Vienna (June 26) - It was announced today by the Austrian General Staff, that the following new provinces have been added to the List of Provinces Within The Austrian Sphere of Influence: ROMANIA, WARSAW, UKRAINE, MOSCOW, and LIVONIA.

Vienna (JUNE 28)- Government sources here indicated that no final decision had been reached as to a possible course of

action concerning the Italian Army presently situated in the Austrian province of Tyrolia. It had been rumored that German Army units would be called upon to aid in the expulsion of the Italian Army.

Athens (June 28) - Rumors have been flying here over the idea that Austrian units would pull out and be replaced by Italian units. The Austrian Embassy had no comment.

Budapest (June 28) - The Austrian Telecommunications Company announced today that telegram, telephone, and flying pidgeon service between the cities of Vienna and Budapest, to Moscow, Sevastopol, and St. Petersburg, had been suspended for an indefinite period of time. A spokesman at the Ministry of Mails indicated that mail would continue to flow between Vienna and St Petersburg but that there would be "delays".

Vienna (June 28) - The Viennese Government appealed today to all Governments who "have a conscience" to aid and support the cause of Nationalism, and to "censure" the Government of Russia in its "gross and violent violation of the integrity of Austro-Hungarian borders in its despicable invasion of the Austrian province of Galicia". The Austrian Government also accused the Russian leadership of "revisionism."

(VIENNA) (PDQ) - Claptrap von Metronone, chief minister to His Imperial Majesty, Franz Joseph, Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary, today addressed the nobles of the realm on foreign affairs. Pointing out that the highest cultural levels have been reached by the nations with the most stable governments, such as Germany, Turkey, and Austria, which has been under the same ruler for 53 years, von Metronone stated that Austria-Hungary wished to see stable government brought to all of Europe. He then commented on the alarming developments in Serbia, where he said "signs of that most horrible and unstable form of government - a two party democracy - are

FORMING." He said therefore to protect the interests of the Serbian people, Austria was establishing an immediate protectorate over Serbia. He said that Austria-Hungary would show its benevolent intentions toward Serbia by annexing Albania to its territory and giving Serbia its long-sought access to the sea. He concluded by expressing the hope that other great powers would understand and support Austria-Hungary's attempt to stabilize the European situation.

(Rome) 3/13/01 - President Edward M. Charvoz-Aristo today proposed the nation's first knife control law. If enacted, the law will ban the sale of knives to felons and minors, register all knives except kitchen knives and prohibit citizen ownership of handknives.

(Rome) 3/14/01 - Reaction to President Charvoz-Aristo's proposed knife control bill was sharp today. The Italian Knife Association condemned the proposal and accused the President with "denying law-abiding citizens the right to protection from criminals, Communists and subversives." SHARP, Citizens for Safe Homes and Reasonable Protection also attacked the proposal. Sen. William F. Right speared the President by saying "Knives do not kill, people do." Supporters of the proposal cut the opponents with attacks on Sen. Spiro Nero who was accused of "fiddling while Rome was speared." Mayor John V. Personality glaced conservatives with an emotional defense of the proposal by saying "Let us not fail to protect the people. Let us end the knife killings. Italy deserves the best - vote yeah!"

Camelot Hill - 3/15/01 - President Edward M. Charvoz-Aristo was wounded today. A man stabbed him as he shook hands with the people of this village at the foot of the Alps. The wound was not believed to be of a serious nature.

(Hickory) - 3/16/01 - President Charvoz-Aristo's condition improved today. His wound in the back was described by a hospital spokesman as a "five inch gash in the area of the sacro-illiac that would heal in about ten days."
