Make sure that you get your initial Influence Point allocations, as well as all ordres for the first turn, in to me by the deadline, which just happens to be September 5, 1989. Also, indicate on your moves whether I can call you (possibly collect) if you fail to vote for something. Letting me call you will help expedite the game. If I can't call, then expect the game to pause periodically for voting. 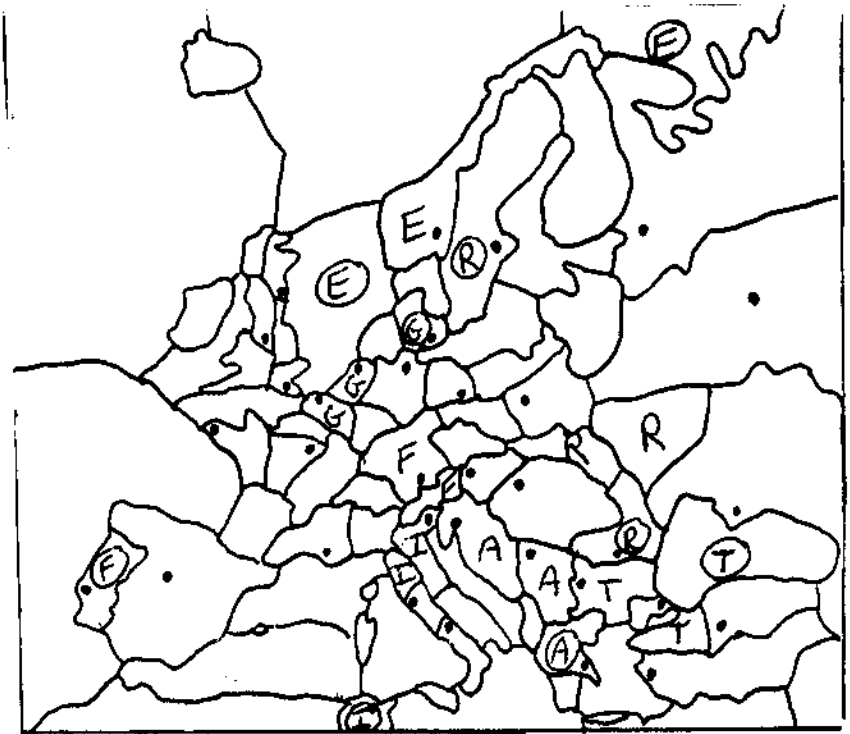
