STILL MORE STUFF

Just thought I'd throw in a little bit more while I have the chance. First, Al Rodrigues, Dan Kuszynski, and myself drove down this past weekend (7/11-13) for GLASC V at Cal State Northridge. We first went to Jack Masters' place where we were fortunate enough to be able to find a place to sleep for the weekend and then we all went together to the Con. We arrived Friday evening just in time for the first round of the DIPLOMACY tournament (such as it was). Considering how poorly organized things were and the lack of publicity for the event, there was a good showing with five or six boards in play. The tourney was set up so that the winner from each board and the best runnerup of them all would make it to the final round where whoever won would be THE winner. The first game I found myself as France with Dan playing Italy. Dan did an excellent job of working with the Turkish player and they wiped out Austria rather quickly

I gained three builds in 1901 and then got into a static war with England. I couldn't persuade anyone to help out (Germany was wiped out and Russia was firmly allied with England) so it was only a matter of time until Italy came steaming into Spain and Marseilles. I ended the game with one fleet in Brest, while Dan barely edged out the Turk for the right to go on to the next round. And guess who won the final game with Russia? That's right, none other than Dan himself. Congrats to Dan!

We managed to get in four games of DIP and two KINGMAKER games while we were there while also draining a beer or two (although the Security force was formidable, we managed to have some brewkies in the room with our second KM game). READERS' RHETORICAL REPLIES

(( A couple of letters and quick comments about the recent flurry of "Black Hole" garbage that's been printed in these pages the past couple of months. First, a letter from Brux in reply to Barker's letter last issue.))

From Brux Linzey . . .

Dear Ron,

I am writing in reply to Dave Barker's character assassination of last issue. The piece is very well done, and it is a pity that Dave doesn't put his writing abilities to better use. Let's have a look at several statements made by Dave, both in MM and elsewhere. Dave has raised several serious charges, and they need to be answered.

I'll start with Dave's letter to you. Dave implies that I threw Matt McKibbin out of his VOD game on trumped-up charges and for revenge. Blatantly ignored is the fact that I threw Matt out of the game for lying to the GM. Also ignored is the proof of this which appears in VOD #14. If the proof is valid, and I think it pretty much is, then Dave should shut up. If it is not valid, then he ought to answer it. Instead, he just ignores it and continues to make up lies.

Despite Dave's claim to the contrary, I have never "admitted that I didn't have grounds for ejecting McKibbin from his game." But, as we shall see in a moment, Dave is a master at putting words into other peoples' mouths.

Kathy Byrne is currently on my standby list, and she is not a witness to my unethical behavior, as Dave would have us believe. It is true that Kathy and I disagree with certain aspects of GMing, but so far as I am aware, she has no quarrel with the ethics of anything I've done. Of course, Dave ignores this entirely.

Dave says (or actually, implies) that I have written to people playing in Kathy's games and warned them about her character. Does he name any of the people I am supposed to have written to? Of course not. THIS STATEMENT IS A LIE, and I challenge Dave to try to prove it.

Dave is putting more words into my mouth when he quotes me as saying that John Caruso is an unprincipled GM. I never said any such thing.

Nor does Dave restrict himself to MM with his lies and character assassinations. In a letter to me, dated Feb. 19, he refers to Jack Masters as a bastard, simply because Jack was apparently able to out-negotiate him in 1979IC. In the same letter, he accuses me of collaborating with Jack on a cover-up story concerning that game. Can Dave prove this? Of course not. It's all in his little mind; no such cover-up existed.

Or, turning to a letter from Barker to the Boardman Number Custodian, dated Feb. 16, Dave says that he has ample proof that I was lying to cover up the source of the fake VOLKERWANDERUNG published last Christmas. The proof does not exist, for I was not so lying. If Dave claims to have such proof, I'd like to see it. Worse, in this same letter, Dave says that because I would lie about the fake VOLKER, I would also lie as a GM. Again, of course, no proof.

Turning now to Dave Barker's letter published in VOLKER #7, he refers to me as Masters' cohort. And he discusses a phone call between Jack and myself, and claims to know the content of that call when in fact no such phone call was made at the time Dave claims it was.

