

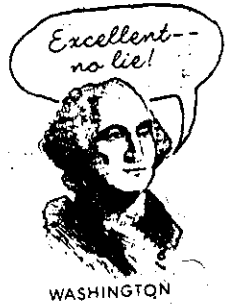
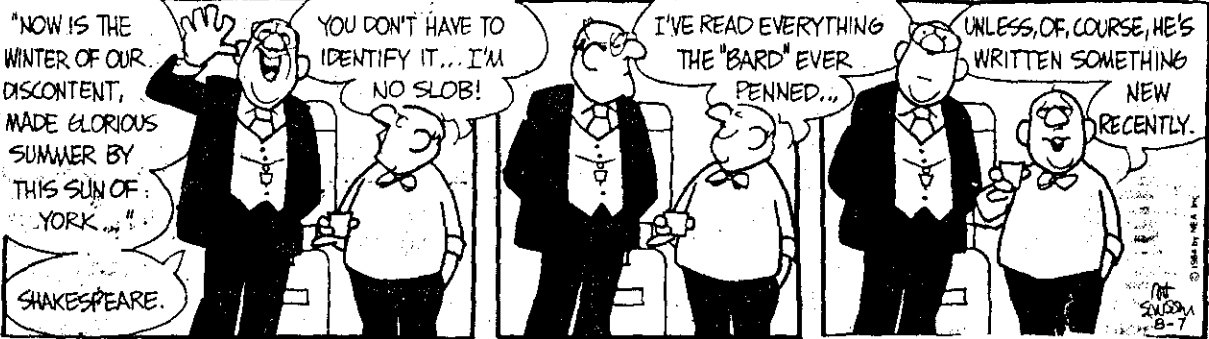

Napoleonic battles are still going on around these parts (although I don't have time to do as much with them as I'd like). The last battle I was involved in was a "small" battle — which our rules system is really designed for. There were two of us on each side. For the French, Marshal Jacques Pervert (me) and Marshal Stiffhardo Ardoni (and his horse, Lance the Wonder Horse) otherwise known as Dan Kuszynski. Our opponents were General I.M. Rotund (Mike Coburn) and General Ben Dover (Tim Luken). The battle was small with 4 infantry battalions on each side, 2 cavalry regiments, and one battery of horse artillery. The battlefield was a flat plain so in the clear weather the French vividly saw the approach of the British Redcoats and their allies, the Nassau and the Portuguese battalions. The game featured a lot of movement and maneuvering as units jockeyed about for the most advantageous direction of attack. Dan led his Vistula Lancers against Mike's Nassau battalion and staggered them backwards, reeling from many casualties. But the cost was high as the Lancers were so decimated by the Nassauers' musketry they retired from the battlefield. But as Tim's Highland infantry moved ahead to attack, Dan's Gray Hussars swept into and through their flank, scattering them to the wind! One Highland battalion survived by forming square so to protect themselves from the sabres of the Hussars. At once the horse battery moved up to begin pelting it with canister fire as the Neachatel Battalion advanced in column of attack against the British square. Soon, the Highlanders were sent fleeing from the terrible fury of the elite Swiss Neachatel. The right flank which had been attacked was now totally pacified. However the left wasn't doing so well. There was no artillery support for this flank and sure enough, that's where the enemy had placed their supporting artillery. When British cavalry drew near, the Paris National Guard and the Swiss 3rd Reg't (1st Battalion) were forced to form square . . . excellent targets for the enemy artillery. The Swiss took large casualties as cannonballs tore through their compacted, squared ranks. The Paris National Guard were obliged to take on a charge by the Scots Greys, which because of their strong anti-cavalry formation, they were able to do quite well, driving off the Greys with heavy losses. They, however, took quite a few casualties themselves and the survivors removed themselves to the relative safety of the rear lines. By this time, both sides had used most of their ammunition and both were bled fairly heavily, so the mutual decision to withdraw came as no surprise. Overall, it was pretty much of a stand-off, although Marshal Stiffhardo Ardoni felt the French had the best of it all in all. There will be another battle before long . . . Ardoni! Pervert! Sharpen your blades!!
