Reader's Survey Results

What follows is a summary of your responses to last issue's reader survey. I got back about one for every two issues sent, for a 50% response rate. That's not too bad, so at least I know some of you actually flip through this whole thing instead of a quick turn to your games and then into the trash.

1) Do you think MP has an adequate variety of games to choose from?

An overwhelming majority of responses indicated yes. I guess this means that Diplomacy, Gunboat, the occasional variant, and a few other multi-player Avalon Hill games suits the needs of most of our readers.

2) What other games would you like to see offered here?

Most responses left this one blank or mentioned that they didn't want any in particular. A few of the other responses: Air-Sea Dip, Triplanetary, Conquistador, Source of the Nile, more Gunboat, United, Chancellorsville, Kingmaker. Of these, the only one I'd give any real chance to, except for Gunboat, would be Kingmaker. If any of you would like to play that, let me know. I think we had an offer of a guest GM a while back for it, so it might work out. As for Paul Boymel's request for Coed PBM Strip Poker, it would never work...Melinda and Nancy would be all alone versus the rest of us. Besides, I wouldn't trust any of you Dippers not to hold a few aces. There is no such thing as an "honor system" in this hobby!

3) How important are game openings to you at this point?

On the average, the readers here appear to be either totally filled up with games, or show only a mild interest in game openings.

4) What is your favorite game to play by mail?

Without question, Dip (of course), although Chess and Conquistador were also mentioned.

5) Do you find the GMing here adequate?

6) How would you compare it to other GMing you have experienced?

Most of the comments were positive in this department. A lot of "average", "pretty good", "adequate". Of course, I didn't expect anything better, as I only consider myself a pretty good GM...I make my share of mistakes, just like most other GMs.

7) What suggestions do you have to improve it?

The only responses I can remember were to change my moves legend to underline only the failed portion of a move (for example, underline only the S if the support was cut) or, as James Stanger put it, "become superhuman and never make another error."

8) What comments do you have on the layout of MP?

Opinions vary on this one. A majority of readers like the full size type and pages, and appreciate the spacing and separation I give everything. A few find this to be annoying. "You waste too much space" was mentioned two times or so. Personally, I prefer it this way. I don't mind large margins or blank spaces, as it makes things easier to read, in my opinion. At any rate, one improvement mentioned was altering the order of Dip information, placing Supply Center Charts before Press. I think I'll try that idea out this issue.

9 & 10) How important are maps, and what if I removed them?

There is always a difference of opinion on this topic, but it seems that most of our players use my small maps. I'll leave them in for that reason. Also, a few mentioned they preferred the maps to be with the respective games, unlike the "all maps on one page" idea I tried out last issue. I'll try to stay with the old format if at all possible.

11) Do you prefer one zine format over another?

Those who don't find full page the best and clearest usually used Upstart as an example of the best zine format around. I agree that Upstart is great, but I'll be leaving it as it is, based on these responses.

12-15) The Other Parts (Letters, Humor, Strategy)...

A lot of you said you read the letter column but don't write. I hope to see that change. Now that Greg Maynard's ORG took over most of the work in that department, I hope to see a lot more letters and comments flying his way. My time to think and respond to the political stuff grew short after a while, and that didn't encourage letters either. A few responses mentioned they like strategy articles and want to see more. Anyone out there with original material for me to publish should send it in...a free issue awaits any printed submission. I'd like to see some variety here. I'm thinking of starting a "country-strategy roundtable" comprised of 4 or more players with at least 5 PBM Dip games under their belts. anyone interested? Could make a good feature.

16) How would you compare the costs of MP to other zines?

Average, reasonable, or cheaper are the common answers here. I don't plan on raising the sub price any right now, and if I ever did, \$1 an issue would be the limit. I prefer to

charge gamefees for the new openings for now, until some of the older games close up. BTW, I plan to always have Dip openings...if a game is filled up, I'll open another one!

17) Do you try to avoid games that charge fees?

No or don't care came up a lot. Jim Diehl mentioned that he likes to have a high-game fee because it makes for more serious play. Perhaps I'll try that idea out once as well.

18) Would you rather see game fees or a higher sub price?

This vote was split, with a slight majority on the game fee side. With this in mind, I'll try to offer a free game every once in a while for those who prefer no game fees.

19-21) Computer and modem ownership?

Mostly no, although a few own Mac's, Atari's, IBM Clone's, or other brands. Only one or two modem owners in the lot. Get with it kids! This is the computer age!

22) What is your favorite non-Dip related hobby?

This obviously varies greatly. A few answers: Stven Carlberg enjoys music, Jim Diehl is a Chess nut. A few said other wargaming. Jim Stanger likes to throw himself off of roofs. What a guy!

23) How would you rate yourself as a Dip player?

Most readers said between 5 and 7. Nancy Behrendt likens herself to a 2. Bernie Oaklyn finds himself more of a 10.

24) Use three words or less to describe yourself.

Jim Diehl: Reliable, Rememberer, and Retributive.

Nancy Behrendt: Emotional and Practical.

Ernest Hakey: Intelligent, Bearded, Overweight.