Not satisfied with alinging mud at Masters and me, Dave proceeds (in his letter to you) to make sarcastic remarks about the intelligence of Mark Berch, while his buddy Matt attacks John Kelley as a "misguided soul" in a letter to the editor of WHITESTONIA. Both of these attacks were made because the people in question, Berch and Kelley, wrote letters supporting my action in the BLACK HOLE game.

Let me hit you with a few questions, Ron, I would like you to answer these publicly. ((GULP!-RB)). You have already stated your opinion that I may have overreacted in removing a player from a game, and that is your right. But now it is me who is asking you to answer some other questions. The questions are:

- 1) Is it fair for a player to attack a GM's integrity just because he disagrees with a decision that was made?
- 2) Is it fair for Barker to write letters to the editors of four zines and label me a liar and a dishonest GM because I threw his friend out of a game?
- 3) What about his false claims that I called Caruso an unprincipled GM and that I wrote to players in Kathy's games?
- 4) Is this right?
- 5) Is it right to try to totally destroy a guy's reputation by slander, lies, and misquotes? What do you think, Ron?
- 6) Further, is it OK for Barker to attack Berch and Masters, and for McKibbin to attack Kelley, simply because they agree with me? How many more respected hobby members must these two characters attack before people realize what's going on?
- 7) In short, Ron, do you believe that any of Barker's charges, made without any sort of evidence whatsoever, are true?

I think that Dave's actions are despicable. He is a proven liar, and until he learns that his actions are wrong, I think the bobby should just ignore statements that exit from his mouth. I don't know how your readers view Dave's attacks on me, Berch, and Masters. But I personally find them disgusting. The answers to your questions --

1) I guess that depends upon the decision itself. If a GM makes a decision which affects the game itself - which belongs to the players, not the GM - then I feel a player has the right to voice an opinion on that particular GM decision. However, most players realize, and all should realize, that the GM is running the game for the ~~max~~ players as a service and because he enjoys the hobby too. GMs are not out give people a bad time or get rich (has anyone ever known a weathly GM?). He is not likely to make any decisions that are biased or are likely to harm the game. At least not intentionally. At no time do I feel a player has the right to insult the GM because of a GM decision, good or bad, but rather the right to rationally air his opinions.

2) I don't know enough FACTS to comment on this. The answer could be yes or no, depending upon the facts pertaining to this matter.

3) I agree with you that if there's no evidence to support the claim of writing no people in Kathy's games, then no such claim should be made. As for the "unprincipled" statement -- you have to admit that this may have been implied rather than stated but many of us thought you felt that way. Konrad and I both thought that's what you meant. But I'm very glad you have gone on record to clearly state you don't feel that way.

4) See #3 above.

5) I think not. What does this guy think he is anyway? A DIPLOMACY player or something? (Sorry, Bruce, had to say that). Seriously, I don't think this is kosher but I also think you need to have a thick skin to be involved with this hobby -- and all the more if you publish.

6) Attacks? A little too strong a word perhaps, for calling people things like, "a misguided soul" and "very smart". As for Black Jack being a bastard, well . . . (You should have seen what he did to my Italy when he played Turkey. And all because of that little misunderstanding about Denmark a few months ago . . .)

The computer percentiles of the first eight MURD'RING MINISTERS games has been tracked through 1904 (as of this date 1979H0 has not yet completed 1904). Results are presented below. Many games have gone well beyond 1904 at this time. It is interesting to note that the percentile standing in 1904 can be improved (e.g. France in 1979AN) and a very good standing could fall apart (e.g. Italy in 1978II). In most games, however, the pattern is well established by 1904 and good ratings continue to hold up while ratings below 25-30 are extremely hard to improve upon in future years.

In MURD'RING MINISTERS games, German players have done very well. Bruce Linsey, playing a very strong German game in 79CF, has the 9th best ranking in 1904 -- but is only the 4th best German. On the other hand, French players have done very poorly in NM games and only two French players have percentiles over 50.

