It's time to talk about everyone's favorite subject of the moment. No, not the International Cricket Conference ban on persons who play or coach (even if they coach blacks) (OK, mister smart-guy Reverend Jesse Jackson, if we can't call black Africans black, what do we call them - "Afro-Africans"?) in South Africa. It's time to talk about the WORLD DIP CON selection process.

I agree with the current proposal to have the site selected in the same way as DIPCON - that is, the site will be selected at this year's DIPCON in San Diego, with those wanting to host WORLD DIP CON making their bids in front of the voters. I do not agree, however, with Larry Peery's suggestion of having multiple events in different parts of the country over a three-week period. There should be one con; after all, it's supposed to be "the World Championship of Diplomacy". The best place to hold it is near the Atlantic coast, near either New York or Washington, since this is in the range of a large part of the hobby, and since I believe that more visitors would come from Europe than from Australia regardless of the site.

The frontrunners seem to be DIXIECON in Chapel Hill, NC, ORIGINS in Atlanta, and ATLANTICON in Baltimore, although there could be a one-time-only Diplomacy-only event created just to host WORLD DIP CON. Perhaps MARYCON can be resurrected for one year. (The proposed Avalon Hill Championships convention has been put on the back burner.)

In Richard Walkerdine's Mad Policy, the response to the prize has all been negative, with many persons stating their intent to stay away from the MIDCON Diplomacy tournament this November. Among the complaints are of professionalism taking the fun out of the game and the posibilities of cheating, bribery, mercenaries maybe even "playing to lose for money".

I know that Pacificon has cash prizes (but not tat MIDCON's level), and tournaments at major cons (ORIGINS, for example) give away merchandise certificates, but I haven't heard any complaints. anybody have any comments on this "play-for-pay" situation? Your

THE YEAUE: A modern university hall of residence in the north east corner of the campus which was used to house Manorcon in 1985, 1987 and 1988. A bar and several common rooms will be available and both single and twin bedrooms may be booked.

THE NYMENT: For six years Manorcon has been held at Birmingham University and has grown steadily in both size and popularity. By 1987, with 250 people in attendance, it had become the biggest convention in the postal games hobby and offered more tournaments, more games and more variety than any other. In 1988 Manorcon hosted the first ever World Dip Con, attracted 330 games players and ran 20 different tournaments, and although we don't expect to be quite as big in '89 we still intend to offer more variety and more scope for games playing than any other convention.

THE MAIN EVENTS: Diplomacy remains the core of the convention and as usual two tournaments are planned. The National Team Championship, now in its seventh year, will take place on the Saturday and will involve teams of seven players drawn from zines, universities and other groupings - in 1988 we had 24 teams and this year we expect something similar. We will also host the British individual Championship on both Saturday and Sunday which, with 188 participants in 1988, is now the largest Diplomacy tournament in the hobby.

OTHER TOURNAMENTS: David Watts, the inventor of Railway Rivals, will be running a Railway Rivals tournament as well as tournaments of several of his other games. Francis Tresham, of Hartland Trefoil Games, will be running several Hartland Trefoil tournaments and there will also be tournaments organised for Acquire, American Football, Croquet, Darts, 5-a-side Soccer, Kingmaker, Speed Circuit and many other games including several not offered before.

OTHER GAMES: As well as the organised events there will of course be dozens of other games being played throughout the convention. Don't think that if you attend you will be expected to take part in a full tournament - if you just want to play a few sessions of your favourite games you'll have plenty of opportunity to do so.

HORRY SUPPORT: Gibsons Games will be supporting the event and we hope to be able to organise a Zine Shop a games stall and a contact point for players and GMs.

THE HARD SELL: With all this on offer and the promise of still more to come can you afford to miss out? Complete and send off the booking form today to ensure your place in the biggest hobby event of the year! Once you have booked you will receive regular Progress Reports giving details of timetables, extra attractions, who is coming, where to eat in Birmingham and all the last-minute changes that will inevitably occur with an event of this size. 


