Ankara Herald Advocate, 33 ((that's what it said!)) 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DAS DEUTSCHES AFRIKA KORPS
(continuation)

The low supply priority to the North African theater assigned by the German High Command forced Rommel to come up with improvised AFVs of his own design. Guns were mounted on German and Italian trucks sporting plate armor cut from the hulls of sunken ships. 50mm cannon were taken from the smashed wreckages of Panzer IIIs and remounted into other panzers extending the life of the obsolete Panzer III chassis; even captured British Artilleries and Crusaders were pressed into service, their new crews operating them for as long as their tanks could run -- which, unfortunately for the Afrika Korps, was not long.