The NM '04 top board would be: Austria: Carson (79AI); England: Masters (79AI); France: Hartman (79HN); Germany: Sulsberger (79AN); Italy: St.Germain (78II); Russia: Arnett (79AI); Turkey: Howard (79HN). It is very interesting that the three all-novice games (79AI, 79AN, and 79HN) have produced two players each on this top board. Does this indicate a basic unevenness of competition in all-novice games?

((No surprise to see the co-winners of the first game to reach its conclusion in NM are also the top rated Russian and English players as both achieved rapid early growth and ended the game with 29 supply centers between them. Some players will be surprised by France's poor showing -- not me. I have some affliction for drawing France that I cannot explain but I have played France at least two times as much as any other country I've played and I've had a hard time every game. I cannot even remember a good game with France. So, like I said, it's no surprise for me to see France do poorly in NM games, but especially so when you have high calibre players as Germany: Masters, Linsey, Sulsberger, Barker, Pilant, etc. are all superior players. So I'd say we might hazard drawing a conclusion here: When Germany does very well, France ~~usually~~ usually doesn't. And there's only one game in NM where France and Germany have remained at peace. Anyone wish to send their own analysis? Thanks go to Black Jack for his work. (and watch the sub extension). ))

MURD'RING MINISTERS HOUSERULES  
 (Revised, July '80)

As recorded in the original MH Houserules, article #18 (MH#1) and in the revised MH Houserules, article #11 (MH#12), the MH Houserules are hereby re-revised. I think that this list shall in all probability, withstand the test of time and not need any future revisions, although it will be reprinted from time to time.

- 1) All standard rules of DIPLOMACY will be used, as found in the Avalon Hill rulebook of 1976.
- 2) Deadlines- The deadline for turning in moves will be printed in the preceding issue of MH. Deadlines will be STRICTLY enforced. This will be to insure that the game will be as punctual as possible and to make Bruce Lindsey a happier person. MAILED ORDERS must arrive by post the day of the deadline or sooner. PHONED ORDERS must be called in by 1:00 pm the day of the deadline or sooner. NO EXCEPTIONS will be made.
- 3) Orders- Orders are to be mailed to that particular game's Gamemaster. Please note that this is a postal game and as such, please try to MAIL your orders in. Orders sent must contain the following in order to be valid: the game number (the Boardman Number or temporary MH or TG # number if a BN is yet to be

- assigned), the date the order is sent, the Country Assignment, and the player's signature. Failure of the above MAY result in an error that, if it occurs, will be considered the fault of the player! Please understand I am striving for player protection here. If you must phone in your orders as we all need to do occasionally, please do so with the understanding that if you do not speak with the GM personally, there is no guarantee that your orders won't be fouled up. Wives and/or roommates can be a great help and capable of taking orders but mistakes have been made in this manner before; so beware! (It's a good idea to have your orders read back to you in any case). Phoned in orders are acceptable only between the hours of 6:00 pm-11:00 pm PST.
- 4) **NMR Insurance-** This is available for only a request for NMR Insurance on a separate piece of paper along with your phone number. If I haven't received a move from you by the deadline date, I'll call you collect and "collect" your moves.
- 5) You must maintain a subscription or current trade to play in MM.  
 Costs: \$4.00/12 issues = subscription rate  
           \$3.00/game = gas/fee for regular DIPLOMACY  
 There is no NMR deposit required.
- 6) **Preference Lists-** A preference list is a listing of the countries you want to play, in the order you wish to play them. Preference lists will be accepted and used as best the GM can manage. (You may not get your 1st choice but you shouldn't get worse than your 3rd choice.)
- 7) **Notation-** The following notation will be used in the adjudications of DIP games in MM:

  - Tys = Tyrrhenian Sea
  - Lyo = Gulf of Lyon
  - Lpl = Liverpool
  - NAt = North Atlantic Ocean
  - NAf = North Africa
- 9) GM will list possible retreat destinations but makes no guarantee the list will be all-inclusive.

