Once again, it's time for everyone's favorite game with whatever kind of pieces it happens to come with nowadays, the varsity sport of the mouth,



Today's match, for the 1986 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP, comes to you almost LIVE from the William Randolph Hearst Greek Theater on the campus of the University of California, Berkeley....

(TWEEEET) "There's the whistle to start the game. You're playing for a 20 point bonus - here's the toss-up for 10: what actor, now dead, portrayed the first Doctor in the series The Five Doctors?" (BUZZZZ)

"DWDCA, Billenness....Richard Hurndall"

"Correct for 10 points, and here's the bonus: what is the minimum number of colors required for a Diplomacy map?"

(Some discussion) "Four? Plus the sea areas...he didn't say different colors, did he? One!"

"No, it takes two - for example, black and white on the conference map. No points there. The next bonus is worth 30 points, and here's the toss-up: Some of you

may remember that Betty Buckley went from TV's Eight Is Enough to Broadway's Cats. For 10 points, who went from London's Cats to Television's Doctor Who?

(BUZZZZZ) "DWDCA, Hopcroft....Bonnie Langford"

"Another 10 for DWDCA, and here's the 30-point bonus: has it been that long? Name the defending DIP BOWL champions, who aren't defending."

"How should we know? We're new to this DIP BOWL business."

"Close, but it was the Canadian Club of Dip."

By some STRANGE coincidence, every toss-up had to do with Doctor Who, while every bonus dealt with Diplomacy. Anyway, time was just about up, when....

"OK, with milliseconds remaining, the DWDCA leads 180 to zero....what's that noise?" (whrrrRRRRrrr whrrrrRRRRrrr whrrrRRRRrrr) "It's a TARDIPS (Time And Relative Diplomacy In Perfect Synchronization) - it's taking us back to the beginning of the show -"

(TWEEEEET) "There's the whistle to start the game - what's that noise? It's a TARDIPS - we're going forward in time...."

"With seconds remaining, the score is zero to zero. Here's the toss-up for 10: first it was John Leeder, and then Randolph Smyth - who currently runs -"

(RRRRRING) "WAKKO, Olsen....Bru-mmpfh"

Right about there, Kathy put her hand over Bob's mouth.

"CENSORED! CENSORED 'ruins' the Poll." (TWEEEEET)

"Sorry, but 'CENSORED' is not acceptable, and that's a 5-point penalty for answering wrong before the question is finished. There's the whistle to end the game....the final score is 0 for the DIPPER WHO DIPLOMACY CLUB OF AMERICA to -5 for the WHITESTONIA AND KATHY'S KORNER ORGANIZATION. DWDCA is the 1986 WORLD CHAMPION!"

Just then, the show stopped, and the GM's voice returned. "Fleet Syria, why did you resign from the hobby? Tell me or you'll NEVER KNOW!"

"Never know what?"

"Never know who it was piloting the TARDIPS...."

"Hey, get us back on! We want a rematch! We were robbed!"

"Kathy, isn't the Mets victory enough?"

Guess what? The letter column is growing....I actually have TWO letters this issue! First is from Fred Davis:

Have just recently received LOM #67. I like your new type. I can read it with my glasses on, which is greatly appreciated. I thought I'd try to answer a couple of questions you raised.

1. I believe that Elmer Hinton's call for a boycott of the Diplomacy tournament to be GM'ed by Robert Sacks at ORIGINS/ATLANTICON is based on what Robert does with the funds collected; not on what strange statements may come forth from the Hobby Meeting he always runs at one of these affairs.

Sacks always states that the proceeds from these tournaments will be distributed to hobby services and Custodians by something called the New York Games Board. As far as I've been able to determine, the NYGB consists of just Sacks and John Boardman. I don't know of anyone else still active in the postal hobby who is a member. The problem is that the funds are distributed only to those services and Custodians who happen to agree with the policies of the NYGB. Nothing is ever granted to the Miller Number Custodian, for example, because Sacks claims that neither Lee Kendter nor Fred Hyatt is, or has been, the real MNC. He refers to them as "Walker Number Custodians", while insisting that "Karel Alaric" (who he?) is the one true MNC.

To be eligible for funding, a Custodian has to sign some sort of document with the NYGB, agreeing to come under their umbrella. Some Custodians don't wish to sign any such document, because of the possibility that this might give the NYGB some authority in picking the next Custodian if and when the incumbent retires. None of the past three legal MNCs have signed such a document. I refuse, as Custodian of the North American Variant Bank, to do so. We do not want to let the camel's nose into the tent. As a result, no monies raised at the various East Coast Diplomacy tournaments has come to us. I believe he has also refused to distribute any funds to any projects run by Bruce Linsey or Larry Peery, such as the various novice packages, polls, and the resurrection of DIPLOMACY

WORLD. I'm sure a complete list of projects Sacks has, or has not, funded, would be available from him.

