CENTRAL POWERS SLEEP AS PERIPHERAL NATIONS CLOSE IN!

ENGLISH ENTER POETRY CONTEST: EVOKE EUROPEAN PROTESTS!

Marsovia (MPC Aug. 2, 1905) A mysterious attack of sleeping sickness struck ventral Europe resulting in a laxk of movement by the forces of Germany, Italy, Austria, and Russia. The highly slective virus did not attack England, France, or Turkey, all of whom scored notable gains. As a result the par value of stocks rose in Marsovia for English issues while the markey for German and Italian bonds was quoted as no bid 1/8 asked.

London: Henry J. Krajewski today read before a packed House of Commons the following versified account of and answer to Dame Garrigus latest tomfollery :

Ships and arms may break my bones,
but names can never hurt me.
My crack dragoons will make you groan
far more than ypur insults three.

Krajewski declined to enter this verse in the European Poetry Contest preferring, he said, "to submit something inspired by a less nauseating subject. Dame Garrigus only inspiration to me is to make me want..... to" At this point Krajewski bolted offstage with his hand firmly clasped on his mouth. Loud applause then exploded, though for what was not made clear.

Puddleby: Dame Garrigus refused to comment on the Prime Minsiter"s latest news conference.

The English entry is the only ne thus far in the poetry contest. The contest willbe extended to the Spring 1906 issue to allow more entries.
