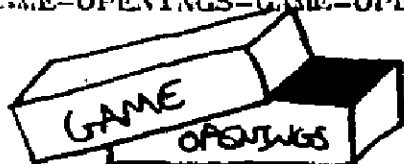

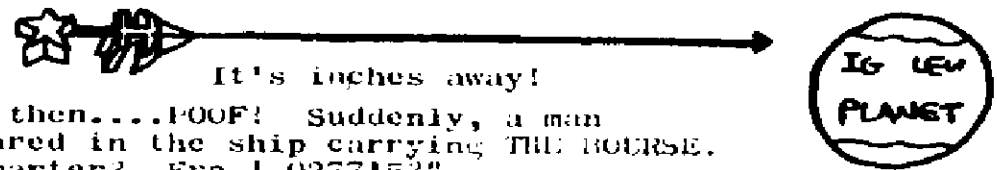
"WHAT?" could be heard from the Emperor's chambers.

"They're out of vanilla - you'll have to take strawberry."

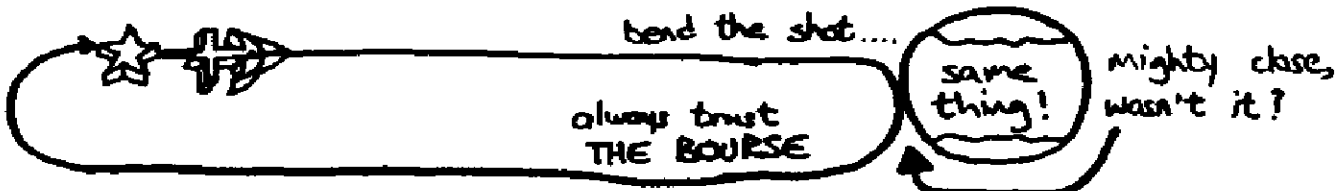
"NEVER! That McDonald's is to be ELIMINATED and replaced with a Carls Junior IMMEDIATELY!"

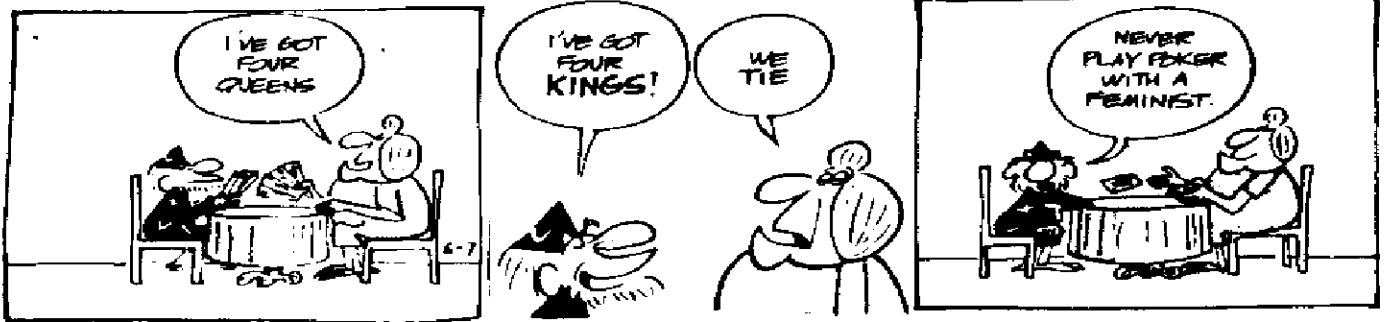

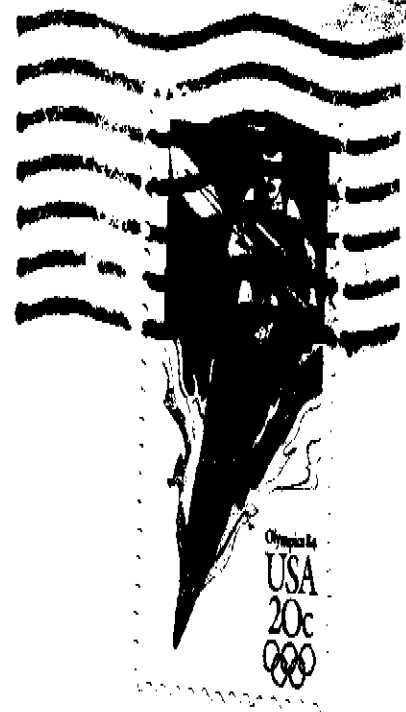
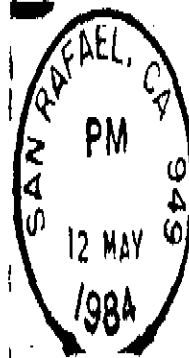
