TOURNAMENT PLAY FOR A NOVICE by David Grabar

Recently I attended a tournament where 25% of the people who played were Novices. I suggest that every experienced player bring this paper with him to the next tournament and have your potential Novice ally read over this. The Novice will know that you aren't just telling him a bunch of lies. Here it is in Black and White. It seems that in the "Heat" of a tournament, the Novice doesn't believe the obvious statements that you are about to read. Well, here it is. Read it. The guy is telling you the truth.

#1. STAB WITH SOME SENSE!

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You can't win the game on your own. You must work with someone. You must share a common goal towards a common point. Blind stabbing is totally stupid and will cost you the game.

A one center stab is totally stupid! You gain nothing! All you do is make the country you stabbed extremely angry at you. That one center stab won't do beans against the hostile enemy you just created.

If you do stab, get help. Take the country out as fast as possible. Make sure he loses men and won't have any builds coming. You should try to take 3 or 4 centers at once (with the help of others).

Once he is down, KILL HIM. He is a wounded animal. He will pounce on you if at all possible. Don't pity him.

#2. FRONT LINE THEORY

A person who is not fighting you is a friend. A person who is fighting your enemy is an ally (like it or not). It doesn't matter if you have talked or not, it is a

friendship out of convenience.

DON'T, repeat DON'T, take a center away from a person who's doing your job. An example is Turkey and Austria. If you are Turkey, and Austria is fighting Russia in the North, don't take any centers from Austria. Austria is holding back Russia for you. They will fight each other and neither will grow. You can concentrate on Italy full force. A stab of Austria might net you 3 centers, but Austria will crack. In reality, you have cost yourself centers. Austria will remove his men from the front lines. Russia will pour in and Austria will turn hostile. Now, you have lost all the Austrian support that could have been considered your own.

#3. THERE WILL NOT BE A SOLE WINNER!

Tournament is not set up for a single winner. Make a firm alliance and play for the draw. Stick to your allies. The tournament will reward you with enough points to qualify. A stab of an ally will likely cost you both the game. It will also get you a bad reputation as a stupid Novice that has no foresight. Everyone watches everyone and knows who are trustworthy and untrustworthy people. Experienced players jump at the chance to get a trustworthy Novice player on their side.

#4. HOLD IN THERE BABY

A tournament is set up to see how long you and your ally can hold together.

Don't be fooled. Remember, there won't be a singel winner. Work towards the common goal. If you stab, you lose.

#5. PLAN FOR THE FUTURE!

You don't have to stay even in builds to have trust. The person on the "front lines" needs the builds. With Turkey and Austria, for example, Turkey only needs 4 or 5 units to do his job. Austria needs everything else. A Turkish army takes 3 years to get into action. An Austrian army is there in 1 year. An annihilated Turkish army has to be rebuilt all the way back in Turkey and again takes another 3 years to get to the front.

#6. PLAY THE STALEMATE:

Get into a stalemate position. Hold tight and don't give it up by stabbing. You are guaranteed a piece of the draw in a stalemate. With luck, you may be able to push onward. Remember, the odds of a singel winner will be very poor.

#7. SET A GOAL AND STICK TO IT! THE DESCRIPTION OF A DESCRIPTION OF A STREET O

By the end of 1901, you should know who your allies and enemies are. Make your commitments and hold fast. Don't be swayed. Changing in midstream can only cost time (something you can't afford in a tournament).

#8. LET YOUR ALLIES KNOW WHAT IS GOING ON!

Build trust. Keep each other informed on what the other countries are doing and saying. DEMAND to see his orders every time. If he says no, he is planning a stab a little way down the line. Establish the trust and you will have a good ally.

#9. WATCH YOUR ALLIES!

He should spend at least 50% of the time with you. He shouldn't talk to a single country more than 3 minutes. If so, they have something working.

In closing, I just want to stress that you consider that above advice carefully. A tournament is not like a face-to-face game. You have totally different objectives and goals.

