JUST AMONG FRIENDS published by Al Pearson, Box 898, Charles Town, WV 25414 continues to be one of my favorite zines. Al currently has 12 DIPLOMACY games underway therein and has just begun two new subzines so there will be more game openings now. The subscription rate to JAF is \$8.40/12 and it is one of the most reliable zines in the hobby coming out once a month. Al has never yet, been late and he has published 22 issues already! The latest DIPLOMACY DIGEST (#59) arrived lately. After all the fakes of it, I had to look at it closely to see if it was the real thing or not. The theme of this particular DD is the debate on which is preferable, getting a draw or getting a strong second place in a DIP game. I've been planning a similar discussion in MM, so it was of particular interest to me. Also of interest about this issue are Mark's comments about all the confessions of those responsible for the fake DD, "Grandson of Lexicon". Those claiming they were responsible for the fake issue were: Guy Hail, Bruce Linsey, Myself, Kathy Byrne, Andy Lishett, Steve Arnawoodian, Cary Coughlan, and Jack Fleming. Even though Berch thinks otherwise I must confess to all of you that it was indeed myself that did the fake. Thank you and good night.

There has been some discussion lately about whether or not the scoring system used at a tournament should be kept secret or not. The two most notable debaters on this topic have been Mark Berch and Steve Langley. I really must take Steve's side on this one. The main argument, it seems, for the argument of making the scoring system public is Mark's contention that without knowing the system, a player might make a decision that hurts his score. Mark gave this example in COAT OF ARMS #10: "You are England, with 13 centers. Austria has 12, Italy has one. Austria tells you, "I will attack Italy on this, the final move of the game. You could foil this by supporting him; please do not. What do you as England, do? . . . the winner will be determined by the choice of system, not quality of play." But if the scoring system is known, England's choice is made up for him. He will do whatever will improve This chances. If it's unknown, he must make a decision and wait to see how the scoring system awards points for it. I mentioned before my experience of playing Turkey in a tournament game. The last move of the game was coming up - one that I had carefully set up and played for. I was going to stab two countries at once and gain 5 SCs, and if the system were unknown, I would have. But because it would have lost points, I didn't do it. I maintain that knowing the scoring system perverts the natural course of the same!

AUSTRIA by Stan Johnson

Many people despair upon hearing they've drawn Austira. Ocooh NOOCOOO! They cry throwing up their hands in defeat. "I'll never see '04," they sigh, resigning themselves to a draw at best.

But are they right to do this? Sure, Austria has more potential enemies than a dog has fleas and only the fact there is only four directions from which the enemy can come, North, South, East, and West, limits Austria's vulnerabilities.

However, just as there is great risk there is also great potential for an Austrian player who uses his wits and his pen. Austrians who don't write, find self in big fight.

Sure, you're vulnerable, use it to your advantage. When you write the Big Four remind them of this: "I'm vulnerable, I have enough to worry about." Many attacks originate out of fear, man's basic fight or flight instinct arises even in DIPLOMACY. If you make someone nervous, they'll attack you, so ease these fears and calm those nerves.

You have the least to fear from Germany. In fact a good relationship with Germany can be your ace in the hole. Remind him of your common Aryan ancestry, your common heritage and foes. The threat of a block in Sweden may keep Russia honest.

Russia may be the one country with more to worry about than you. If you can establish a common ground in this paranola, he may be a good friend. You must interest him in the Turk and vice versa. Let them both know the other is plotting against him. A Russian-Turkish war is every Austrian's truest wish. However, the same Russian weaknesses that may ally you sometimes prompts the Russian to attack. Why should Russia attack the one nation for which he has the least to fear, you may ask? Indeed, often the Russian feels incapable of dealing with a strong foe, so he seeks the weakest, he may also be hoping to appease the Turk, or received promises from the Italian. So with false dreams of glory he heads South. Always watch Galicia, it is your most vulnerable point. Always be prepared for Russian perfidy. If you are wise you have made preparations for gaining English or German aid in the event of such an attack. Then, of course, there is always the Turk.

If the Turk does not attack Russia, you can bet dollars to doughnuts he's coming after you. So you had best get him after Russia unless you are a masochist. Promise the Turk anything and everything. Show him how to achieve two builds at Russia's expense. Point out the advantages of boating to the Black Sea and vacationing in Sevastopol. Inform him about the secret Russian plan for the invasion of Turkey, that's fallen into your hands, and of the dread Russian-Italian alliance aimed at you and he. However, always remember the Turk's usefulness to you is short term. If allowed to grow unchecked he'll be your undoing, so use him and lose him.

Which brings me to Italy. Surprisingly, it is often easy to reach agreement with the Italian. This may be because most writers of these articles are quick to say an early attack on you is bad for Italy. Besides, if a peaceful agreement about the Venice/Trieste question can be worked out there is really little to fight over. A three-way German/Italian/Austrian neutralization of Tyrolia often suits everyone.
