Diplomacy Houserules

- 1) Standard abbreviations will be used, with the following clarifications: Norwegian Sea=Nwg, North Sea=Nth, Norway=Nwy, North Atlantic Ocean=NAAt, North Africa=NAf, Liverpool=Lvp, Livonia=Lva, Tyrolia=Tyr, Tyrrhenian Sea=Tyn.
- 2) GM errors not reported by the following deadline will stand.
- 3) Standard season setup will be Summer/Fall and autumn/Winter/spring.
- 4) Seasons separated on request of two or more players.
- 5) Conditional orders allowed for separation of seasons, builds, retreats, standby, GM error, and the like.
- 6) NMR retreats are OTB. NMR removals by GM decision, usually out of nation non-supply center, followed by in home country non-supply, out of country sully centers, and finally in country supply centers. Alphabetical order from there.
- 7) Standby's are called after one NMR usually. If the original player doesn't submit orders for the next season, the stand-by's orders are used and he becomes the player of record.
- 8) Any draw proposal is valid, but must be unanimous. NVR=yes.
- 9) Non-white press will only be permitted in games where it is specified.
- 10) If a situation comes up that is not listed here, I will make the final decision.
- 11) These rules subject to change as needed.

I've now played Turkey four times. Although I've been wiped out in two games, it hasn't come any sooner than 1907, where as with a country like Austria, I'd probably be gone by 1904.

Some might argue that the interior countries live shorter but more exciting lives. All the Turkeys I've played have been more than exciting for me! I figure as my skill increases, I'll start to play the interior countries. Already, a GM has just signed me up as Germany (blech!). Apparently he doesn't touch preference lists, as I told him I preferred game openings decided as such. When (or if) I ever win with a country (dream on!) that particular country will drop to the bottom of the list, until I have a win with each country (wake up and smell the coffee!), when the list will start anew. Obviously this policy will keep me playing Turkey and England for decades to come!

THE REPORTER

This subzine is or will be mostly devoted reporting the pbm play of Avalon Hill's game War and Peace. Six players are necessary for the play of the game. I have four signed up (Jensen, Bryant, Maynard and Kent) and need two more. So, anybody reading this who wants to give it a try, please send your name, address and nation preference to: PAUL D. First off, let me apologize for THE REPORTER not being in last month's issue of Maniac's Paradise. It seems the Post Office took an awfully long time delivering it to Doug (five days to be exact). Rather than reprint all of last month's ish, I'll just throw in the more important stuff.

If you have any other ideas for pbm games to be included in this zine drop me a line. I'll get with Doug and see if we can't work something out. Also, if you're looking for that elusive game or game part drop me a line letting me know what you're looking for and I'll put your request in here also.

You may not have noticed, but this issue has a new banner. You'll probably be seeing a different one each month or so. I use a 386-33 computer to produce this. It has the Windows 3.0 environment and I use Word for Windows to write it. I use Designer by Micrografax to create the banner and then "cut and paste" it to the top of the document. I've just started using Designer recently and I have to say it is really great. It allows somebody like me, who's artistic qualities are not something I like to talk about, to create some really fantastic work. Anybody else out there have an opportunity to work with Windows and/or Designer?

As I write this, I see the Mideast/Persian Gulf problem is still with us. I'd like to point out three things I see happening there that remind me of other military situations. Two of the items are reminiscent of World War 1. One, you have two large forces of men occupying a narrow front. Two, with all the mobilization by both the US and the Iraqis, I feel we are moving into a situation of "use them or lose them." In other words, it is not possible to keep such a large force of men and arms at an increased level of readiness before there appears a certain amount of degradation of morale and combat ability. The third item is the possibility of the Iraqi soldier facing battle with the same attitude that many Japanese soldiers of World War 2 had. In short, it is better to die for the country than to be captured. And, if you don't know what that means vis a vis an American attack, I suggest you read about the battles of Iwo Jima and Okinawa where the Japanese definitely did decide to die for the Emperor than live, to them, in shame. It could make for some very large body counts. Anyway, let's hope for a peaceful settlement.

Getting back to War and Peace, here are some questions (along with the answers) that have been asked concerning the game I will be gm'ing:

Given the example of forced marching, it would appear that a player may decide which units will continue moving after the die roll is made. Will you allow for contingency orders reflecting this?

(Definitely! For good or bad contingency orders are going to be necessary in this game considering its relative complexity.)

Under what conditions can an already established entrenchment be maintained (ie: if one of the building strength points remains, may the other two or more strength point that began in the hex move away, either being replaced with other moving units or not being replaced?)

(No. Once the force that built the entrenchment moves out, either in whole or in part, the entrenchment marker is removed; see rule T.3 in the rulebook.)

Must an at sea fleet move to a transport (say, in a port) that is embarking a land unit in order to escort said transport, then attempt to move on to the land units destination, or may the transport meet the at sea escort in the adjacent sea hex without fear of interception?

(The transport will be vulnerable to interception if it attempts to "link-up" with its escort fleet.)

To what degree will the players know the composition, quality, quantity and location of the other nations' forces?

(This is embarrassing! I had planned to include Sighting rules to the House Rules published in last months issue.)

WAR & PEACE RULES ADDENDUM

SIGHTING

This game will operate on limited intelligence simulating, hopefully, a certain amount of the fog of war. Consequently, players will have a limited knowledge of other player's units, their composition and their location.

When a force is led by a leader, only the leader's name and location will be announced.

After combat, all forces involved will be made known to all players rather than to just those players involved in the combat. (It would just be too time consuming and difficult to keep information from other players.)

Ships leaving port will be announced to all players but their future locations will not be known unless they travel a coastline adjacent to another players units. Transport's cargo will not be revealed.

The gm may, at times, reveal information to the players in the way of "Rumors of War" headlines; these "rumors" may be old news, new news, exaggerations or just plain false; hence, the phrase "rumors."

That's it for this month. I really hope we can get this game going next month! So, c'mon, take a chance!
