If it's a little thinner than usual, it's because I didn't have much time to do it.

MONTY'S NEWS AND COMMENT is brought to you by the makers of IT - the WWII game with the scale of 1 man/counter and 31 square miles of board in 128 different colors....buy yours today!

GDW has announced the re-release of DRANG NACH OSTEN, "retitled" FIRE IN THE EAST (I don't know very much German - but don't these two titles mean the same thing?). For those of you unfamiliar with EUROPA, GDW plans to make a series of games which, when put together, make a LARGE map of Europe (and N. Africa, plus Iran/Iraq). How large, you ask? Most EUROPA games have 2 21x27 inch maps (sample games: THEIR FINEST HOUR (Battle of Britain plus possible German invasion), THE FALL OF FRANCE (featuring Swiss troops), CASE WHITE (Poland), NARVIK (Norway)). FITE has SIX - that's about 63x54, if the maps are placed in a certain way (not necessarily correct, though). Also included are 2000 counters (although FALL OF FRANCE has that many). The strange thing: this game runs from June 1941 to December 1943 - if you want to continue, you have to wait for SCORCHED EARTH, with MORE counters and MORE maps! (Yes, SCORCHED EARTH is a new "Unentschieden".) The price for FITE: a mere \$80. (Under a new price structure, you can get WESTERN DESERT, NARVIK, and MARITA-MERKUR for \$48 - and I don't mean each one for \$48; that's \$48 for all three at once!)

ALSO on the GDW front, THE THIRD WORLD WAR, which is supposed to be similar to EUROPA in 1990. The first game? Of course - THE BATTLE FOR GERMANY. (What did you expect for the opening battle - Thailand?) Oh, I almost forgot - there's a playtest session of FITE in Berkeley which recently resulted in 30 or so pages (30 pages or 60) (whatever) of questions, especially with the order of battle. Have a nice wait. (By the time it comes out, it may be up to \$55 or even \$60, at this rate.)

According to the latest EUROPA EXPRESS, MadCon II will be May 25-28 in Madison, Wisconsin. Contact Mark Frueh, 1013 Milton Street, Apt. 304, Madison, WI 53715. Gary Coughlan sez he'll be there - since I'm already planning to go out east for MaryCon the following week, I might just plan on going to this one as well. I was right!

I also see that Kathy & John are readying a ByrneCon in late July for Ken Corbin and Joan Extrom. Whatisthis, they rate a ByrneCon mention in EE and I rate chopped liver or something? (Don't worry, Kathy, I remember you saying there'll be a ByrneCon to personally drive me out of - er, welcome me to - NYC and those Eastern areas I've only heard about....)

The price for FIRE IN THE EAST has been upped to \$60

FUDGECON III: Labor Day Weekend at Bob Olsen's place, 6818 Winterberry Circle, Wichita, KS 67226 - bring those water pistols! Unfortunately, I won't be there, since I'm supposed to be a DM (Dungeon Master) at PACIFICON this year at the same time - IF it's held, that is.

FIGHT OF THE CENTURY: It's almost time for ORIGINS, which includes DIPCON, possibly for the last time in a couple of years. The main feature of this year's DIPCON is deciding where to hold next year's DIPCON. As I see it, here are the possible locations:

- (1) San Francisco Bay Area (either PACIFICON, GAMES CAUCUS, or some new con somebody's thinking of adding)
- (2) Los Angeles (Gateway; also, GLASC may still be down there)
- (3) San Diego (PEERICON; it won't be the first time DIPCON was separated from any other event)
- (4) Sacramento (a longshot at best)
- (5) Seattle (can Tallman come through?)
- (6) Baltimore (ORIGINS 85 will be here)

