Hence, offers of support are being accepted readily from unnamed members of this alliance against others in it for restoration of Greater Germany. (Paris) - With the campaigns for the French Presidency already three months underway, the apparent burning issue of the contest is the war in Central Europe. Speaking in Versailles, Maurice de Gaullebladder has called the war "a totally unjustified and purely aggressive one". "If elected", said de Gaullebladder, "I pledge to halt the senseless invasion of Austria on inaugural day".

On the other hand, Pres. Pompeus Deo has claimed popular support of the war. Speaking in Paris, the President unleashed a vehement verbal attack upon Austria: "...For their (Austria's) repressive subjugation of the Italians and the Russians, and particularly for their obdurate containment and consequential starvation of the Turks, we shall summon them to justice, so help us, God!"

Finally, George Floorace, being interviewed by Fetch de Stick, anchor man on the Columbia Eye System's radio program, 'Tell the Nation', called the war "justifiable, but not irrevocable". He suggested that if Austria retract statements of its Fall 1902 press concerning France, and withdraw all of its troops from Italy, the war could be halted.

(Tuscany)- President Edward M. Charvoz-Aristo here on a political trip was assassinated today. Tuscany Governor Giovanni Conelli was injured during the attack on the President. Lindley Johnsonni of Tuscany was sworn in as the new President.

(Rome)- Political analyst Enrico Clarified praised the slain President today. Clarified recalled the "brilliant handling of the Mal-tan Milk Crisis."