While I disagree with some of Hinton's ideas, he has made a good point that if the ORIGINS/ATLANTICON Diplomacy tournament is being billed as helping to raise funds for the Postal hobby, these funds should go to the entire Postal Hobby services, and not just to those services which the NYGB approves of. This has also been discussed in other 'zines, specifically in YES, VIRGINIA, THERE IS A SANTA CLAUS. A proposal has been made that perhas someone other than Sacks and the NYGB ought to run these tournaments. However, it is a great deal of work, and one thing that can be said for Sacks is that he is a hard worker.

To give Sacks his due, there may not be all that many Postal Dip players at his tournaments. There were only 35 participants in his 1986 Diplomacy tournament, for example. Most of these people were locals from New Jersey and New York. I heard one comment to the effect that only about two of the players were into the Postal hobby. If the Tournament were not billed with the implication that the profits were going into the Postal hobby per se, there would be less objection to whatever the NYGB decided to do with them afterwards.

2. I have a copy of MASTERS OF DECEIT. The individual articles are well-written. However, this novice package was produced at the height of The Feud, at a time when some people were trying to establish something called "The Alternate Hobby", which was going to detach itself from the original mainstream hobby. Accordingly, most, but not all, of the authors, were in the Alternate Hobby group.

You only have to look down the list of authors on page 2 to see that all but two, or possibly three, were engaged on one particular side of The Feud. There is a total absence of any writing by Mark Berch, Bruce Linsey, Larry Peery, Gary Coughlan, or Rod Walker, five of the hobby's most prolific writers.

There is an extremely limited list of "Useful Publications" on page 51. A limited address list is on page 52. There is NO mention of SUPERNOVA or the Runestone Poll. There is one brief mention of

DIPLOMACY WORLD, described as "this quarterly, mass circulation product", with no hint that it is the hobby's flagship 'zine. There is no mention of the North American Variant Bank. DIPLOMACY DIGEST does not exist, per this publication.

It is my opinion that any novice depending solely on MASTERS OF DECEIT for information on the Postal hobby would be getting an extremely one-sided view of how things were going in mid-1985. Accordingly, I have always recommended that any novice should read both SUPERNOVA and MASTERS OF DECEIT. The second edition of SUPERNOVA did have the courtesy to list M.O.D.

With hindsight, the situation does not look so serious. The idea for an Alternate Hobby collapsed. Many of the publishers who were promoting the Alternate Hobby have folded their 'zines and dropped out of the hobby. The Feud has ended, thank God. I only count eleven 'zines plugged in M.O.D. which are still around. (One of them being LIFE OF MONTY.) Ironically, most of the people and Custodians who were not plugged are still in the hobby. In 1986, there is only one hobby. "Time Marches On!"

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(The line above signifies that the letter is over, and my comments begin.)

There is a reason hardly any Postal Dippers show up at Sacks tournaments; most can only afford to go to one out-of-town tournament per year, and, for most of the hobbyists, this is either Marycon or Dipcon. When was the last time the NYGB hosted Dipcon? (Probably 1982, when ORIGINS was in Baltimore.) However, in the 1985 ORIGINS pre-registration form, it does say that "All proceeds (from the DIPLOMACY tournament) go to support hobby services". (It does NOT mention this in the Atlanticon 1984 form, but does in the 1981 GenCon East form, where a lot of hobbyists showed up as MaryCon had not started and ORIGINS was in California.)

As for MASTERS OF DECEIT, I seem to remember that it was originally planned by the short-lived People's Diplomacy Organization (who "ran" the original hobby auctions) as an alternative to SUPERNOVA, and that both John Boardman and Rod Walker had planned to write articles for it, despite the fact that the two were not exactly the best of friends.

And now for a letter from Bruce Linsey:

This letter is in response to your exchange with Mark Berch last issue. I can clear up the mystery of how polite was my invitation to Caruso to contribute to Once Upon A Deadline. Quoting my letter to John of 5 April:

While I've got you, why not send in an article for the new Publishers' Handbook? A lot of topics are already covered, so please check with me before actually writing. Let me hear back from you soon if you'd like to be part of this effort. Already, I have a lot of good material, but there's always room for more, especially from someone with your amount of publishing experience.

What I got back in reply was the hate-filled letter you've already seen ((**but not published**)) wherein John tells me that he won't write for the handbook as long as I have anything to do with it. But Mark is right when he says that this whole discussion is beside the point. I was not under any obligation to send John an invitation, polite or otherwise. Since you, Don, are the one who first raised the point, are you also going to mention that Olsen didn't send me an invitation to write for Masters Of Deceit? After all, I have six years worth of experience bringing novices into the hobby; it's reasonable then to expect that I'd have something useful to say to a novice, is it not?

