(VIENNA) (HELP) * Count Oftennandoutt, managing director
 of the Austrian Yearbook Company, today announced that, as the
 debts of the government to his company had been paid, he was
 returning Austria back to its government. The Count made this
 announcement as he prepared to board the boat train for the

ocean liner Europa, bound for New York; upon being informed that the Austrian Government no longer seemed to exist, he said "that's their problem."

(VIENNA) (ROUTERS) - The citizens of the city seem to be holding up rather well under the strain of the fall of Budapest and the siege of the city. While hope for deliverance is still strong, the slogan 'Let the Germans come first' has appeared on many walls of the city. Also, the two top songs on this week's hit parade are 'Deutschland uber Alles' and "Wacht am Rhen."

(TRIESTE) (ABM) - Lieutenant (jg) Hans Brinsman, apparently the senior surviving officer of the combined military and naval forces based in this city today announced a campaign in Italy. According to the lieutenant, 'Austria, by reconquering its former Italian provinces, will build the strength it needs to reconquer our two great capitals, Vienna and Budapest. In any case, both the army and the fleet have resolved to go down fighting to the last man, if they must.'

RUSSIA MAKES PEACE WITH ENGLAND

Premier Hagelshawski has announced that the Russian Empire is formally withdrawing its declaration of war against England. Shortly after this announcement the former ambassador to England, Andry Vaschinov, left for Edinburgh to meet with the king. The Premier wishes to make it clear that his new stand toward England does not change the Russian attitude toward the French, with whom he wishes to remain friends. It simply means he will no longer insult the English.

On a more somber note the Premier has said that Russian relations with Germany have become very strained of late. He has formally warned the Germans to stay out of Poland. "Even I try to do that whenever possible." said the Premier. If asked whether an increase of belligerent tendencies on the part of Germany might cause retaliatory measures leading to a commencement of hostilities, the Premier said, "No, but if they don't mind their own business we might get mad and start a war."

(PARIS) - King Overstarved the Orpulent made his state of the Continent address today to the European family and the world. He pointed out that France, as the leading military power in the world, must make the first moves toward world peace. An examination of the current situation shows the French, Germans, and Italians showing a united front against Turkey through support of Austria, Russia allied with England and France, though England is being stabbed by Austria showing Turkish support of Turkey through

an attack on Italy which is attacking Turkey directly, despite the fact that Turkey recently stabbed Austria; France showing signs of possible stabs with A Bel and F Wes, Germany openly taking on forces twice her size, and England still hanging on despite all attempts to put her away. In fact, the situation is very clear. All that is necessary to bring peace to the world is a glivninf arnil magiryl pinwug. The King was given a standing ovation by the Parlement and the spectators present.

GM Steve Marsland here. A very confused situation has arisen here. Through using the wrong orders (a few days earlier than the latest, and therefore the valid, ones) Andrew Phillips' Fall 1901 move was listed as F ~~Den~~ Den-Swe, when it actually should be F Den-, or F Den Holds. THIS means that Russian F GoB should actually be in Sweden, which gives Russia another build. Since Russia was going to make this build with the knowledge of everyone else's build, this would be unfair to the other players. Therefore, I feel all builds should be submitted again.

Many players objected to Kincade's substitute build for ~~Kincade~~ Falconer as well. This appears to reward a player for missing moves when he should be penalized. Farther, a substitute player has little or no knowledge of the diplomatic situation, and his substitute move may mess up a diplomatic ploy of the player who missed his moves. Therefore, the substitute build for Falconer is not valid. This is another reason why I would like Winter builds over again. From now on, substitute players will take over a country after the first missed move if the original player is missing his moves for the second time. Dave Kincade, please submit substitute moves and builds for all countries. If Falconer misses this build, Kincade's build will be used (since this will make the second time Falconer has missed) and Kincade will take over Italy in 1972 Q.
