Besides, since it didn't appear in the 1982 ZINE DIRECTORY, available for \$1 from Mike Mills, 47 Mayer Drive, Suffern, NY 10901, and one of the best sources of 'zines anywhere (many of the 'zines I read today I read about first in the ZD), I can call this thing anything I want. And speaking of LOM.....

MONTY'S NEWS AND COMMENT is brought to you this time by the same person who brought you this issue of LOM - Don Del Grande, 142 Eliseo Drive, Greenbrae, CA 94904, phone (415) 461-2692. Now, here's the news.... You'll notice that I didn't say "Stand By for NEWS!". I don't want to be a COMPLETE plagiarist, if that means anything....

The 1982 COLLEGE BOWL season is winding down toward the championship game, with quarter-final action taking place as of this typing (well, actually, the tournament took place a couple of months ago, and they broadcast one game a week - in SF, the championship game is on June 19) at the Roosevelt Hotel in New York City. During a quarter-final game, host Art Fleming announced, "The University of North Carolina has defeated the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire by 340 points." Normally, he just says the final score. This time, however, his action was justified, although, in my opinion, slightly erroneous. the hotel, huh, Greenwood?), it'll be held at the University of Maryland, Baltimore in Baltimore, MD on July 23, 24, and 25 (beginning at 9 AM on the 23rd). As is the official LOM tradition, here's....

HOW TO GET TO ORIGINS
according to the Pre-Registration form

FROM THE NORTHEAST, take I-95 south to the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Take Beltway Exit North to Exit 12, then Wilkins Avenue to the first left, which is Walker Avenue. Turn left on Walker and take it to Loop Road on the campus; there will be signs to the registration area (look for the long line).

FROM CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA & POINTS NORTH: Take I-83 instead of I-95, but follow the above directions (get off I-83 at I-695, and so on).

FROM POINTS WEST: Same as from the NE, but take I-70 to I-695.

FROM THE SOUTH: take Maryland Route 2 or 3 north to I-695; take the Beltway northbound to I-695 and proceed as under NE (i.e. get off at exit 12....) OR take I-95 north to the exit for Maryland Route 166 (Rolling Road North). Take Rolling Road for about a mile to the UMBC access road and take this road to Loop Road, then look for the registration signs.

WARNING! LIFE OF MONTY does not take responsibility for the accuracy of these directions. If you get lost, find a gas station or the nearby AAA office.

As an added feature, here are a few things of interest at the convention for LOM readers....

FRIDAY, 7 PM: MACHIAVELLI tournament (bring your game). 5 hour rounds; final round is Sunday at 9 AM. First prize is \$10 credit at any booth; second and third each get \$5 credit.

FRIDAY, 7 PM: SPIES! tournament (bring your game). Three rounds; second round Saturday 3 PM, finals Sunday 9 AM. First prize is \$150 SPI credit; other finalists get \$20 SPI credit. (NOTE! See the WARNING after the tournament listings!)

SATURDAY, 10 AM: DOWN WITH THE KING tournament, featuring Alan Moon. (Bring your game.) Two rounds; finals are Sunday at 10 AM. \$20 AH credit to the winner, \$15 AH credit for second, \$10 AH credit for third, and a one-year GENERAL sub for fourth.

SUNDAY, 11 AM: COSMIC ENCOUNTER tournament, featuring Expansion Set 8. (Bring your own game). Three rounds; time of last 2 rounds not listed. Winner gets complete COSMIC ENCOUNTER set (game plus 8 expansion kits); second, third, and fourth get Eon credit for \$15, \$10 and \$5.

SATURDAY, NOON: KINGMAKER tournament (bring your game). Two rounds. Winner determined on votes in Parliament after 15 turns or 4 hours. Prizes: AH credit for \$20, \$15, \$10, and a GENERAL sub.

SATURDAY, NOON: DIPLOMACY TOURNAMENT (bring your game)! Second round is Sunday at 9 AM. Plaques awarded to top 8.

SATURDAY, NOON: EMPIRES OF THE MIDDLE AGES tournament (bring your game). Second round is Sunday at 10 AM. Prizes are not quite known; however, I don't think the WARNING at the end of this section applies.

SUNDAY, 9 AM: NATIONAL TEAM GAMING CHAMPIONSHIP. For those of you who don't know what Team Gaming is, here's a quick overview (subject to change): each team of 4 players competes in individual wargames chosen beforehand (each team vetoes a game from a list of 6). Each round is 6

hours long. During each round, each player plays whatever game his/her captain tells him/her to (for the entire 6 hours) against the same opponent. Each game is played in even-hour intervals; the winner receives one point per hour that the game lasts - thus, there are 24 points available (4 players multiplied by 6 hours). I think that the rules will be changed.

Let's have a nice welcome to SCOTT HANSON, whose IRKSOME! joins the list of 'zines that are traded with LOM. Only three trades have folded; BORN TO DIP, THE WHITE DUKE, and THE CHAMBER. Also, I stopped my JIHAD! trade (after JIHAD! didn't show for a while), but I don't think JIHAD! folded.
