DIPLOMACY IN ACTION

ONE: The Inter-War Period 1925-1939
 by Michael George Homer

Part One - Rhineland to Anschluss (Continued)

In an attempt to thwart Hitler's plans without the support of Italy or France, Schuschnigg held a plebiscite to determine Austria's future. The German dictator's response to this move was immediate and devastating. The Austrian chancellor was immediately presented with a German ultimatum threatening instant invasion if Schuschnigg's plebiscite was not called off and if he did not resign in favor of the Austrian Nazi leader Dr. Arthur Seyss-Inquart. The stage was set for the Anschluss, step two after the Rhineland in Hitler's plan for reunifying the German-speaking peoples.

On 11 March 1938 Schuschnigg resigned and was replaced as chancellor by Seyss-Inquart, who on the following day sent a prearranged telegram to Hitler asking that the German Army intervene in Austria "to establish peace and order

((article cont.))...and to prevent bloodshed." On 13 March, as the German army advanced into Austria, Seyss-Inquart declared officially the Anschluss, and Austria became the "Ostmark" of the "Greater German Reich", or "Grossdeutsches Reich".

Since his accession to power in 1933, Hitler, in his move to remake Germany as the dominant European power, defied the military restrictions imposed on Germany by the 1919 Versailles Treaty only two years after his succession, defied the military strength of the Allies and reoccupied part of Germany taken from her after World War I in 1936, and in the 1938 Anschluss seized Austria in defiance of her separation from Germany, also as a result of the Versailles Treaty. The German Führer's sun was on the ascendancy, and his next victim had already been selected: Czechoslovakia, now surrounded by German territory on all three sides.

New Year's Day 1939 dawned with the hope that peace would be maintained throughout Europe and the world. The 6 December 1938 meeting of French foreign minister Georges Bonnet and German foreign minister Joachim von Ribbentrop in Paris had resulted in a signed declaration promising an end to the traditional hostility between the two countries in the spirit of the Munich Agreement of September 1938.

The Munich Agreement came as the result of the Sudetenland Crisis of May - September. Hitler's first step in the liquidation of Czechoslovakia, his claims on the Sudetenland (the frontier region of Bohemia), was to detach this region from Czechoslovakia, an area containing many of Czechoslovakia's natural resources, industry, main lines of defense, and 2.8 million ethnic Germans. The Sudeten Germans had no grounds to complain of their treatment by the Prague Government after having been given many privileges, including social amenities often greater than those in other parts of Czechoslovakia. But Nazi propaganda pictured the Sudeten Germans as a persecuted minority with Germany as their sole protector, and encouraged the seditious activities of the "Sudendeutsche Partei" under Konrad Henlein which demanded unification with Germany.

In May 1938 Hitler ordered German army divisions to annex the Sudetenland, but France, Britain, and the Soviet Union all announced that a German invasion of Czechoslovakia would result in an immediate military response, and the Führer backed down. Henlein's Nazis engineered repeated incidents throughout the summer which served as Hitler's tool to demand that the plight of the Sudeten Germans be settled as soon as possible, winding up the 1938 Nuremberg Party Rally on 12 September with the insistence that the Sudeten Germans be allowed self-determination. The subsequent Sudeten Nazi revolt was ruthlessly crushed by the Prague Government under President Benes.

Britain's Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain expressed his desire to discuss a peaceful settlement with Hitler, and met with the German at Berchtesgaden on 15 September; a meeting which resulted in the British informing Benes that if Prague went to war with Germany over the Sudetenland Britain, joined by France, would not support him. The second meeting between Chamberlain and Hitler, at Bad Godesberg on the 22nd, witnessed Chamberlain's telling Hitler that his claim on the Sudetenland would be met, but now Hitler replied that was no longer enough, and that German troops must intervene at once, a demand Chamberlain refused to consider. The Czech Army mobilized on 23 September, and with London and Paris standing firm against Hitler's latest demands, war was imminent. But at the last moment Chamberlain once again came through for the Nazis, suggesting an immediate conference with Italy as mediator.

On 29 September 1938, Hitler, Mussolini, Chamberlain, and French Prime Minister Edouard Daladier met at Munich; Czechoslovakia and the Soviet Union were not even consulted. Britain and France backed down entirely from their belligerent position, and agreed that the German Army could start occupying the Sudetenland from 1 October in return for Hitler's assurance that this was his "last territorial demand."

Czechoslovakia had been betrayed for an empty promise that Britain and France

((article cont.)) naively believed world being... As Czech Minister in London Jan Masaryk stated to Chamberlain prior to the Englishman's departure for Munich, "If you have sacrificed my nation to preserve the peace of the world, I will be the first to applaud you. But if not, gentlemen, God help your souls!"

Thus, it was the British government which had encouraged the December 1938 Franco-German Declaration in the tense atmosphere after Munich. France and Germany declared their conviction that "peaceful and neighborly relations between France and Germany form one of the essential elements in the consolidation of the European situation, as well as in the general maintenance of peace." In Article 2, the Germans relinquished their claim to Alsace-Lorraine. But the hopes that Hitler had abandoned his policy of armed coups and unilateral expansion was soon proved futile...
