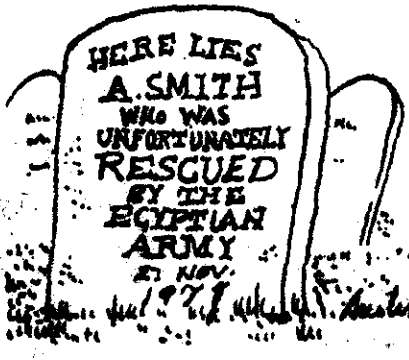

In issue eighteen of his excellent *Electra Glide Blue*, the estimable Cal White (whom I remember most fondly for trying to pass a bum check on me) did a listing and review of the North American Diplomacy zines he receives (which, since he is the Boardman Numbers Custodian, is an extensive list; I don't think the five-page listing was

complete.

Now, most of his listings are fairly good, although I object to receiving only a 4+ for regularity on a 5-point scale, since I have never published after my promised date. What upsets me most, however, are some of his comments, in particular his comments on Alan Rowland's *The War-monger*, about which he says "Alan strikes me as a rather immature person who tries to impress people by talking tough in his zine. All he talks about is how he drinks beer and swears."

Ignoring the incorrect phrasing and mediocre syntax of the second sentence, I find myself largely in agreement with Cal, with one exception: that the image of Alan is one which he wishes to project. Alan goes to Lafayette College (from which I graduated; this is one of the reasons why I trade for his zine). I went to Lafayette and can tell Cal with authority that someone who spends all of his time at frat parties at Lafayette not only finds himself attending parties without food, drink or companionship, but will not last past his second year at Lafayette (contrary to some opinions, there exist certain minimum standards at that college, despite what Lehigh University people will tell you).

Cal has shown this blind spot before. He came to DipCon last summer, prepared and expecting to despise me. However, my winning ways (I organized the various watergun strikes on Len Lakofka) brought him over to my side and he is convinced (or seems convinced) that the personality I display in this zine (when, according to Mike Rocamora, I display any anymore) is not mine, and that I am a pretty nice, dependable guy (one of the reasons I attend so few conventions: I have my reputation to uphold, after all).

The history of the fake personality (called the *persona* by us ex-English majors and Dean Swift fans) in fandom is of long-standing, and, to quiet the yowls of those who keep informing me that Diplomacy is not sf fandom, is also long-used in Diplomacy. People who know John Boardman from his political essays would not recognize the professorial gentleman who gave the hilarious lecture on how he created the hobby at 1976's DipCon. Those who have seen Buchanan's *Hoosier Archives* and *Diplomacy World* would refuse to believe the drunkard mixing vodka and Seven-Up and killing Howard Mahler's characters in every D&D game the two played in. And who would have thought that was Rod Walker and myself playing bridge at DipCon last summer?

We are not what we write; our writing may reveal portions of personalities or, in the hands of a skillful and consistent writer, may reveal false images. We are more than our words however; and the image Alan creates in his zine is one that brings a smile to my lips, if only a smile of contempt. His paper character amuses me, and that is all I wish from any writer.

Cal White's words, however, will be heard, and the consequences must be considered. What will be the results of his recommendation? Why, Alan Rowland will find fewer people reading his zine; fewer people will play in his game; he will get less egoboo from publishing and, as a result, will stop trying to write about the True Frat Man he has created. Another zine that tries to be more than a listing of moves of a game and dull articles on how to win more easily. Does Cal want a hobby in which the only

subject considered fit to discuss is the moronic subject of whether one should try to get a lot of supply centers as soon as one can or run with the pack until one is ready to rush for the victory? Should Larry Peery's execrable *Strategy & Tactics of Diplomacy* sit on our shelves as an Important Book? Shall we honor Brenton Ver Ploeg more for his victories or the delightful ditto zine he produced? Is John Konig remembered for his excellent game record or for his writings.


I have been crying doom for years and people have, by and large, ignored me. Already the walls about the ghetto are going up. Boardman writes almost nothing for *Graustark* these days, his good writing going to other fields. *The Slobinpolit Zhurnal* forms a small community of perhaps thirty players who write over a thousand pages a year for it. Ben Grossman has proclaimed the death of the New York Conspiracy; and, although Greg Costikyan may dispute it in *Urf Dwarfal*, its fire consists of a few dying sparks. Ulanov and Svith are gone; Rosenberg and Diller are gone; Grossman is going; All I can do these days is rant about the vast wasteland we have become, trying to outHerod Herod.