## MM House Rules (Con't)

- Failed orders will be underlined. Support and convoy orders which of themselves succeed, will not be underlined, even if the unit supported or convoyed does not succeed in its movement. The province in which a unit lies at the end of a turn will be capitalized. Thus, A Den-KIE succeeds while A DEN-Kie does not. In case a move is mistakenly not underlined, but the move fails, the daps will be the final indicator.
- 11) Supply Center Charts will use this format:  
 A. StP, Mos, ~~Swy~~, WAR....." player controls StP, Mos, and War. Sev was lost while War gained this game year.  
 B. Home, Nwy....." player controls all his home centers plus Nwy.
- 12) A list of standby players will be maintained. An NMR will be assigned a standby player, who will inherit the position if the player in question fails to get his moves in twice in a row. If a player NMR's in Spring 1901, a set of pre-conceived neutral moves will be used. If a player NMR's in any other season, all units will hold in place.
- 13) The playing schedule will include a Spring, Fall, and Winter Cycle. Winter moves will be combined with Spring moves after 1901 unless at least two players request a separation of seasons. Moves sent in may be conditional based upon retreats, removals, and/or Winter builds. Aaid Conditional Orders are acceptable so long as the conditions are such as may be satisfied at the end of the season before the conditionals are to be exercised. If none of the conditions given by the player take place, the first set of orders listed will be those used.
- 14) If one player submits orders for another player the following conditions must be adhered to:  
 1. The orders must bear the signature of the player who owns that nation.  
 2. Orders must arrive in separate envelopes.  
 3. This is not encouraged but grudgingly allowed.
- 15) Press Releases- Press is encouraged under the following restraints: Press must carry a dateline. This dateline must be a city or province under the player's control or that of a neutral location (Switzerland, for example). You may not use a city or province as your press dateline if it is in the possession of another player. If a player submits a press release without a dateline one will be selected by the GM which is under that player's control. Black Press is not allowed unless otherwise specified. Strong expletives may be deleted and the publisher reserves this publishing right. But try anything you wish. Press may be conditional upon certain orders succeeding. Press should be limited to not exceed than 250 words per game season.
- 16) Concession and Draw Proposals- All calls for a draw or concession must be unanimous to carry. Only the success or failure of the draw proposal will be published; all ballots will remain secret. NMR constitutes a 'Yes' vote on the proposal. If there are multiple draw proposals that pass, the draw involving the largest number of players will be the one that passes.
- 17) The Game Master's decisions are final. The only valid argument will result from a GM decision that is a direct contradiction of the Rulebook (see I #1 above).

MM House Rules (Con't)

- Deception of the GM- This is about the only unethical trick in the proverbial DIPLOMACY Book. If you plan any extraordinary tricks to deceive another player(s), the GM should be informed (like sending a fake game report, for example). Deception of the GM would include such things as falsifying another player's orders either by post or by phone. Always be honest with your GM, he/she/it is on your side and only trying to help you. Should you be caught deceiving the GM in any way, you will be "completely" at the mercy of whatever disciplinary action the GM feels is justified.
- 19) The TWILIGHT ZINE will utilize all the above H.R.'s above except:
  - A. TZ games may or may not utilize standby players dependent upon player sentiment.
  - B. No neutral orders will be used. If a nation NMR's in Spring 1901 all units will hold. A standby will then be called (see #12 and #19.A).

