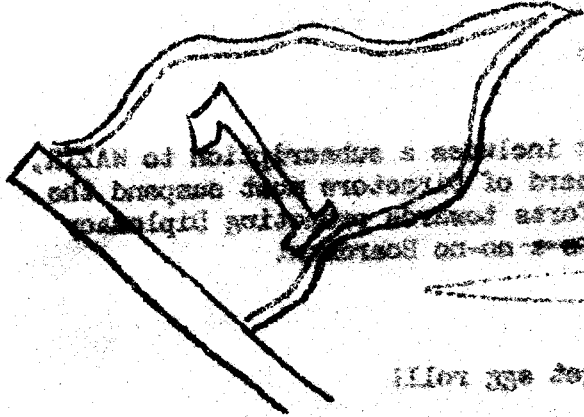


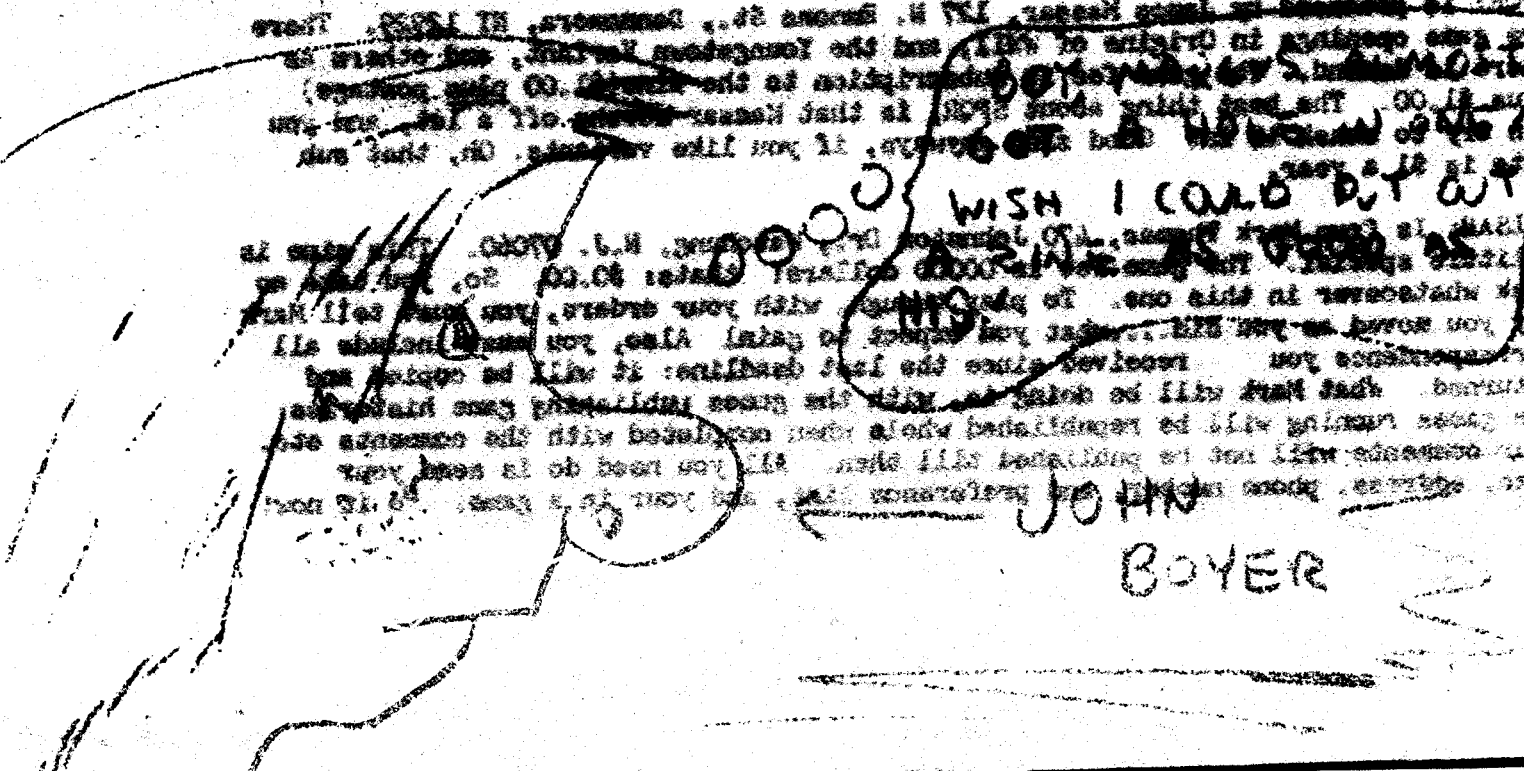

ARRAKIS: Is published by John Leader, Box 1606, Huntville, Ontario, CANADA. Featured in issue #1, are things like game openings (two- \$4.00 fee, countries by lot, One for experienced players, other for novices: state your experience, air mail service for foreigners, \$1 discount for IDA members), contests (spotting spelling mistakes, free game to those spotting 10 or more (if I held one like that, can you imagine...)) Pun-of-the-Month Club... the person who submits best pun gets some free issues, Grinding the six (he's going to let his opinions fly), and an ad for MARCUS which makes the whole sine indefatigable! Subscriptions are 100 pages for \$1.00, which is the cheapest anywhere. I recommend this one!

CARPET BAGGER: Is the result of Stephen Ball, P.O. Box 1787, Durham, NC 28016. This is one of the better new sines from south of the border (going westward border). There are six game openings: CbA: for skilled players, CbB: same as CbA, Barents and Proujansky playing. CbC: a press release game, Mascar and Trtek playing. CbD: novice game. CbE: Novice game, playing are: Chin, Walker (p.) Greenwood, Nager, Richard I, McBride, and Groce, one more needed. CbF: for anyone. All games except CbF require a game fee of \$8.00. \$4.00 of this will be refunded when the game is completed. The idea is to prevent drop outs. CbF requires a game fee of \$4.00 with no refund....\$2.00 fee for traders. Looks good. (Good articles too).

SPQR: Is produced by James Mascar, 127 N. Emmons St., Danamora, NY 12929. There are game openings in Origins of WWII, and the Youngstown Variant, and others as there is Wazir. The game fee is subscription to the sine (\$1.00 plus postage) plus \$1.00. The best thing about SPQR, is that Mascar mouths off a lot, and you can try to blat to him. Good sine anyways, if you like variants. Oh, that sub rate is \$1 a year.