The Conspiracy is dead, and its once-green fields have become a wasteland in which Bob Sacks bickers with everyone in sight and tries to revive a corpse by fiat.

A few people try their best. John Michalski produces *The Brutus Bulletin*, showing a man who is such a right-wing nut that I wouldn't sit down at a table with him; Mark Berch offsets *Diplomacy Digest*. But these are largely reprint zines, John's from non-hobby sources and Mark's displaying the embalmed remains of what once was.

Shit. What I wouldn't do for a nice, lively feud now.

FOR PERSONS INTERESTED IN VARIANTS

29 April 1978

The history of organizational support for variants in the Diplomacy hobby has not been impressive. Groups organized for wargaming in general or regular diplomacy were never enthusiastic about supporting projects in the variant hobby and have consistently failed to understand the special needs of variant hobbyists. At one time the IDA and DVC worked out a compromise plan of action in variants designed to remedy this, but the IDA was amended out of existence before the plan could be considered and two Presidents of the IDA/NA have refused to place the plan or keys parts of it before the IDA/NA Council. It therefore seems necessary to form a group oriented towards variant diplomacy able to support projects and services in the variant hobby through its own efforts. Two past efforts to organize the variant hobby (DVC and WVA) both did not succeed to the degree intended. The Diplomacy Variant Commission was intended to be a hobby-wide group of variant officers and co-opted members acting under parliamentary rules and without costs except for the cost of deliberations - it failed because it failed to develop a financial base and because certain factions preferring extra-constitutional and media propaganda campaigns withdrew, leaving only a skeleton organization behind. The World Variant Association was intended to be a mass membership group acting in a democratic manner without rules or independent officers, but with annual membership dues to support projects and deliberations - it failed because it failed to develop either a financial or an organizational base and because factions and officers associated with DVC refused to cooperate and publicly attacked the new group. As time passes tempers have cooled and there now seems to be agreement to start over again. The WVA has collapsed for the second or third time and the DVC does not seem to be an appropriate instrument for all persons interested in variant organization. Therefore, in its last series of votes before it adjourned for the year, the Diplomacy Variant Commission amended its rules to provide for a new group, the International Variant Association.

The International Variant Association is to have full control over its own votes, finances, projects, and publications. Except for the annual election (conducted in December by the Secretary) the President conducts business by general agreement or with the concurrence of a majority of those voting. The Association elects a President, Treasurer, and Editor, with DVC providing a Secretary, Director, and Ombudsman, and acting officers when vacancies occur. The Association is represented on DVC by its three officers, other officers jointly established, and a number of representatives in proportion to its membership but at least 4 from distinct geographic regions (initially established as the United States, Canada, Continental Europe, and the British Isles and other Commonwealth). Annual membership dues may be set at any amount but at least one dollar (and have been initially set at three dollars).

That is the totality of the rules governing IVA (unless it chooses to write some of its own). Robert Sacks (4861 Broadway 5-V, NY NY 10034, USA) is serving as Secretary, Director, acting President, and acting Treasurer until the first election. Send \$3 annual membership dues to him to cover the first year starting with the publication of the IVA's regular publication - time prior to then is free. Volunteers for Ombudsman and acting Editor should also apply to him.

The awards are for Best Article of 1977, best new zine of 1977, best overall zine of 1977, best variant for 1977, Most Outstanding Contribution for 1977, Most Valuable Person (Player? it is MVP in the award ballot I have), the rookie and the most deserving of being expelled from the hobby in 1977.

This last one is a bit odd. Assuming that someone is adjudged as being most qualified for the last position (how's about voting for Mr. Cook?), what do we do about it? Refuse to trade? Arbitrarily remove him from his games? Have Charlie Reinsel purn him? Comments will be appreciated.

12: BREW & REEFER: It is almost impossible to tell about a zine in its third issue, but, as far as can be told, a good-looking new zine is Roy Swith's of the above name.