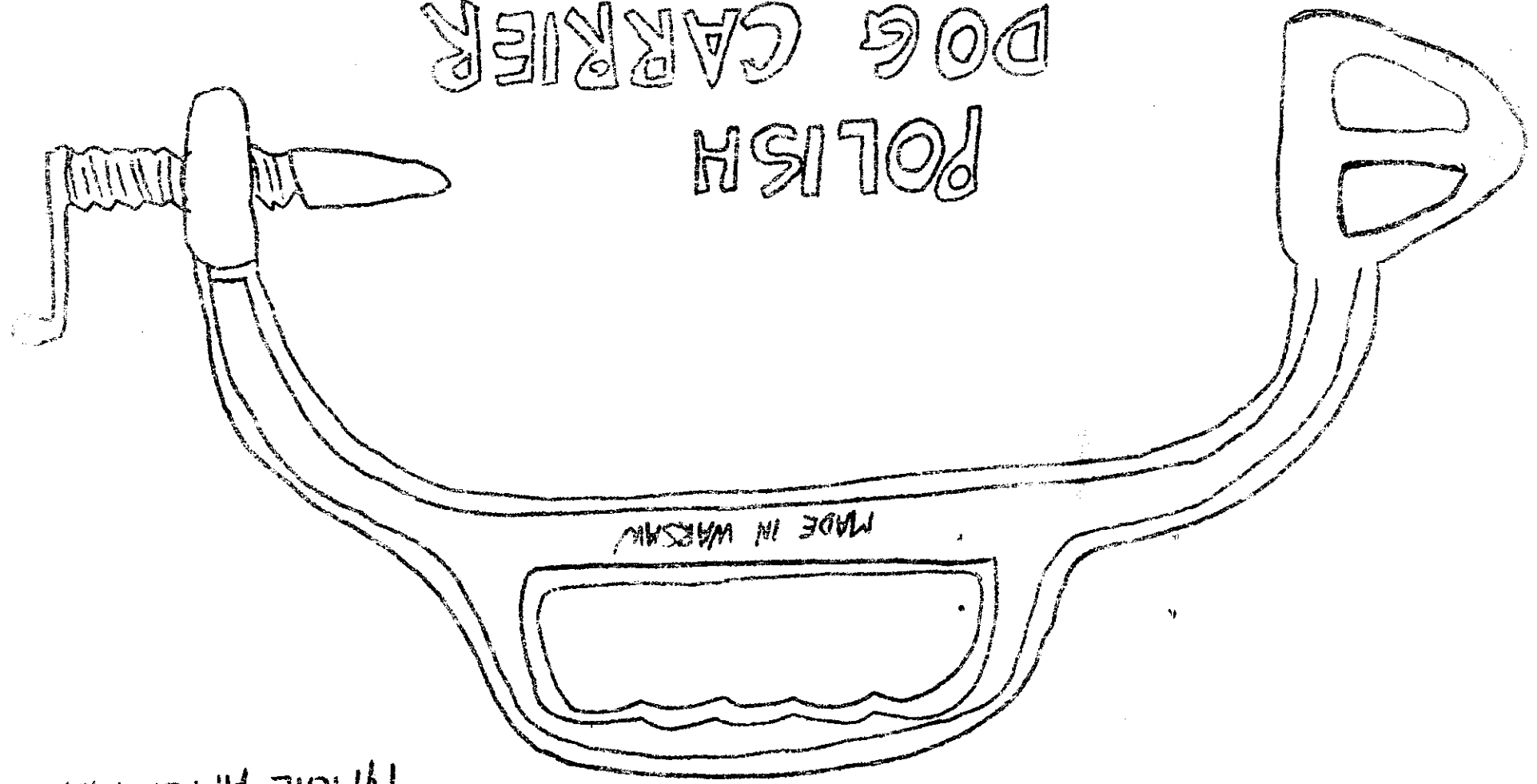

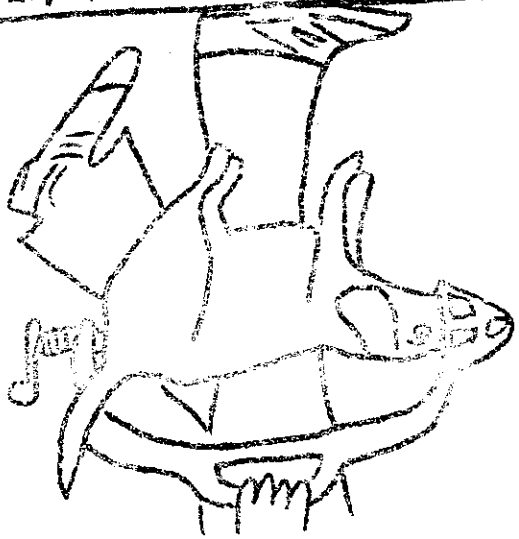

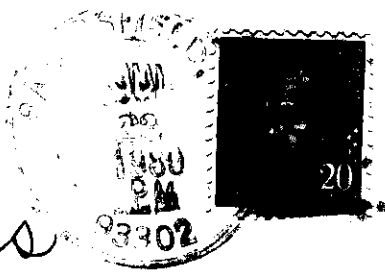
