Underlined moves do not succeed. The Russian F Bal is dislodged and may retreat to Bot, Lvn, Pru, or the box. I think in 17 years that is the first time I have seen a F Bal dislodged. Hmmm. Also, the Italian A Tri is dislodged and blown away. The 1905 supply center chart:

ITALY: home, tun, (tri)	(4) REMOVE ONE*
RUSSIA: (stp), war, mos, sev, rum, bud, ber, vie	(7) REMOVE ONE**
TURKEY: home, bul, ser, gre, <u>tri</u>	(7) BUILD ONE

However, that's like saying that, among Alfred Hitchcock's films, *Family Plot* isn't as good as *Rear Window* or *Vertigo* -- but it's still a darn fine movie. Bruce Dern is brilliant, William Devane silkily evil and Karen Blac suavely sinister. Oh, yes, music. "Give It Up" is as good a single as PE's done since "Don't Believe the Hype", and the rest is listenable or better. There's some filler, and not every one will like all the lyrics (they compare Columbus to Hitler in "Hitler Day") but this complex, dense, driven sound collage is still like nothing else in music.)