Dear Ron,

Dear Ron,

The topic of this letter is a phone conversation which m you may have long ago forgotten, since it took place over two years ago.

Back in 1980, I mentioned to you that I had seen your seven strategy articles in a book in some bookstore, somewhat different from what had appeared in MM but still recognizable. At the time, you told me that you had no knowledge of the articles having appeared in a book. You may also recall that I mentioned this in passing in VD #26 and jokingly suggested that maybe you were the same person as the one who wrote that book.

The subject has come up again, because I have just received a letter from a novice player who had a few days ago received a copy of <u>Supernova</u> from me. In the letter, he mentions that the Austria article is strikingly similar to the one in the book, which he too had read. Enjoy Wichita this weekend!"; looking for a big magic marker so we could put a "PudgeCon here!" sign on the portable john at the entrance to the subdivision; taking a Thunderbird full of groady conventioners to a STEAK & ALE Friday night, with a drunken Coughlan yet; laughing when Gary asked for a box for a case of beer, and then finding you have to ask in Wichita; signing 8 x x 11 papers for the hobby scarenger hunt, then snipping off a tiny corner so they won't qualify; going into SAMBO'S with 7 for breakfast, just after another group of us is leaving after breaking a seat; complaining about the rough carpet you slept on, just before finding someone as leep on the concrete garage floor (true!);

hearing Kathy and your wife discuss you on the phone, while they laugh; finding Arnawoodian's as big a you-know as they say; passing out IRKSOMEs, MAGUSs, a fake DIP DIGEST; opening Pudge's refrigerator and finding it full of Shasta Diet Strawberry soda; getting home with 85¢ left in your pocket; coming back early, and finding a "Gone to supper, back at 7:30" sign on the empty refrigerator; -THAT'S what a convention is. That's why it was well worth the \$80+ I'm out, or the \$300 the east coast types must have laid out. I hope I remember that at Detroit time next summer.

There was one memorable game for me, played late Saturday night-Sunday morning. My Germany had an early choice of going with Sherwood's France or Al Giddings' England. Each season to WO1, I could have gone either way. Then I decided to go with strength, Al's England. France went down a little, but not much; the East was in a terrible mess, so a western 3-way developed under Austrian pleas for help. We went east so forcefully that Ozog (Italy) proposed a concession, but since it was "only" WO2, some said better to play it out at least one more year. Too bad. The East got together, we made a tactical error, and by 05/06, we were stymied. The lines solidified totally, and it looked like 4 hours shot on a 7-way draw. Then Giddings took Tro's Brest. My stalemate line Baltic-Switzerland depended entirely on (former) French support of Munich from Burgundy, so I made a deal with the East: I would abandon Munich and take Al's Scandanavia if they would bypass me as they headed into the E-F brawl in France-Med. Ozog knew I was telling the truth, and went for it. One result I'm not sure they realized but I foresaw, was that once the EFG alliance totally collapsed as it did, so would the RAIT alliance. Quiet ol' Mike Mazzer, languishing with a 4 center Turkey in the forgotten and dead corner, was somehow into Serbia, and then had a fleet in the Adriatic the next year. We called for an RTG draw-Giddings (E) voted no. We included him, RTGE-Sherwood (F) said no to spite Giddings. Steve Langley quit as Russia, as did the Austrian player, out of fatigue. It was going on 2 am. Osuch assumed Russia, Austria went out, Italy shrank. There was total TRG cooperation with little to no diplomacy needed. We were too tired anyhow. The survivors asked for a 6-way draw, and sleep. I said there was a lot of play left, how about TRG? No. TREF would OK any result, but I could see we had it. Eric? "I'll play it if you will". I voted no, and on we went, amid many groans. At 3, TRG passed. Al's England was barely surviving with a unit in Wales, and 5 of my German units in the other provinces of it, plus two of mine in the Low Countries and one enroute. Bob's Russia was in Berlin-Burgundy-North Italy. (I'd promised Tro I wouldn't cross his French border in SO1, and kept that throughout the night, altho I did support Russian A Mun-Bur). Mazzer had a strong position in the Balkans-Med. If it hadn't been "only 1902", an EFG draw would have passed 5 hours before. Now, at 3 am and much negotiating-lying-haggling and weariness later, I came out in an RTG. It was very satisfying. As Osuch and I went upstairs to find sleeping space, ANOTHER game formed! They played to a 5:15 four way draw. Eric kept notes on the results of most of the activity, so check out the current or next DBM.

