I have received late word that the mail service in Canada has resumed, the differences between labor and management resolved. It is because of the disruption of Canadian-American mail that this issue of The Master Machia-vellian is but six pages in length; three of our diplomatic contests include Canadian princes, and the fourth has been similarly halted because of confusion over the effects of the Canadian postal delay upon this publication. Thus, neither game moves nor press is to be found within, but I have directed the unit placement for each contest to be printed. With the resumption of the four contests coupled with their accompanying press, issue number sixteen of The Master Machiavellian will revert to the normal size.

As for game openings, there remain two positions left to be filled in The Master Machiavellian's last Diplomacy game to be commenced until another terminates. All princes who have inscribed their names to the list of contestants for the Colonia II game will be pleased to note the commencement of that contest, with country castings and unit placement contained within.

The increase in postal rates domestically has finally forced a corresponding increase in the subscription rates for The Master Machiavellian, now ten issues for two dollars thirty cents. The reader will please note that we do not accept double-subscriptions; all moneys we have received in excess are being refunded. In addition, I ask the reader to please remember that due to full educational schedules, the Staff of The Master Machiavellian can reply to letters only onlyweekends; if the Staff takes mome time to respond, please bear this in mind.

As this is the final publication of The Master Machiavellian to be printed with the date "1975", the Staff and I join in expressing our heartfelt wishes

that everyone have a most enjoyable holiday season.

Remember always to seem as though you hold the good qualities of honor and constancy, for the world applauds the prince who demonstrates these, but do not let this keep you from betraying your honor when it is expeditious, for often the world in reality rewards what it most loudly condemns. #### THE MAIL SITUATION

As you all know, and are probably sick of hearing repeated, the Postal Service is raising First Class mail 3¢, which isn't so bad except when one buys stamps in bulk, like us! This raise is upping our rates 30¢, but we can't help it. There is no longer airmail inside the U.S., but the guy at the Post Office says airmail is still on outside the U.S., so Canadian resubbers can tack on the extra - what is it, 20¢? - and take a chance. I return all funds in excess of correct amount. Of course, the P.O. keeps returning my mail to Canada, and all the Canadian issue number 14s are still sitting on my desk with an "Embargo still in effect", "Return to sender", "Service temporarily suspended", etc. This has done wonders for our games (see below). In fact, I don't know when our subbers in Canada will get these issues.

No? Didn't think so. Now on to unit placement.



Question: "If the quality of mercy is not strained, how is it kept from getting lumpy?"

"A prince should have no other aim or thought, nor take up any other thing for his study, but war and its organization and discipline, for that is the only art that is necessary to one who commands, and it is of such virtue that it not only maintains those who are born princes, but often enables men of private fortune to attain to that rank. And one sees, on the other hand, that when princes think more of luxury than of arms, they lose their state. The chief cause of the loss of states, is the contempt of this art, and the way to acquire them is to be well versed in the same.

"Francesco Sforza, through being well armed, became from private status, Duke of Milan; his sons, through wishing to avoid the Tatigue and hardships of war, from dukes became private persons. For among the revils caused by being disarmed, it renders you contemptible; which is one of those disgraceful things which a prince must guard against. As there is no comparison whatever between an armed and a disarmed man, it is not reasonable to suppose that one who is armed will willingly obey one who is unarmed; or that any unarmed man will remain safe among armed servants. For one being disdainful and the other suspicious, it is not possible for them to act well together. And therefore a prince who is ignorant of military matters, besides the other misfortunes already mentioned, cannot be estable by his coldiers nor have confidence in them. ""
