June 4, 12:00 noon.

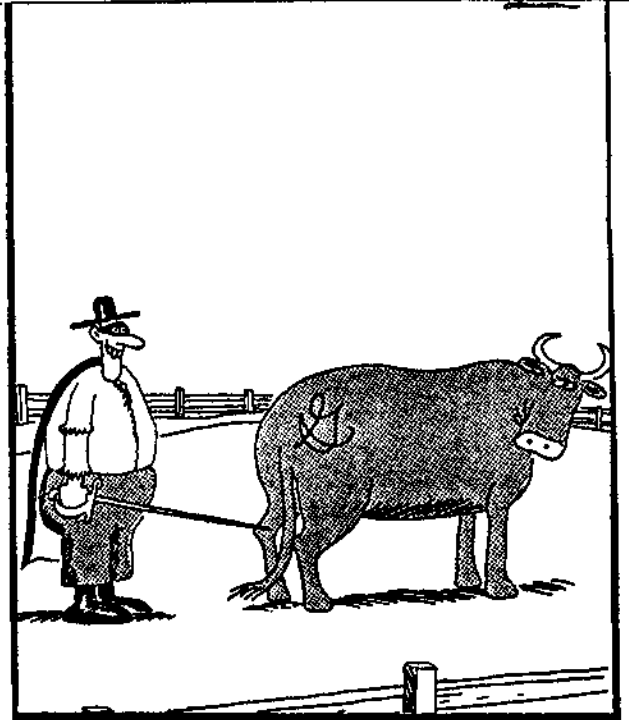