The last day is always kind of slow. One group didn't leave for Sambo's breakfast until 10, while another group was gone before I got up at 7:30. I would have gone to breakfast then, but there was a car behind me in the drive, and another blocking in 4 of us parked laterally in the street. I thought about crossing the lawn to the neighbor's drive, but the guy was out there with his garden hose wondering what we were: perverts, subversives, or what? So I waited until some others got awake.

There should be a lot of good pictures around, although I'm not sure where they will turn up outside DBM. Kathy brought a camera I think, but I'm not sure W handles photos well. Mark Luedi had a fancy one; I think his may be in DBM. Some of the shots should be pretty good, although Kathy didn't go for my idea of one with her and my heads and hands protruding above the bedsheet, or any good stuff like that. I hope someone publishes the postcard Caruso sent Olsen that Friday too. You see, I'd warmed O|sen up by way of inquiries regarding Kansas laws on automatic weapons, and partition proposals for Kathy, etc., for some weeks. That fool wrote Caruso and said "Michalski is a sex fiend", so here comes this card to

Olsen saying Caruso would kill Pudge personally if he let Michalski "lay a hand or anything else" on Kathy. That got passed around for a good laugh. There were, some other things passed around too, but I won't comment on that. I didn't feel like spending time on them anyhow. I did put in a plug for secret tournament scoring with the two 1-2-3 reps that showed up, but the other discussions hold less interest for me than did even the COSMIC ENCOUNTERS or RAIL BARON games played. Mark Berch was discussed the most, rarely well spoken of, followed by Bill Highfield (MODERN PATRIOT) second. The best stories were those of Langley being missed at the bus station—he looks so unlike what you'd expect, I guess they ignored him on the first pass. Then Coughlan landed, and found no one to meet him. He walked around the airport holding up a dipzine to be recognized, but only drew funny looks, so he called and found no one was waiting or even readily available anyhow. Olsen got back, was told about the calls from Langley and Coughlan whom he'd started after to begin with, and headed back, eventually finding both. (The bus station is downtown, airport SW of the city, his home in the far NE...). When Dave Pilant came up Saturday, he set some kind of record: drew 2 Italys, two Astrias, one Turkey that weekend. (In FTF, Turkey is awful). The games seemed (to me) dominated by EFG alliances, altho I hear it was different upstairs. There were often 3 games in progress, although the third was often Gunboat or Rail Baron. I never got to play on the same board as Pearson, which I'd wanted to, or Woody, whom I was glad to avoid. Kathy's accent was tolerable after a few beers and some Amaretto & Cognac I'd taken along, and I much enjoyed supper out with her, despite our wholly inappropriate attire and a drunken Gary harassing the moronic waiter.

My thanks to Bob Olsen for hosting the Con, hanging tough even as squirtgun battles raged across his home and furniture, cased beer sagged or broke the refrig shelves, overflowing trashbags tumbled onto the floor (see snapshot below), people took showers in his tub shower that lacked a shower curtain...I guess he was just glad Gary never threw up or anything. I'd like to thank Steve Langley for showing up, keeping me from my usual spot as the person most different from what everyone had expected. It was good to see Bob Osuch, Gary, and Scott Hanson again from St Louis a year or so back, my first real FTF meet. Too bad Gary was sober Saturday

and Sunday; he's cute when he's bombed.

Thanks to Daf Fritz for a pleasant conversation, even though I called her during daylight hours instead of the middle of the night. Thanks to the many attendees who came a long way for many hours at considerable expense (not me, for once, whew), and finally to you readers for plowing through all this!
