He also published a fake 'zine, I CARAMBA, with a fake Hispanic game in it for perhaps one or two issues, as I recall. He did not use the name in order to play two positions simultaneously in a game, or cheat in a game in any other way.

Okay, now it's time for the main event.....

WHO WAS ERIC BLAKE?

It is probably well known by now in both war-gaming and science-fiction fandom that, about 20 years ago, I operated a hoax called 'Eric Blake' out of a post office box on Long Island. It is just as probably not known that 'Eric Blake' was created for neither fandom, but for a more serious and possibly risky purpose.

It began about 1960, when far-right political movements were beginning to develop some violent and fascistic aspects as their challenge to the civil rights movement. I was concerned about this development, since I had been a spear-carrier in the second of the Deep South's boycotts against segregation on buses, as a student in Tallahassee in 1956. I felt that the activities of the segregationist groups had to be studied and publicized so that the danger they posed might better be understood and resisted. I also felt that quotation of the violent groups' publications would be an effective argument against those who opposed civil rights legislation, as a use of a vulnerable debate technique that might be entitled "Look who's on your side!"

When I moved to Jamaica, New York, in 1961, I rented a post office box a few blocks from my apartment under the name 'Eric Blake', and used it for the purpose of subscribing under this name to the publications of such segregationist and militaristic groups as the National States Rights Party (NSRP), the American Nazi Party (ANP), and their various schismatic and front groups. The pseudonym was as a protection to my identity, as I thought that I might write about these groups under my own name, and did not want to leave a trail by which they might get to me. The wisdom of this approach was confined about that time by what happened to an Idaho Negro who, as a joke, wrote to a southern Ku Klux Klan branch and applied for membership. The Klan responded by making him their Northwestern Regional Director. He then went to the press, told them the story, and everybody had a good laugh. They stopped laughing a few weeks later, when he disappeared.

Most of the literature that I received as 'Eric Blake' from segregationist groups was passed on to a friend, a Columbia University student who was writing a book on Anti-Semitism, and was himself a researcher for the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League. But in 1962 I started to get more active in science-fiction fandom. It may seem difficult for a present-day s-f fan in Greater New York to realize, but in those days there were almost no opportunities for "fanning" around here. The once-mighty Futurians had developed into a small group of friends who met at one another's homes, while Panecists and Lunarians were closed-membership groups, with none of whose members I was acquainted. So I joined the National Fantasy Fan Federation (NFFF).

The NFFF takes a little explaining. It began about 40 years ago

with the intent that it should become a blanket organization for all science-fiction and fantasy fans in the country. This ambition foundered over the fact that the only blanket organization in which the average s-f fan was interested was a blanket covering that fan and one member of the opposite sex. (Some people modify one or both of the last two adjectives in that last sentence.) So the NFFFF stumbled along, publishing a quarterly fanzine, and putting up with enormous amounts of bickering among its Board of Directors over topics whose importance could never quite be made clear.

Science-fiction fans, however, are as un-organizable as are war-gaming fans. In both cases, local groups for regular socializing, and periodic conventions for serious hobby activity, are about all the organizing that fans will put up with. There was, and is, no need for a national organization in either field, simply for the sake of having an organization. The NFFFF briefly interested with war-gaming fandom about a dozen years ago, when it produced a Games Bureau which in turn sprouted a Diplomacy Division. This last excrescence was called NFFFGDD, or "Bunchaletters" for short. Naturally, it attracted people who were more interested in organizing Diplomacy than in playing it, and became little more than a tourist bureau for ego trips. Nobody who knows much about postal Diplomacy will be surprised to learn that Red Walker was very active in it.

I am not well up on the organizational convolutions that connect, or do not connect, Bunchaletters with the International Diplomacy Association or Diplomacy World, and which foisted on Avalon Hill the incredibly bad choice of Walker as author of their Diplomacy manual. Nor would readers be interested in an account of these convolutions if they could be made public.