PULSAR: Is from Mark Thomas, 470 Johnston Dr., Watchung, N.J. 07060. This sine is a little special. The game fee is 00000 dollars! that's: \$0.00. So, you take no risk whatsoever in this one. **GAME OPENINGS:** In VINLAND, there are two game openings (two open games) that need players. You must be a Canadian, or at least live here, and that's all. The game fee is only \$2.00 with a registration form filled out. Join now! Write me for a form; I want you!

In ATLANTICA there may be a game opening depending upon response to ATLANTICA! In order to give you a bird's eye view of the game, on pages 10 & 11 you will find the map for ATLANTICA. You can figure out the European situation easy enough. For the "new world" the platings are:

- CANADA: A's Toronto, Montreal, & P's Halifax
- USA: A's Philadelphia, Chicago, & P's Boston & New York.
- CSA: A's Richmond, P's Nashville, Charleston.

Also, England gets 3 Fleets (have one army), Italy two, Berlin is another fleet for Germany, and France gets Marcellus as a fleet. Variations in rules:

Convoys: over single spaces are as in Diplomacy. Over more than one, it is necessary for an army to board a fleet, creating an A/F; with a one unit force, which may exist up to five turns....if the army has not been destroyed by then, it is annihilated, the fleet remaining. In disembarking, the army part of A/F may move, and the fleet support that moves last.

Frozen areas: In the winter, several areas at the top of the board are impassable to fleet action, and fleets caught in a frozen zone must hold there. The frozen period exists from January to April.

