GM Comment- First of all congratulations to John, Bob, and Don on their draw in this game. It saw England and Germany establishing a fairly solid alliance early in the game and from that point on it seemed an unbreakable alliance. Together they jumped on Hugh's France; but the French didn't go down without a struggle, and it was 1906 before he was gone completely! McCloud got Austria off to a good start and then when MacFarlane took over, Austria's

success was assured. All three of the drawing poweres stood at exactly the same: 9 SC's strong, which is a tribute to the evenness of the alliance. Congrats again to the three victors!

AUSTRIA - John MacFarlane (Draw)

I inherited a pretty good position from Larry McCloud as I took over for him as Austria in 1905. Unfortunately, Larry's Austria, while reasonable strong, was headed nowhere, in a fruitless war on Germany. I wrote to Germany seeking a truce, and got it, in addition to a game long alliance with Don Swartz.

Negotiations with England were touchier. Since Olsen and I were headed directly for conflict in the Mediterranean, relations were tenuous and we never really came to any sort of agreement. But with Germany, I quickly invaded Russia and soon controlled most of the southeast (Turkey had been simple with Italy's help).

I kept Italy as an ally throughout for both moralistic and pragmatic reasons. I saw no reason to stab him, as he had worked well with Larry and me in the past, and was doing a good job keeping England out of the Mediterranean, one of my weak spots in terms of defense. I think this alliance worked until the end to the benefit of both of us.

With Turkey, Russia, and France basically eliminated, the game turned into a classic three-power game with a small but possibly influential Italy in-between. The game had a lot more in it, I think -- we were just afraid to find out exactly what. I agreed to the draw because my gameload was already too large for my tastes and because I was not sure I could succeed in prying England and Germany apart if it came down to that.

Don and Bob were excellent correspondents, among the best I have ever played against. And I appreciated Dan Palter's to-the-point style and loyalty. Lastly (but not leastly!) thanks to Ron for a well-run, and enjoyable, game.

ENGLAND-Robert Olsen (Draw)

This was a rather slow game for the most part, but it had some interesting aspects. In the opening I found myself adjacent to two good players and letter writers in Don (Germany) and Bill (France). Unfortunately, the decision as to whom to ally with was made easy by France's failure to hop off the mark in Winter 1900; by the time he got around to writing a letter, Don and I were already conducting a pretty good dialogue, and the alliance was set. Bill wrote some good letters, particularly in 1901, but by the time things were more or less set. Don Swartz proved an ideal ally, always communicative and cooperative; as the game progressed we generally set things with one phone call and left it at that.

The Russian player was, I believe, a novice; he got going fairly well, but seemed to lose interest in midgame. Italy and Austria were Dan Palter and Larry McCloud

respectively--two of the quietest players in Dipdom. I've got to hand it to Palter though--he wrote, on his own, no less than six times; I'd expected nothing from him after a previous game, so he was really into this one, and did fairly well for awhile.

Dan Gorham was Turkey and unfortunately failed to find an ally--Palter and McCloud were solid and Russia went along with them. His plaintive cries to England unfortunately could not be answered in time.

With A-I-R preoccupied with Turkey, E-G had France to themselves, and after a few missteps did him in, then turned on Russia while I also tried to stage an incursion into the Mediterranean. About this time Larry McCloud dropped and John MacFarlane took over Austria, but this didn't change much, except for shutting off the flow of NMR's. By this time the game had become merely a tactical exercise, so we managed to end it.

Not exactly the wildest game ever played, but any game you can walk away from, with a share of the draw, has to be counted a success. Thanks Ron, now how about a 3-way draw in 83AY?

TURKEY-Dan Gorham

This was one of those games where it shows how important an ally can be -- even if it is only one.

Turkey from the beginning of the game had no friends, no neutrals, no allies!!

Italy was the big spoiler for Turkey as Palter came right in to hit me early with the Lepanto opening so that in the Winter of 1904 he had his fleet in Eastern Med. This hurt, as Russia was in Armenia and Austria had taken Bulgaria - I had only an A Ank, A Con, my A K Arm retreating to Smyrna.

The big hurt came in Spring 1905 when Akustria took Constantinople from Bulgaria with support from his Aegean Fleet.

On the diplomatic front, I tried to tell Italy he would not gain from attacking Turkey but would lose out in the long run - he would not listen and sent an Army into Syria - he was over-extended but I was DEAD!

I had two centers left going into Fall 1905 and it was all over for Turkey - but I can be happy in knowing that the two players who did me in - also died at the hands of others - just as I told them they would. While they were hitting me, the big three were growing. Only Austria made something out of eating Turkey . . .

Best wishes to the guys who won: MacFarlane (Austria); Olsen (England); and Swartz (Germany).
