eruption of El Chichon in Mexico several years ago. (The studies tie in with the "nuclear winter" theory currently in vogue, and the conclusions are pretty convincing.) I know that many of you experience severe weather every year, and that records are being set all over. It was no exception in Austin. We had two (2) snowfalls this month, each one setting new marks. 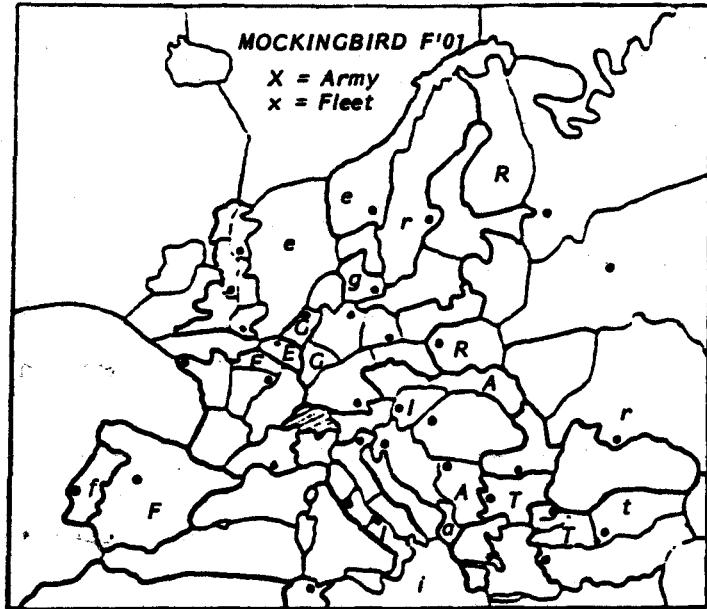

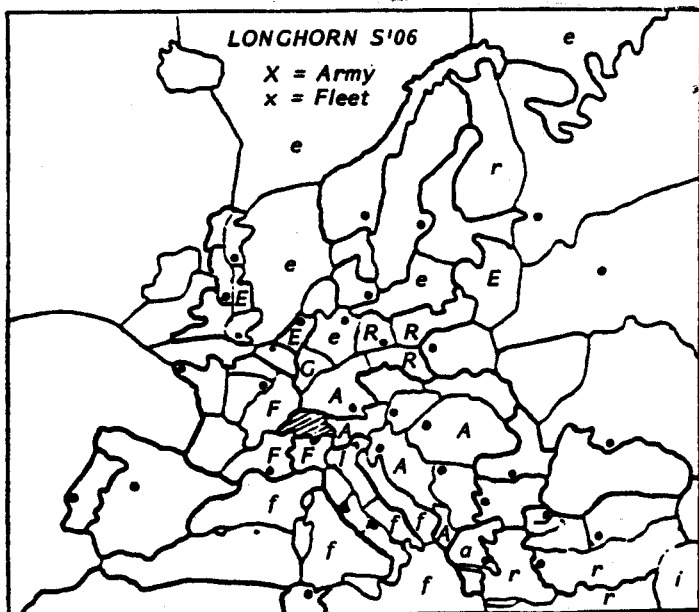