Date: The year is 1870 (initial year). Instead of seasons, play continues by months. ie. Spring 1901 would correspond to January 1870. Fall 1901 would correspond to February 1870. Winter 1901 would correspond to March 1870. In March builds occur, as removals.

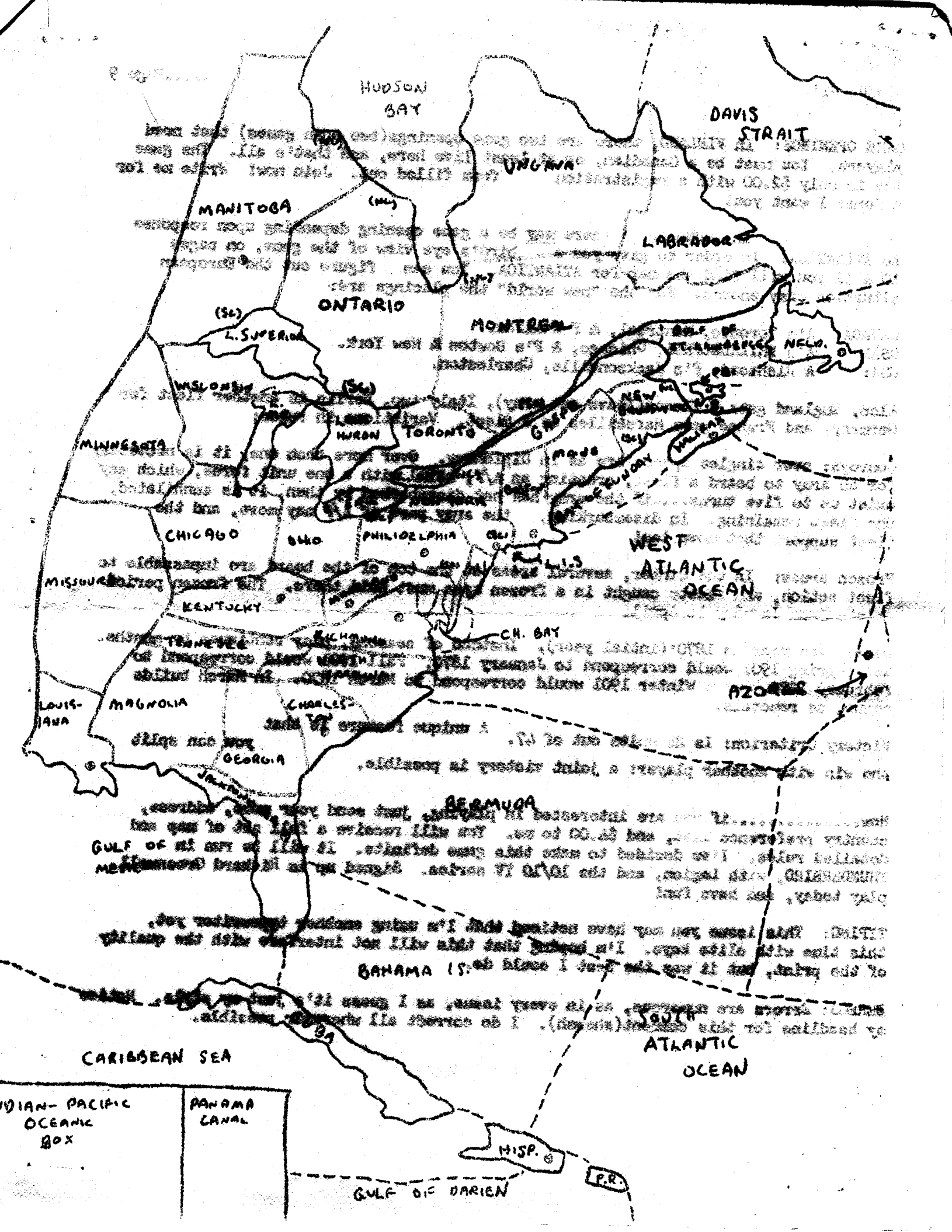
**Victory Criterion:** Is 24 units out of 47. A unique feature is that you can split the win with another player: a joint victory is possible.