Once having turned 'Eric Blake' loose into the NFFFF, I decided to create a persona and have a little fun with him. I made him a retired civil engineer, and gave his birthdate as 29 February 1908. (NFFFF sends birthday cards to its members, so I, like Frederick of Penzance, handed them this date.) ((Let me interrupt to explain that last remark: Frederick is the main character in THE PIRATES OF PENZANCE, at the beginning of which Frederick, having turned 21, ends his apprenticeship with the pirates, who later "reclaim" him on the grounds that he's bound until his 21st birthday, and only five February 29ths had passed since his birth.)) He had graduated from Stevens Institute of Technology sometime around 1930, and his first job had been involved with the Empire State Building, then under construction. (At one point I gave the readers of the NFFFF fanzine an account of what parts of Manhattan are and are not geologically suited to have skyscrapers erected on them.) Later, he had worked in the ((Panama)) Canal Zone, an experience which brought 'Blake's' views on race into NFFFF letter columns. Still later, he had served with the Navy's famous Construction Battalion ("Seabees") in World War II, before returning to civilian practice.

As a science-fiction reader Blake preferred the elder pulp style, liked Heinlein but with reservations about his lack of religious belief or racism, and could not put up with "egalitarian" scientific doctrines that had crept into modern s-f. He professed himself a believing Christian who was upset over the obvious parody of Christianity in Heinlein's Stranger in a Strange Land. At one point he got a sympathetic letter, expressing agreement with his stands, from Gertrude M. Carr, an acidulous Seattle fan who is still an uncherished legend in s-f fandom. 'Blake' did not put into the NFFFF the unabashedly Anti-Semitic views which he wrote to NERP or ANP, but did defend racial segregation and white supremacy. Needless to say, he was also firmly anti-Communist.

That ends a very exciting FILE 3

In 1963 I moved to Manhattan, but kept the Jamaica post office box in the Blake name. In May of that year, in propria persona, I founded the hobby of postal Diplomacy by publishing the first issue of Graustark. (I want to emphasize this because Walker sometimes has been heard to claim that a friend of his in San Diego had published a postal Diplomacy 'zine in 1962. Some indices have even included a non-existent game with the "Boardman Number" 1962C. The San Diegan has been variously identified as Conrad Metzke, Conrad von Metzke, and Eutiquio Jose Revillagigedo. If anyone except Walker has ever claimed to have met him, I am unaware of that fact.)

Within the next year, other postal Diplomacy 'zines had made their appearance. The second was Ruritania, whose publisher, variously known as David McDaniel and Ted Johnstone, is now dead. (It was unrelated to a more recent 'zine of the same title ((Teny Watson of Las Vegas did this Ruritania, which is where 1980G originally came from)). I took over its publication after McDaniel/Johnstone dropped out of the hobby for the more profitable occupation of writing scripts for The Man From U.N.C.L.E.) The third postal Diplomacy publication was John McCallum's Broddingnag. Another early publication came out from a Californian variously known as Charles G. Brannen, Dan Brannen, and Steven Cartier. Like many other usages from s-f fandom, numerous pseudonyms were becoming common in war-gaming fandom.

Having begun the hobby as a publisher, I was interested in getting into it as a player. I signed up as Turkey in 1964M, McDaniel's first and only game in Ruritania, but found that I was unable to keep up with his deadline schedule, and resigned early lest I spoil the game for the other players. John McCallum's 1964C offered me another opportunity, and I enrolled - once under my own name, and once as 'Eric Blake'. I was assigned England, and 'Blake' got Turkey.

This was not opposed to McCallum's house rules, though today most Gamemasters would not allow it. In fact, only someone desperate for entries would put in the same game two players so close geographically; however, both games and players were few and far between in 1964. At present, I operate under the general principle that "players may use such deceptions among themselves, as being in accord with accepted principles in international diplomacy. As a general rule in these matters, players may practice deception among themselves, but not against the Gamemaster". In the actual First World War, the one which our game mimics, Russia stood in precisely the same relationship to France from 1914 to 1917 that 'Blake' stood in with respect to me in 1964C.

In 1966 or thereabouts, I closed out the "Eric Blake" identity, and passed it on to my friend the political researcher, along with most of the political literature which 'Blake' had received. This political literature was beginning to fix on George C. Wallace, the fiercely segregationist Governor of Alabama, as its 'White Hope' for restoring white supremacy. I was rather worried, owing to that booby trap in the Twelfth Amendment which would throw the country into chaos should a "third party" candidate prevent any presidential candidate from obtaining a majority in the Electoral College.

