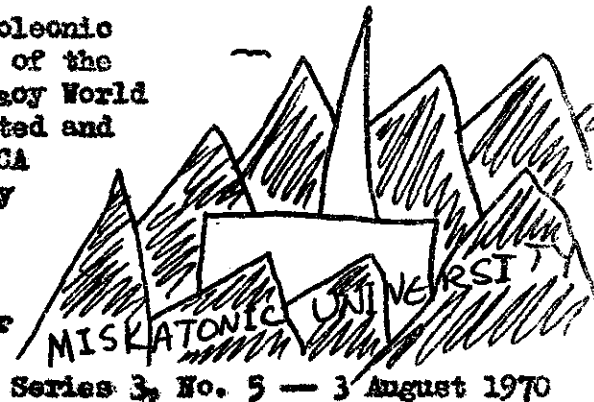

Fall 1813:

AUSTRIA (Bailey?): NHR. A Vie, A Gal, A Bud, F Ven, A Tyr, A Gas /h/. Owns: Bud, Vie, Ven, Mun, Ber, Par, Kis (?). No room for 1.

ENGLAND (Childers?): NHR. A Bre, A Bur, A Bel, F NAF, F Mid, F Iri, F Eng /h/; F Wes /h/ /a/. Owns: Edi, Lpl, Lon, Ewy, Den, Bel, Hol, Bre (8). Build 1 (1/a/).

RUSSIA (Turner): NHR. F Bot, F StP(sc) /h/. Owns: StP, Sve (2). No change.

TURKEY (Keathley): F Ank-Con, A Con-Bul, A Smy-Gre C by F Aeg, A Sev-Ukr, F Spa (so)-Wes S by F Lyo, A Mar-Spa S by F Por, F Gre-Alb, A Rum-Ser S by A Tri, A War-Gal, A Mos-StP. Owns: Ank, Con, Smy, Bul, Gre, Sev, Mos, Tun, Spa, Nap, Rom, Rum, Val, War, Por, Tri, Mar, Ser (17). Build 2 (1/a/, 1 not built in 1812). add: F Ion-Tun.

WINTER 1813 ADJUSTMENTS and SPRING 1814 MOVES are due on Wednesday, 26 August 1970.

If I do not receive at least three sets of moves, I will remove the defaulting players and declare Turkey the winner of this game. I am not going to continue running a game which nobody wants. I realize, god knows, that this thing has dragged on and on, primarily through GMs not caring.
