Seminars by game designers, computer games, plus the usual dealers' exhibits round out the attractions. Admission is \$7 before May 15, \$10 at the door. I hope to go and face some of you across the Diplomacy board.

FIFTH LEEDER POLL. John Leeder, publisher of the zine RUNESTONE, has announced the 5th Annual North American Zine & Gamesmaster Poll. You are urged to vote for GMs under which you played and for zines and subzines you received during the polling period of April 1, 1980 through the present. Rate each zine, subzine, or GM from 0 (awful) to 10 (great), no fractions, please. Base your ratings on quality, however you define it, rather than on factors such as feuds, personalities, etc. Sign your ballot and indicate one way in which you participated in the hobby during the period of the poll (in order to establish eligibility). All votes will be kept confidential. Please list zines and GMs alphabetically in two lists to help the tabulation process. Defunct zines may be rated if they were active during the polling period. WHY VOTE? Unlike LSD's Hobby Mascot Poll, which poked fun at the institution of polling, the Leeder Poll has the serious purpose of comparing GM and zine quality. And it is taken very seriously, provoking controversy as to its worth and techniques. Some decry the poll as a mere popularity contest. Others see in it a valid measure of quality. However it is assessed, it will not be overlooked. Last year roughly 100 hobby members voted. I predict a substantial increase in participation this year. Despite the apples-and-oranges nature of Diplomacy zines, the poll will come up with quantitative means for comparing the diverse (motley?) offerings available to players and readers today. Since quality is such a subjective factor, it is natural that the judges in this contest are the subbers themselves. In effect, the poll asks all of us to order our preferences for the zines we receive. When combined with all other such ratings, we will find out how the hobby rates itself. In the process, the poll will provide grist for many a pubber's typewriter. I intend to vote, and naturally I hope all LSD subbers and players will take the time to grade my efforts and those of other publishers and GMs. Five minutes and 18¢ is not too much to ask, do you think?

GM ERRORS. All too common, alas, are errors of GMing and typing. You don't have to be a player in a given game to call an error to my attention. The sooner I find out about the mistake, the sooner I can notify the players concerned.

MAIL HASSLES. There is considerable debate on whether Canada or the United States has the worse mail system. Mail is so slow within Canada that postal Diplomacy games are frequently delayed. It's now rumored that except for postcards, mail will not be delivered unless in envelopes. Therefore all LSD's Canadian subscribers will receive this issue that way. If anyone did not receive LSD#7, please let me know. And can anyone confirm or deny this piece of news? (The USPS "B" stamp fiasco, which other countries do not accept as valid postage on international mail, just adds insult to injury! Fortunately we have a brand new flower-bedecked commemorative stamp for first class mail with the value printed on it, just in time to mail this issue.) As Glenn Overby remarked to me a phone conversation a couple of weeks ago, the

"Hobby Vacation" debate may be settled by a possible mail strike this summer. This would give us an enforced vacation which would scuttle current plans for an August vacation, since contract talks are scheduled for June, I believe. However, Fred Davis reported that the Reagan Administration has threatened the union with repeal of the statute which prohibits private firms from delivering 1st Class Mail. This has caused some second-thoughts, since the private carriers might do a better job than the USPS or at least offer some stiff competition. We'll see.

ZIMIAMVIA 2 & 3. New publications of the NADF, edited by its President, Rod Walker ("Alcala"; 1273 Crest Dr.; Encinitas, CA 92024 are now available, 35¢ for both issues. #2 is the Hobby Service Directory, a sort of Yellow Pages for hobby functionaries #3 is a bibliography of publications available to fill out a diplomat's reference library.

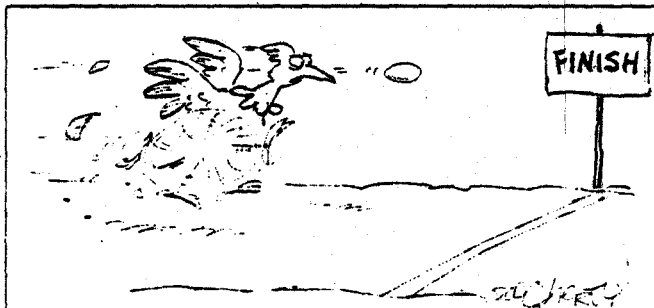

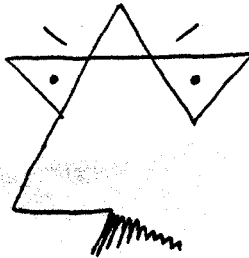

Y'ALL carries no regular games, but the irregular ones are fascinating and now there's a subzine BO, pubbed by Bernie Oaklyn. Though Texans are not true southerners, I appreciate the chance to play in Y'ALL's all-south game as well as the plug for a "southern" zine. I hope the faker doesn't confess, but instead continue to publish this chuckler!

