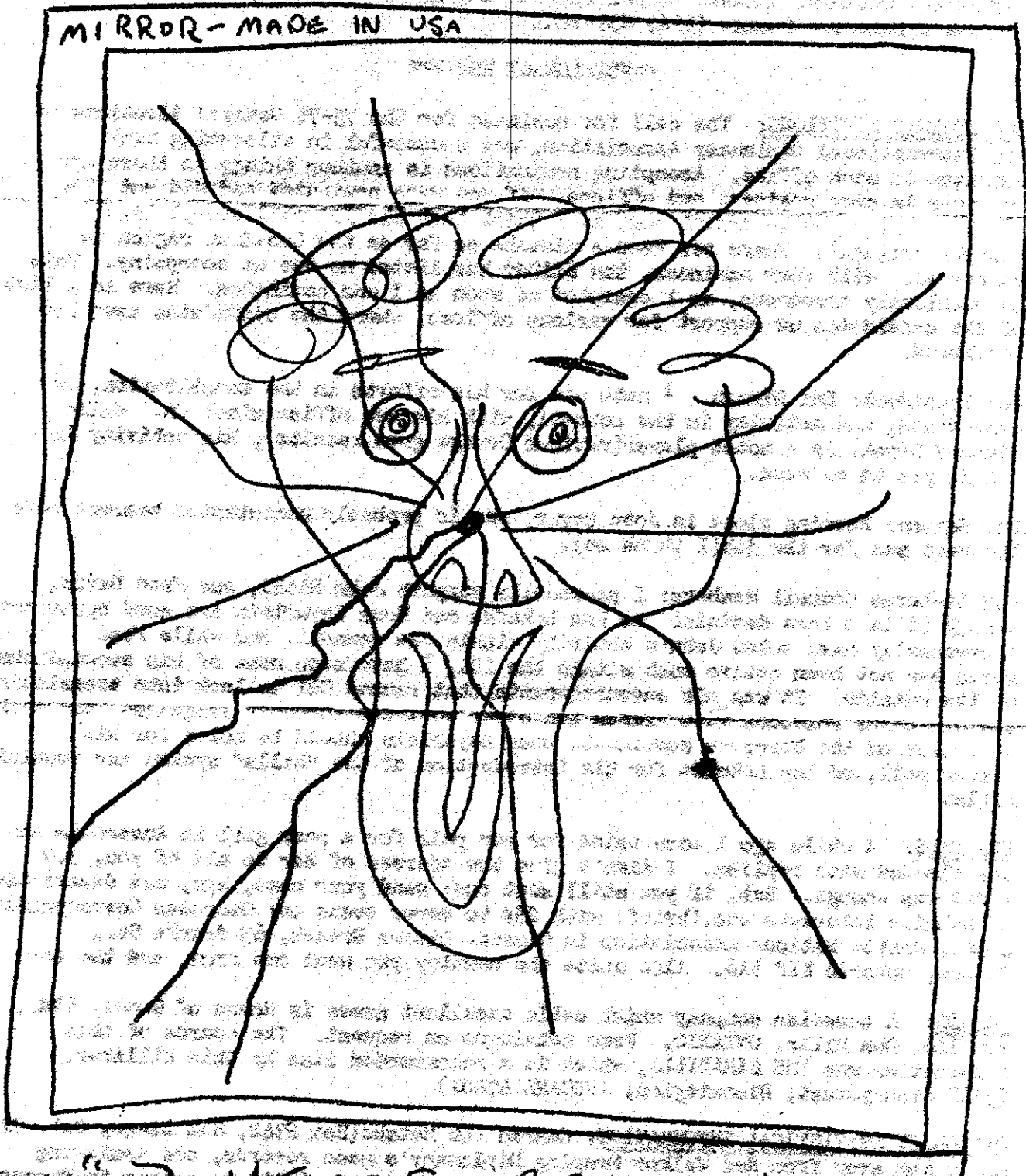

*****DIPLOMACY NEWS*****

IDA GENERAL ELECTIONS: The call for nominees for the 73-74 General Elections of the International Diplomacy Association, was successful in allocating many nominees to each office. Accepting nominations is another thing as there are openings in some regions, and offices. If you were nominated and did not accept, I urge you to accept now, as I think that the IDA will accept late acceptances(ugh). There has been a mistake as far as the Canadian region is concerned. With four nominees, the Editor has listed no one as accepting. This is completely erroneous, as I accepted as soon as I was nominated. Here is a list of the candidates we support for various offices, where the candidates have been confirmed:

For President: Edi Birsan. I note him for his efforts in the constitution, as ombudsman, and activity in the council, with his own office zine: OM. While Richard Brooks is a noted player(reviews Grudge game results), his activity in IDA is yet to be seen.

