((From Bruce Linsey, publisher of VOICE OF DOOM))

Dear Mister Minister:

I read with interest your comments on the "Black Hole Affair" last issue. Since you invited me to reply, why not? I won't bore your readers by rehashing the circumstances involved over and over again, but will discuss in more general terms the topics involved: houserules in general, and deception of the GM.

Before I do that, though, I had better clear up some misunderstandings. First of all, you erred in stating that Mark Berch has labeled John Caruso "unprincipled." Mark never said that, and in fact he corrected me on it. Further, I was very wrong in doing so. By the time you print this, I will have publicly apologized for and retracted the statement, and I've asked Konrad Baumstister to do the same. In fact, as this is being written, there are no hard feelings whatsoever between Kathy Byrne and John Caruso, and me. Tempers flared for a couple of weeks, but Kathy and John are my friends, and we have made peace. In fact, both of them have since decided to standby in VOICE OF DOOM, and I'm happy to have them on my standby list. The situation has been happily resolved.

Now, let's look at houserules in general. What are they? (This could actually be the start of a good article, but . . .) Well, if you look in the rulebook, you will find many situations that just are not adequately covered for postal play. The most outstanding example of this is the 15 minute deadlines, which clearly needs modification when the game is played by mail, unless, of course, John Michalski is GMing the game. But there are scores of modifications that must be made to the rulebook, especially when you consider standbys, ambiguous abbreviations, separations of seasons, etc. Houserules, then, are merely an adoption of the rulebook which enables the game to be played postally.

Now, you may say that situations found in postal DIP can be dealt with when they arise, but I would not agree. I feel that the players have the right to know just how their game will be run when they enter it. If a VOD player wants to see just how I will handle a given situation, most of the time he can just thumb through the houserules and find out. It is true that houserules are tedious, but nobody has to read them. They are there for the players' reference, and I myself have referred to them in GMing my games if I wanted to know exactly how I said I would rule in a particular set of circumstances. I personally would not want to play in a game if the rules were not set forth beforehand, nor would I care to GM a game that way. It is for that reason that I believe in using a good, complete set of houserules.

Having defended my usage of such of a comprehensive collection of rules, let me now address the next question: How strictly should I enforce them? Well, Ron, they are the rules of play. I certainly didn't put them there for my readers' amusement! To digress for a minute, do you remember when I criticized you for accepting orders after the deadline? I don't know how clear I made it then, but my objection was not that you were doing it, but that you were doing it despite your houserule that told us, "deadlines will be strictly enforced"! Now, in this instance I had little quarrel with the way you were running the game, but I did object to the fact that your houserules claimed you would be running it differently than you actually were! Anyway, the point is that rules are there to be played by, or they wouldn't

be there at all. If a GM wants to strictly enforce a deadline, he should make a rule that says so; and if he does not, he should not make such a rule. Similarly, if a GM wants to ban deception of himself by the players, he should so state; otherwise, he should not so state.

Which, at last, brings me to my first final point. Did I "overreact" in removing a player who lied to me? Well, I put that rule in there for a reason. I didn't write it just so it would take up space in the zine! I wrote it because I felt it should be obeyed. (Otherwise, why have it there at all?) And although I was disappointed to have to enforce it, the situation came up and there it was in black and white.

Now, when a player signs up in VOICE OF DOOM, I do my best to ensure that he is given a well-run game. Although at times I may make a mistake like any other GM, I consider well-run to include all of the following:

- 1) The adjudications are accurate.
- 2) The game reports are sent out promptly.
- 3) The game is run according to the rules in force.

On points 1 & 2, my record is reasonable good.

On the third point, it is also good, and I can make that claim because I enforced a rule when a player directly and overtly violated it.

Now, I am aware of the opinions of several of the current and former BLACK HOLE players (and some other people) that I "overreacted". They are entitled to their opinion, but when it comes down to the crunch, what kind of a GM so players want? One who will take action (albeit unpopular) to make sure the game is played by the rules, or one who will decide to look the other way when his rules are being violated?

It hasn't caused me any hassle and it keeps that game from being sucked up because of a lousy NMR. If, however, the order came in after the deadline and that game had already been adjudicated, then the guy is SOL. Anyone else out there willing to state a quick opinion on this? But since we are talking about house-rules in this discussion, make sure you see the revised MM House-rules in the next MM.))
