(Paris) (Dec. 7) - The campaigns for the French Presidency began in
 earnest here today as Pres. Pompos Deo, in a speech to the nation,
 announced his candidacy for the nomination of the Conservative Party.
 Also, within the week, Maurice de Gaullebladder announced that he

would seek the Liberal Party's nomination. The most shocking news of the week however, was George Floorace's switch from the Conservative to the Liberal Party, and his subsequent entrance into the race for the Party's nomination. Thus, the stage is set for next Winter's election.

(Vienna) (March 12th) - In reaction to the virulent and dogmatic French press the Viennese capital remains calm. In explanation, Viennese officials have suggested that in order for France to mobilize and carry out a serious threat to the Austrian State France will have to use all her available units in a prolonged conflict far from her home centers. Furthermore, as a consequence, France would have to decide to leave her entire homeland defenseless. These same Austrian officials suggested that perhaps France should think twice before committing herself to a "laborious" war, in the east, especially as England is day-by-day growing more powerful. Besides, said one source, the Austrian Government has a no ~~is~~ "bone to pick" with France.

((South Pole)) - Naples Daily News - The Italian scientific expedition led by William Penn Guinno, I.C. Hickie, N. Arduosci and Seymour Results is threatened by a severe cold wave. Notebooks are stiff and food grains are useless according to chef Oatis Meal, a Quaker doing nonmilitary service. Sen. Burr E. Coldwater, a government spokesman, said, "This is a page rice freeze. I hope help arrives soon."

((South Pole)) - NDN - Heroic, taxing efforts by the Italian Rescue System have saved the scientists. The IRS team financed by William Bardovavoni, a blind Venetian merchant and supporter of expeditions, was led by Capt. Crunch "Merry Mac" Marconi and civilian Ward Monitorri. Although the team beat the "deadline", the problems encountered by the mission will be ammunition for liberals in their attempt to cut spending for the development of a "water shuttle", a reusable transport necessary for future trips to the polar regions.

((Stockholm)) - Rome House and Finance Bulletin- The winners of the Not-will awards were recently announced. The War Prize was awarded to Italy for its "attack on Austria-Hungary". Runner-up Germany received the Piece Prize for its "captures of land in Northern and Western Europe." The Science award was shared by researcher Neverro Harry Reditti for his work on "environment and human intelligence" and William Penn Guinno for work and observations on glacial quakes. The Literature Prize went to Sincerro Hemmingwieux for "The Young Man and the C", a biography of ~~Rxxxxx~~ Pierre Sal Palleux who discovered the "Greek" vitamins, A, G and C, and who aided Brazil during recent protein shortages.
