One of the players notes that a stalemate position may be formed. This game may end in a draw by unanimous consent, but someone has to propose a draw vote in order for that to be possible. Both Winter and Spring 1911 moves are due next time.

Constantinople - The Sultan today expressed his hopes for a new era of world stability. Examining the current military situation in Central Europe, he was observed to smile as he stated that "Peace with honor may come within our immediate future." He believes that peace will at last bring "domestic tranquility," as the great military expenditures of recent years are ended. He further noted that rapprochement may bring in its wake resumption of the coal shipments from Newcastle, the absence of which has forced the Turkish people to do without many of the conveniences to which they are accustomed. On a final domestic note, he suggested that the police practises which received widespread criticism are vindicated by the improvement of areas within which the solutions could have been compromised, and that The Jawada Papers' suppression is now clearly shown to have been a patriotically justifiable if somewhat rash action. At the conclusion of the speech, the Sultan exultantly raised his scimitar high above his head.