For Editor: Running alone is John Boyer, who is probably uncontested because he's the best man for the job(I think so).

For At-Large Council Members: I personally support John Biehl, and Fred Davis, though it is a hard decision as Len Lakofka and Doug Beyerlein are good opponents. I personally have noted John's activity within the council, and while Fred Davis has not been active much within the IDA, I have seen some of his accomplishments on the outside. It was his encouragements that caused GRI to look into translating the Diplomacy rulebook into French and other dominate European languages, and seek an outlet of the European continent. Doug Beyerlein should be noted for his player poll, and Len Lakofka for his introduction of the "bills" system and resulting bills.

DIPLOMACY STATISTICAL INFORMATION: Conrad von Metake(Box 8342, San Diego, Cal. 92102) has taken over from Rod Walker keeping Diplomacy's game records, and assigning Boardman numbers. Records of all games, and new games starting, appear in Humor's

replacement, EVERYTHING* (you always wanted to know about Diplomacy, but knew better than to ask), and is published by Conrad. Publisher's are encouraged to support Conrad in his efforts, by co-operating by sending him game records, and going to him for game number assignments. EVERYTHING is available to everybody for \$2.20 per year (11 issues).

ART WORK: MARCUS has now taken up the regular feature of having a cover page for each issue, as has been the case since MARCUS #10-VINEARD #5. I have been the astounding artist to this point, but if you have any ideas for a MARCUS cover page, submit it, and I will use it. You will get full credit for all donations. CANADIAN POSTAL CODES: Americans have continuously asked what the hell our postal code mean't. So here it is: 1) The first character, is a letter. This letter designates a region in Canada... K being Eastern Ontario, P being Southern Alberta, etc. 2) The second character, a number, narrows the first region down smaller, to a city for example. 3) Thirdly, another letter, designates a specific section of that city. 4) There more characters, number, letter, then another number, narrows that section down to one side of a street between two intersections. The code can also represent: an office building with 10 or more companies, or a company that receives large volumes of mail, or an apartment building with over 50 units, or, in less densely populated regions, a code will represent the whole town.

Postal codes should be received by all towns in Metropolitan Toronto by December 13, 1972... other Southern Ontario regions following. Postal codes have already been assigned in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Eastern Ontario.

ZINES:

TANGALO ZINES is a gay zine published by Richard L. Hall (4920 Glynne, Apt. #2, Oxnard, Calif. 91320). This is no ordinary low zine, for, it is typed up each issue by a sub, named of course, Tangalo. When I say sub, I am not using hip language, I mean the four legged kind (though some hipsters are four legged). Tangalo takes the same stand as Carol Buchanan takes to Hoosier Archives, and rightly adds his own comments to the text of the zine. Game openings are irregular (game starting every 3 months, but some extras thrown in). Game for anyone is just a ten dollar game deposit, and a subscription for as long as you play. Subscription rate is 10/\$1.00 1st class, 7/\$1.00 1st class, 6/\$1.00 air mail. Looks like a good zine.

CARPET BAGGERS published by Steve Bell, P.O. Box 1787, Burlington, NC 28016 USA. Carpet Baggers will soon be expanding to minimum of 12 pages, averaging to 16 pages claims the editor. With this, subscription rates have been jacked... or HI-jacked.....so they are now 10 for \$2.25. That's only the highest subscription rate for any zine ever published....I'll tell you as developments come in the future's worth it.

Winter 1904 builds are due December 29, 1972. I suggest you get builds in early to avoid Christmas rush. Also, if all players submit Spring 1905 orders, since there are only 3 adjustments, I will print these also. When submitting orders for Spring 1905 under these conditions, they may be conditional upon the builds, or removals.

BERLIN(Nov. 25): Dear France, (wherever you may be). Gee, I'm sorry if I am not a Diplomacy player, and that I apparently deceived you at your home. I must disagree, however about the fate of England. Blair is much more likely to finish this game if he sticks with Germany, and damn it, I am going to help him in every way possible. Maybe it is a move late, but none the less my fleet in Denmark will eventually get him back London, and the ensuing build will get him back Liverpool. You will have to do some pretty fair tactics to prevent that.

WARSAW: In their annual report, directors of "Sugar Press Tactics Inc." revealed that four of their five departments have had extensive employment recently. The Dept. of Good Natured Needling had produced extensive employment recently, employed by the Russian gov't, while the Dept. of Blatantly Hostile Diatribes had been heavily used in many other foreign European capitals. The Dept. of Wit an Honour had been kept busy in Rome and Moscow, while the Boring Unsubtle Trash Dept. reported many assignments throughout Europe.