Early in 1968, I ran a presidential poll in Graustark, and several readers voted for Wallace. At about the time that the poll results were to be printed, a Wallace campaign worker variously called James Earl Ray or Eric Starvo Galt shot and killed Dr. Martin Luther King, and fled the country with obvious help. It later transpired that the plot against Dr. King had been hatched by a wealthy Missouri segregationist, now dead, who had passed the hat among his friends and hired Ray as a hit man. But, at the time, it seemed to me that the Wallace

Richard Nixon didn't vote for

campaign had, like the equally racist Nazis before it, passed the bounds of a legitimate political movement and had become an armed and aggressive conspiracy against the United States of America. Therefore, as several people have already informed war-gaming fandom, I published the names of the Wallace supporters in the Graustark poll. I shouldn't have done this, but in 1968 none of us really understood the clashing tides of legal and extra-legal political action among the many deeply and fervently held beliefs that animated public opinion in that tragic year. Now that the whole Wallace agitation has died and rotted, and racial segregation on the classic pattern has ceased to be defended by even the most reactionary, my concern of 1968 seems vastly overblown.

That finishes the entire 'Eric Blake' business. The only questions left to ask are why, after so many years, the identity of 'Blake' has become an issue among postal Diplomacy fans.

*****Back to LOM again....may I answer that last question? I believe that it has something to do with the famous Donovan fakes. Gary Coughlan faked, among other 'zines, RETALIATION, and John Boardman, in my view, has expressed an unfavorable view toward fakes and their authors. In GRAUSTARK #433, John Boardman published "a list of the most notorious perpetrators of these forgeries," which included Gary Coughlan. Subsequently, when Gary started publishing EUROPA EXPRESS, John wrote a letter to Gary, which appeared in EE #2, and contained the following: "There is no room for you liars, forgers and hoaxers in this hobby...." In EE #3, Rod Walker responded with the Eric Blake and Wallace Poll comments, stating "So there is no room for "you hoaxers".... (and) 'you liars' in the hobby?" The full articles appear in EUROPA EXPRESS, issues 2 and 3, published by Gary Coughlan, 4614 Martha Cole Lane, Memphis, TN 38118.

KINGMAKER, TURN 6.....BOY, MARGARET LOVES TO WATCH THOSE FIGHTS

Two tiny things from last time: Mowbray was in the commons of London, and Percy was on the commons of Harlech (all of the nobles didn't fit, and Percy was the noble(s) with the smallest strength that would allow the remainder to fit - see below).

Mike LaBeau claims that Roos shouldn't have gotten those mercenaries that a noble he fought (and executed) gave up. Those are listed under Advanced COMBAT, which isn't used here. However, more than 300 troops tried to enter Harlech. I tried to remove as few troops as possible, since my policy in these situations is to keep as many troops in the castle as I can. I couldn't remove Cromwell, since he wasn't enough to make the rest fit; since Roos is the marshal, Percy was the lowest-strength noble remaining, so I put him on the commons (there was no combat since all parties were neutral).

PRE-EVENT PHASE: Audley starts at Tickhill, Beaufort at Corfe, Courtenay at Okehampton, and Plantagenet-York at Stekestay. Stanley becomes Chancellor of Cornwall.

AUDLEY (Tickhill)-Newark-Belvoir-Leicester-Coventry(c)

BEAUFORT (Corfe)-h42-h41-h43-h36-Bath

BERKELEY (Kenilworth)-Tewkesbury-h28-Ludlow-w21

COMBAT: PERCY, ROOS, and CROMWELL meet AUDLEY outside Coventry (390-10). (PLAGUE-Newcastle, Durham / 5-4) AUDLEY is captured. The winners couldn't enter the castle, though, as no movement is allowed after combat.

YOUR CROWN CARD:

EVENT CARDS: GALES AT SEA (Le Rose sinks), non-event to Reagan, PLAGUE-Berwick, non-event to Wyatt.

Didn't I ever say which event cards were added? One Royal Death (death of a royal counter rolled for at random), 2 Gales At Sea (ships at sea wrecked), 2 Treachery (non-event: drawer loses 1 or 2 cards, depending on card, from hand, but the cards aren't revealed), and 2 Catastrophe (all nobles temporarily lose all "added strength" except for mercenaries). The Royal Death and the Gales have been drawn, but neither Catastrophe has been drawn. (The Treacheries are a secret.)

TURN 7 is due by MARCH 27, 1982. Press follows:

GLASS ONION-KNIGHT KLINE: Oh! So it was YOU who nugged Howard! And I thought we were friends. You better have a pretty good explanation.

GM: This is PAGE 6, or else.

