### PRESS RELEASES

VIENNA (WHY?) Emperor Franz Joseph today stated that no matter what the cost, Austria would continue in the war. "The recent difficulties we have experienced in achieving our goals have only firmed the Austrian people's resolve to emerge victorious. We will fight to the last man, if necessary, to make the world safe for autocracy."

TRIESTE (JACK ANDERSON) Reliable sources here say that the recent reverses suffered in the field by Austrian forces were caused when the entire officer corps went en masse to Vienna to have their pictures taken for the annual military yearbook, leaving the troops and sailors on the front to fend for themselves. As Austrian front line soldiers receive, on the average, three hours of training before assignment, this proved disastrous.

VIENNA (JACK ARMSTRONG) The director of public information today denied reports of mass abandonment of the front by the officer corps. The government's chief press officer, Count Downanoutt, stated that even if such a report were true, steps would have been already taken to make sure such things did not happen again. After the completion of the foreign office yearbook a few days ago, he reassured the press that negotiations for alliance would be made with all powers in Europe interested in making the world safe for autocracy.

Constantinople: The Turkish Sultan today delivered his annual military address. In commenting upon his nation's recent gains in the Balkans, he stated "Aside from the use of good strategy, and the courage of the Turkish troops, I am at a loss to explain the deterioration of Austria's resistance." Although he credits the victories to good strategy, doubtless he must realize that the officer's yearbook has taken much effort - the entire Austrian army must be working on it to account for the general sloppiness of their campaign. Or could it have been that big officer's party in Vienna last week...?