The directors voted to close the Department of Quality Literature, because of the lack of demand for it. ((The Russian Warsaw branch will be first to go))

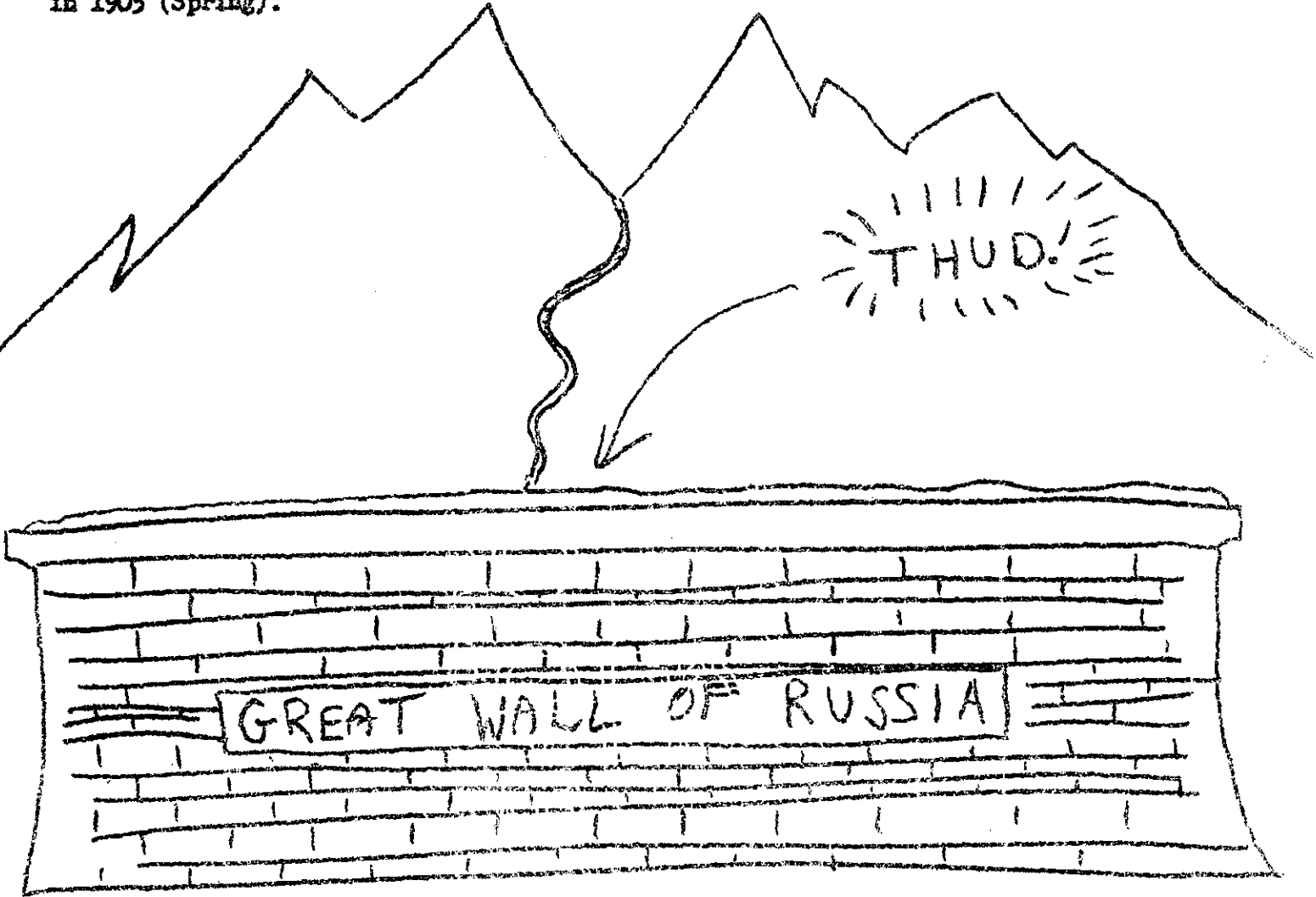

MOSCOW: The Russian gov't today declared war on Germany, following the movement of German armies into Prussia and Sillesia, and the German refusal to follow the warning issued by the Russian gov't. The czar also mentioned that because of the breakdown of private negotiation with Germany, there are no hopes for an early settlement.

ST. PETERSBURG: The Russian High Command today announced that cleaning up operations will commence to get the last Turk out of Turkey.

WARSAW: The Russian Northern High Command today announced through it's offices here that all of Russia's forces in the north will concentrate on German troops moving to their border areas. This follows English withdrawal from this section of the war. It is hoped that they stay out!

SPECIAL FROM HUMANIA: Russian soldiers have reported increased Austrian deaths from Rack-in-the-mouth disease following an outbreak in Budapest. It was also learned the Red Russians are using some of BAK to keep the disease out of Rumania.
