(VIENNA)- (WOW)- Prime Minister and acting regent Kink von Winston-Salon
 today announced the beginning of a campaign to reconquer Hungary from
 the Russian forces now holding it. Winston-Salon stated "All the
 great powers have come to the conclusion that the threat of the
 Hagelshawsky government to the rest of law-abiding Europe must be ended.
 Austria-Hungary will be the forefront of this great crusade, from
 today, when we begin to drive the Soviets from what is rightfully ours
 territory to the day that the Russian capital is firmly in the hands
 of our alliance. We will fight in Hungary, we shall ~~never surrender~~
 fight wherever the Russian bear may choose to show his colors; we
 shall never surrender. Austrian troop strength may be low now, but
 after Russia is crushed, it will be said that never in the field of
 human endeavor was so much owed by so many to so few.

Inference to Comrade Bogolshovsky, Winston-Salem said that as soon as he and his Communist cohorts were captured they would be placed on trial for their crimes in occupied territories. (Berlin) (October 31) The Kaiser has retired to the ~~BERLIN~~ Berlin Schluss, or palace. He is reported to have said " I will not come out until the German navy can again freely sail the ocean." It is rumored that the High Seas Fleet will be leaving for the high seas shortly.

(Moscow: to Austria and Turkey) Now That wasn't nice!

(Rome):(DPI)- Diplomacy Press International reports that President Edward II. Charvoz-Aristo has won reelection with 64% of the vote. He defeated Renaldo Regano who finished with 32%. Two fringe candidates, Leonardo Maddoxo and B. Ella Abozzi split the remaining 4%.

Mounting pressure had forced the president to call for the special election. Opponents of President ~~CHARVOZ-ARISTO~~ Charvoz-Aristo demanded that an election be held because of health problems which have plagued him since last spring's ~~XXXX~~ attempted assassination by a Tunisian revolutionary.

((Rome))-~~(YIIYII)~~ ~~XXXXXXXX~~ The Austrian Government began closing down its consulates and non-essential diplomatic missions in Italy today. However, the embassy in Rome is still being staffed by some of Austria's most important diplomats as a solution is still being

sought to the current dispute. While most consulates have been already closed, and the rest have been preparing to shut down, the consulate in Venice, which was formerly Austrian territory, remains fully staffed. No Explanation was offered for this.

(Venice)-The eagerly anticipated Senatorial race between Ricardo Cavetti and Giovanni Carso was won by Carso, the incumbent. Independent candidate Seebee Esco M. Ovie finished a surprizing second. Ovie was a replacement for Miguel Da Griffo who was ~~assassinated~~ ~~assassinated~~ assassinated while swimming in the canals.

Post-election analysis showed that ~~Mr.~~ Mr. Ovie cut deeper into Mr. Cavetti's vote than into Senator Carso's solid plurality. Final tallies showed Carso with 42%, Ovie with about 30% and Cavetti with a disappointing 28%.

(VIENNA)--(GOP) Prime Minister Claptrap von Metronone held his annual news conferece today. Here is the transcript of today's session.

Q.1 (Adolf Seicklgraber, Official News Agency): How do you assess the current foreign situation?

A.: In general, the situation is very cloudy. While the situation in the Balkans appears stablised from our viewpoint, great danger is present in the West where Italian intations are uncertain. While we must admit we did not approve of Italian unification, we have accepted the fact and we have no hostile intentions toward the Italian people. There fore, the incursion into Tyrolia has shocked us, and the reasons for that move seen mysterious from our viewpoint. It is still our fervent hope, however, that a peaceful solution to the dispute can be found, and Austria will leave no stone unturned in the search for that solution. Let all the powers of Europe remember, though, that Austria will never hesitate to fight for what is right-fully hers.

FRANCE DECLARES WAR ON GERMANY

(Paris - Feb. 1, 1902) President Pompos Doc of France asked the French Assembly today for a declaration of war on Germany. The President claimed that an arms race was developing between France and Germany, and that in such a race, France is bound to lose. "Germany is inherently dangerous to the national security of France" shouted Pompos Doc, as he urged his countrymen to be Franc about the situation and support the war effort. The Assembly acclaimed the President's speech and overwhelmingly passed the declaration.
(Paris-Mar. 29, 1902) There is growing concern in the capital tonight over the non-acknowledgement of three Paris-Rome dispatches during the Spring. It may be that the dispatches never reached Rome, through fault of mail (in which case this release notifies Italy of this fact). However, the French Office of Foreign Affairs believes that the dispatches did reach Rome. An official spokesman said that although the incident would not cause even the consideration of the break-off of diplomatic relations, nevertheless, relations have become 'communicationally strained'.
(Lisbon, Portugal-May 1, 1902) Anticipating a French naval invasion, a band of Portuguese natives, calling themselves the Portuguese Guerrilla Army, have been seen setting up shoreline defenses to meet the attack. The group however is poorly equipped and poorly financed, and is not expected to hold off the powerful French First Fleet in any way. So poor is the PGA that it has its headquarters on a golf course.
(Lisbon-May 8, 1902) The capital of Portugal fell to the French Fleet will probably stay until the winter to ensure the 'keeping of the peace'.

NEWS (cont.)

(Rome) August 4: Italian vessels have continued to disappear in the Mediterranean, despite the fact that the nest of Tunisian pirates no longer exists. The Expeditionary Force now in Tunis is being sent to the North African Coast, in the hopes of uncovering another such nest. The fact that only French ships, and ships going to France, remain untouched does seem a little strange. The Piedmont is also suspect, and this possibility is also being investigated.

(Rome) August 6: The French ambassador to the Italian government has not been heard from for four weeks. He seems to have "disappeared" on a hunting expedition. The reason he was hunting giant squid in the Navy Yard in Naples is still unknown. It is reported that the raft upon which he was diving drifted out into the Tyrrhenian. All efforts are being made to find the raft--the Italian Navy is now searching the entire area.

(Rome) August 8: The raft believed to have been occupied by the French Ambassador was located today. Found on board was a camera containing pictures of naval installations throughout the Naples area. A full explanation and apology has been demanded of the French government.

(Tunis) August 16: The arrival of a report from the Expeditionary Force caused quite a stir today. The pirates have been identified as French ships on detached service from the fleet now located on the southern coast of Spain.

(Rome) Sept. 2: Today it was announced that "all treaties existing, or once having existed, between the nations of Italy and France are hereby waived. Italy will occupy that portion of the Mediterranean necessary for the safety of Italy, and if necessary occupy the coasts where privateers and pirates are preying upon Italian shipping."

Vienna--(Aug): It was announced here today that the entire state of Russia, including ST. PETERSBURG, LIVONIA, MOSCOW, WARSAW, UKRAINE, RUMANIA, and SEVASTOPOL, would be hereinafter be considered under the jurisdiction of the state of Austria-Hungary.