Please don't misunderstand. Olsen was not obligated to invite me any more than he is obligated to include a plug for Supernova. It's just that by deliberately neglecting to do these things (and worse, refusing even to answer his questions about his policies at MOD), he compromises the whole point of putting out a novice handbook (that being to help novices). If he had their best interests at heart, he'd want to tell them about other useful available material. That is my reason for including a plug for MOD on the Supernova insert. I may not approve of some of the things Olsen has done, but his novice handbook is certainly useful to a newcomer and that far outweighs any personal feelings I may have about the publisher.



By the way, I can verify that MOD mentions neither Supernova nor the Runestone Poll. What's the matter, isn't Berch's word sufficient for you?

Thank you for telling me that I "know perfectly well the name of Kathy's Korner/Whitestonia". For your information, I knew nothing of the sort and my decision to count KK as a subzine was based on previous polls which had done the same. If Kathy would rather that I tabulate the votes for KK/W as a single entity ('zine), all she has to do is tell me so and I'll abide. (In fact, I've even asked her, via a politely-worded postcard, which she would prefer. To date, she hasn't replied.)

I will be perfectly blunt with you, Don: you are in the wrong to criticize me for devising a ballot consistent with previous polls when that's the best info I had to go on. I'll have none of this business about how I somehow should have known (by telepathy, we must assume) that KK was suddenly no longer a subzine. If she can't bring herself to drop me a line one way or the other, then I see no reason to entertain any after-the-fact bitching on this point. And if I'm too much a leper for Kathy to write to, she can say it in a letter to LOM where I'll see it.

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I agree that KK is a subzine; as a matter of fact, going by Kathy's and John's statements in the past two ZINE REGISTERS, they agree! The "error" is in the title of the 'zine itself, which you list as WHITESTONIA. And you didn't know about the name change? Strange - I've been calling it KATHY'S KORNER/WHITESTONIA (or the other way around) for at least a year. However, you now know better for the next poll - **or isn't my word sufficient for you?**

By the way - if you want to know the name of KK/W, why don't you ask its publisher - John Caruso? (You say that you asked Kathy.)

((NOTE: Since this letter was written, John told Bruce that KK/W is a 'zine and that KK is not a subzine. Now, if someone will tell John that his statement in the ZINE REGISTER has to be changed to say this....))

You should know me better than to think I trust everybody about everything they say. If I did, then over 300 hobbyists must have voted THE VOICE OF DOOM last in the first (and only) Undarkside Poll last year, and you must have written a "sick" letter to someone who shall remain nameless. (However, I doubt both of the latter two statements.)

Why should MASTERS OF DECEIT plug SUPERNOVA? I don't see Rex Martin plugging FIRE & MOVEMENT in THE GENERAL, even though F&M contains articles that could be of benefit to owners of games made by The Avalon Hill Game Company, producers of THE GENERAL. Welcome to the real world. (Maybe there are tiny mentions of other magazines in THE GENERAL - but, for example, only Avalon Hill products get advertising, and only articles dealing with Avalon Hill games get printed. And pardon me for calling TAHGC "Avalon Hill" twice.)

# MEETINGS # 5

This is probably the last MEETING OF MINDS for the 1986 tournament year (which, by no coincidence, is the same as the 1986 calendar year), and it is brought to you by the North American (perhaps soon to be International) Tournament Ratings service, currently chaired, organized, run, typed, and everything elsed, by Don Del Grande, 142 Eliseo Drive, Greenbrae, CA 94904-1339, USA.

There has been one tournament reported since last issue - PEERICON VI, held recently by Larry Peery in San Diego. A complete report appears in the last issue of XENOGOGIC (however, one thing does not appear - the dates of the tournament!), but I will present some of the "highlights".

This year's PEERICON hosted 22 players using the same system as DIPCON used this year (players could play a variable number of rounds, with average score per round determining the winner). Although only nine games were played, Larry Peery referred to the tournament as "the bloodiest Diplomacy tournament I've ever seen"; of the nine games played, seven ended in either a win or a 2-way draw. In addition to the blood being dripped, Larry figures that some 7000 gallons of water was flushed down his toilet that weekend.

WIN: 100 points plus number of SCs  
2-WAY DRAW: 50 points plus number of SCs  
3-WAY DRAW: 33 points plus number of SCs  
4-WAY DRAW: 25 points plus number of SCs  
5-WAY DRAW: 10 points plus number of SCs

The highest average score per game won the tournament; ties were broken by number of games played.

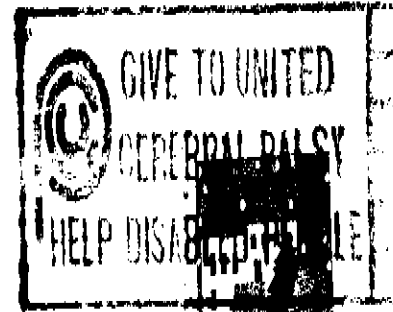
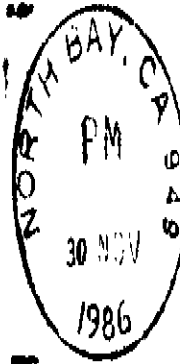