I feel that the big argument will be over whether or not to ignore the DipCon charter by giving it to a location not in one of the listed areas for 1985 (the only one not in a prescribed area is Baltimore) - Baltimore is in the east, where most of the Dippers live, and it is at ORIGINS. The easterners are probably saying, "This will be the second year in a row we couldn't reach DIPCON if it's not at ORIGINS" - how about those of us out here who haven't been near DipCon since Burlingame, CA in 1981? (For those of you who are uneducated in such trivial matters, Burlingame is about 5 miles north of San Mateo, where ORIGINS was in 1981; both of these places are south of San Francisco) I think LA will get the nod for 1985. In 1986, the choice for DipCon goes to either of the coasts - I see no reason why, if DipCon is out west in 1985, it shouldn't go out east - to Baltimore or New York, for example - in 1986. (The question is, what Easterners would come out west to place a bid for 1986?)

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

To: All managers

From: Office of the President

Subject: Early Retirement Program

As a result of automation as well as a declining workload, management must, out of necessity, take steps to reduce our work force. A reduction-in-force plan has been developed which appears to be the most equitable under the circumstances.

Under this plan, older employees will be placed on early retirement, thus permitting the retention of employees who represent the future of the company.

DAWN OF MAN

No, this isn't SUBMARINE WARFARE. It also isn't FNORD. It really can't be called LOM, either. Yes, this must be THE DAWN OF MAN. But what's it for?

Here's the history as we know it.....Back in 1982, Roy Henricks (of ENVOY fame) thought up a PBM system for Avalon Hill's CIVILIZATION, which everyone and his or her brother and/or sister seems to love right along there with DIPLOMACY (well, almost). In December of 1983, the self-same Roy thought up the HENRICKS - no, actually they're called (for now) the CIVILIZATION Numbers, similar to the Boardman numbers of Dip. The numbering system is slightly different; the equivalent of the BN 1982A in the CN is A1982. The suffix "at" is affixed to a number to indicate that the extended trade rules (from THE GENERAL) are being used.

ANYWAY, what with Roy being a tax preparer (or something along that line) during the first few months of the year and a plumber (is this right?) during most of the rest, plus having to GM 40-odd games, he wants some of us other pubbers to get some of the word spread around to you CIV GMS out there, if you exist (or you're even thinking about it). But you readers know me better than that!

I know what you're thinking - "He's trying to steal the CIV numbers." Who, ME? After all, Roy thought up the system - let him deal out the numbers (and collect the \$1 donations - you DID remember that part, right?). HOWEVER, those of us with loads of free time AND an interest in Civ AND disk drives to hold all of these stats that can be recalled at a moment's notice AND just happen to sub to the two 'zines (for now) which run Civ can work out those game stats without any bother....no, no bother at all, just punch the things in and they stay on the disk, and when the game ends the entire history is displayed for printout.

Game stats....game history....just what is needed? Here's my idea:

- 1) GAME START - names and countries of all players, including any standbys, when they took over, and in which 'zine(s) and GM(s) the game ran under. Almost forgot the Civ number!
- 2) GAME IN PROGRESS - for each "country", a record of the turn number of each advance on the AST, how many cities and/or tokens (on-map) each player has after each turn (I'm not too sure which is more important), which Civ cards (and when) each player buys, and other miscellaneous details (e.g. results of Civil Wars).
- 3) GAME RESULT - who won? Was it a draw? Things like that.....

Here's an example of a game in progress:

Note that on the first table, the top numbers indicate the turn number, while the numbers alongside each nation indicate which space on the AST they had advanced to. On the second table, the top row is the turn number, and the rows for each nation indicate how many cities on the map at the end of the build period (had any cities been reduced, a * would be next to the number under the turn in which it was reduced). Turn 7's AST movement comes after the trading period, and the last report I had at this time was stopped at turn 7's trade period, so this is why there are 6 turns in one table and 7 in the other.

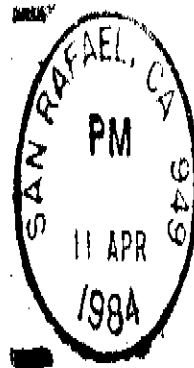
