REVISION TO THE HOUSE RULES

Just a minor correction here. Under Section I (Orders), Part O, substitute "a player not involved in the game whom the judge selects" for "the judge or gamemaster" in the second sentence. Second revision: Under Section I (Orders), Part D, add this to the end. "The judge may, if he finds it plausible, ask a replacement to submit moves for a player who has missed moves or for all players, and his moves are used in case one misses. In all cases except those where the judge has been told that the player missing moves would rather not take part or continue in the game, the substitute does not take over for that country. In cases where the player has expressed this desire, the substitute player takes over." Third Revision (kind of grows on ya after a while); "This judge takes it upon nimself to inform players when they have missed a move or made an illegal move, and if possible, give them a chance to make corrections. IN such cases, the procedure will be: @M will make a person-toperson call to the player in question. The player will say he is not home. Then the player will call the GM station-tostation. When you hear "person-to-person from Greene, N.Y." you're not home. As an added precaution, I will call COLL LOT." so, that's the code. This should be added to Section I, and given the Part letter E.

All players who would like their phone numbers printed should send them in and I will print them. This will not only make it easier to make last minute changes, but it will take a lot of effort out of my calling COLLEGT if I should have to.