HELP!

Did you get the message? Now - how would you like to get this thing FREE? You heard me - FREE! What's the catch? Here goes.....

Just recently, John Caruso wrote me and complained about my GMing. I believe he used the words, "You stink as a GM." Had he said that to anybody else, the person he said it to would probably be in an outrage. Here, it's different - mainly because he's right, to a point. SPIES!

Yes, another game has opened here in LOM....It's a good thing that the rules for this game are on ONE 8 1/2 x 11 sheet. (Two, if you include the house rules.) Let me make a clarification to the rules:

a spy is allowed to continue his/her movement after cashing in a secret in the same turn. For example, a spy with a secret (in this example, a French spy) can move from Gibraltar with a secret to Madrid-Paris (cash in secret)-Berlin (pick up another secret)-Geneva-Paris (cash in this secret). Also, you can only Sanction spies that physically occupy the same city as one of your spies during any segment of the movement (for example, if one of your spies moves from Paris to Madrid-Gibraltar-Tangiers-Algiers-Tunis, you can Sanction a spy which moves from Florence to Rome-Western Med-Tunis-Algiers-Tangiers, since the two spies are in Algiers in the fourth segment, but you can't Sanction a spy which moves from Florence to Rome-Tunis-Algiers-Tangiers-Casablanca, since the spies are in different cities at the end of each segment, even though the spies traded places during the fourth segment (one from Tangiers to Algiers, one vice-versa). Finally, because of the nature of simultaneous movement, moves which have "pauses", such as Rome to Florence-Venice-Venice-Trieste-Vienna, are legal.

The ninth game of the 1982 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT comes to you almost LIVE from the usual place in Berkeley (that's Berkeley, USA).... as we pick up the action with a few minutes left in the game, England and The South are neck-and-neck, with the S&B ahead 195-175.....

"The next bonus is worth 30 points, here's the tessup: a set of wooden blocks for Diplomacy now sells for \$10 American. If you were to buy the pieces separately, for 10 points, how much would it cost?" (BUZZZZ)

"S&B, Gonnigani....\$14"

"No, can you take it, Wales' Own?" (RRRRING)

"P&POW, Marsden....it's a trick question"

"That's right - you can't buy French pieces outside of the set. Here's your bonus: in the southeast corner of a Diplomacy map, there's a block of SCs that are adjacent to each other - each SC is adjacent to at least one other SC. You'll get 30 points for a correct answer, 20 if you're off by one, and 10 if you're off by two - how many SCs are in this southeast block?"

(P&POW talks it over) "14?"

"Try 24! The ones NOT part of this block are Warsaw, Tunis, Spain, Portugal, and all of France and England. I knew that it extends through the eastern and central part of the map, but it's mainly in the south-east. Let's see who's scheduled to come....I've heard from Clark Reynolds, Dave Grabar, Judy Winsome, Steve Langley, and a few of the Davis Aggie-types (probably up late last night milking the cows.....meanwhile, we at Berkeley were celebrating a big basketball win on Friday Night over a Top 20 team - at least, they were in the Top 20 (#19) before the game). Still, it's a two-day event, so I'm not worried - much. Actually, I'm more worried that nobody's going to bring a Diplomacy set - I've only got one.

10:20....I suddenly remembered that nobody knows just where my dorm is! Berkeley is a big city, but it's not too hard to find the university - just look for the big clock tower.

10:30....somebody finally arrives.....it's Dave Grabar and a few friends from down Chowchilla way. STANTINOPLE-CON 2 has begun.

In the next 31 consecutive hours, the likes of Tim Winger, Clark Reynolds, Tim Haffey, Steve Langley, and others (but NOT Judy Winsome, I should add) went through games of Diplomacy, Down With The King, Kingmaker, Machiavelli (an all-night game), and a ten-hour session of Nuclear Holocaust that ended with the winner approaching \$5 MILLION! There was gold flying all over the place, and, had the game continued for another few minutes, the H-bombs would have done the same.

I didn't mind that Dave Grabar passed up Diplomacy to play Kingmaker, but why do I always have to play Austria? First off, I join Tim Winger (Russia) and Tim Haffey (Italy) in chewing up Turkey, but then we tried (unsuccessfully) to take apart Steve Langley's German position, which had 8 centers after 1902, no thanks to Italy who could have supported me into Munich had we not gotten out signals crossed with Russia.
