American Diplomacy Register Developments

The American Diplomacy Register support system is conceived to have four components, registry, rating, information and entertainment. Let us briefly examine the status of each of the components.

REGISTRY - There is a start. David Hood, Cal White, and Don Del Grande have submitted 1992 tournament results to the register. Pete Gaughan and Andy Lischett have provided single game results. The outreach with ADR report forms has been through Maelstrom, through the ADR report flyers, through the D.I.P. package, and recently through a direct mailing to players appearing in the 1993 PDO census that did not appear in the 1992 census.

The Register will continue to process historic information for the balance of the year but the objective is to provide rapid turnaround support for current play.

RATINGS - The rating system that ADR is using has a long history of development. The test that established a certain credibility to the system was processing the American postal Diplomacy records in their entirety. There seemed to be general agreement that the rating array was meaningful. That exercise resulted in a very slight modification in an attempt to keep the right hand tail of the bell curve from zooming off to infinity. Fritz Juhnke, a recent Mathematics graduate, currently in Swaziland, and Eric Brosius, the number crunching king of Dipdome, have been in correspondence trying to bring their expertise to search for helpful refinements.

INFORMATION - This was envisioned to have two elements. The first to provide a list of events where tournament Diplomacy might be played, and second a list of organizers to contact for local play. The second has had very little action to date. The events list has grown through the efforts of Andy York, John Caruso and others. The last ADR, and the last Club & Tournament Diplomacy flyer for the D.I.P. had listings for more than 30 events. David Hood was quick to point out that there were several gaming events included in which Diplomacy was quite unlikely. An edit process is underway to try and trim that to Diplomacy events.

ENTERTAINMENT - This is intended to cover a broad field. The vision

is to include both the amusing and the educational. To search for material an archive was started. Although no great effort has been made to sustain an archive building activity any help would appreciated.

On a related note, Doug Beyerlein reported earlier this week that Walt Buchanan might be moving from Indiana before the end of the year. Doug says that Walt says that if he does move the 13 files cabinets of pre 1977 Hoosier Archives are NOT going with him. Doug, Walt and I and other veterans of 1960s Diplomacy would probably be willing to preserve the Hoosier treasure, but so far no one has suggested that they have the available room.

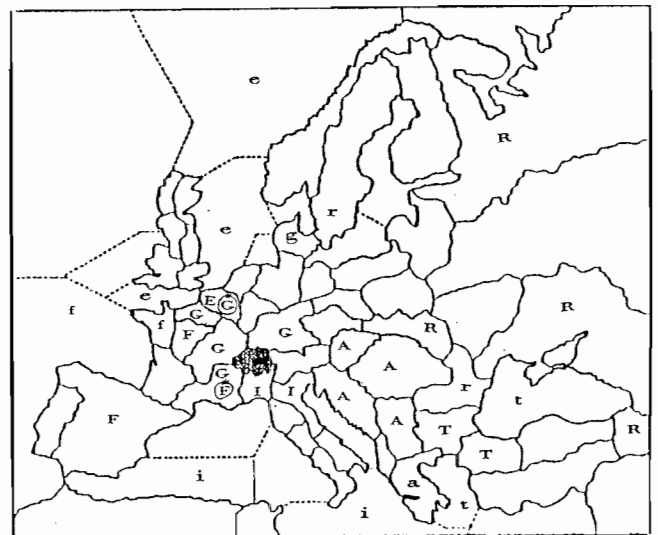

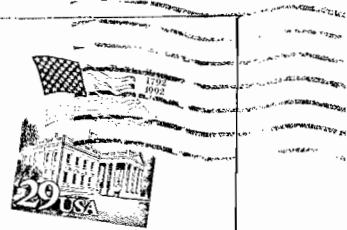