HOBBY MASCOT. I thought the whole matter was settled last month with the announcement that Bad Dog Brux garnered the most votes in LSD's poll. Two of the leading candidates, Caruso the Cat, and Trouble Linsey (another dog), made gracious concession statements, but not everyone's happy. Mark Lew is hacked because Nobody didn't win. HOBBY QUEEN ELECTION. While we nervously await the first salvo in the Mascot War, we want to throw LSD's support to Black Jack Masters for Hobby Queen. We didn't get a good picture before press time, but hope to have something for the readers next time.

PLUGS. Issue #2 of Dave Manuel's THE CHAMBER looks even better than the first, both in terms of reproduction (crisp digest format with good use of graphics) and improvements to his house rules. See what an enthusiastic and talented 14-year-old can produce by sending a few stamps to 10318 Oakgate; Bellflower, CA 90706. Dave has free openings in Diplomacy and one Third Reich opening....I have read

warnings about alleged past misdeeds of Larry Peery, (which he denies), but his and Mike Maston's revived zine XENOGOGIC certainly bears a good look. Again in digest format--but no center staple, tsk, tsk--this weighty zine is a little word-heavy for my taste, but when the games get underway, it might liven up a bit. Billed as Vol. 14, No. 2, the premier issue contained music (classical) and book features of interest to diplomats, previews of things to come, and list of fees (\$15/game includes sub). HORNED TOAD LORE. LSD's eighth game is codenamed in honor of the Texas Horned Lizard (*Phrynosoma cornutum*). Not really a toad at all, this lizard has a spiny covering, and especially long spines on the head. They are very about 5-6 inches in length, and are reputed to squirt a thin jet of blood from a corner of the eye for a distance of several feet. The most famous horned toad, Old Rip, was placed in a metal box and sealed in the cornerstone of the courthouse at Eastland, Texas in 1896. When the box was opened in 1927, the lizard was found to be alive. Old Rip was exhibited all over the US, including the White House where he was viewed by President Coolidge. Old Rip died 11 months later, was embalmed, and placed in the Eastland County Courthouse, where he can still be seen today.

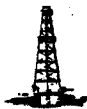

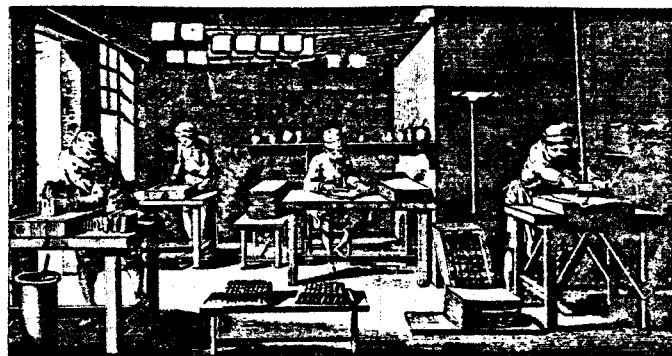

expectation of besieging Budapest.

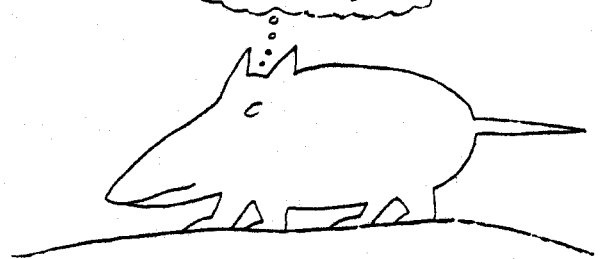
VENICE: From the command post of poet-philosopher-

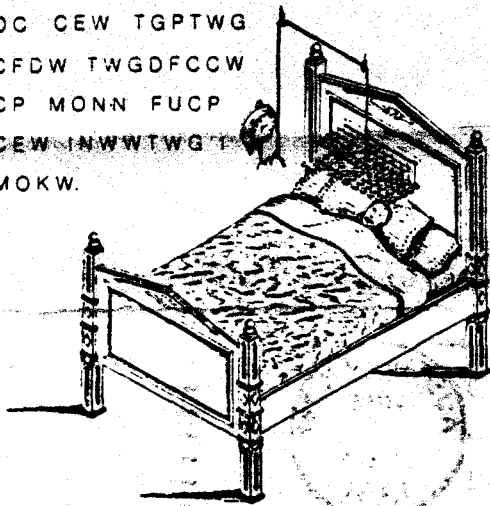

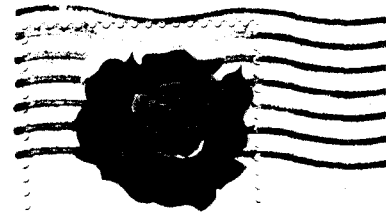
