ROME (UPI): The Italian Government announced today that it had finally settled  
 the Armed Forces Strike. All military units have agreed to return to their missions  
 and to give up picketing. The Italian Government did not give in to all the

SOBIA (UPI): Despite threats of an Austrian invasion, spirits remained high here  
 in the capitol. The government stepped-up recruiting of a Bulgarian army, which,

they and the ever faithful Lenin. The Russian Revolution was successful. The Czar and the old Bourgeois life style are gone forever. Power is in the hands of the people, under the benevolent and protective leadership of the Premier, Comrade Hagelshawski.

#### RUSSIA DECLARES WAR ON AUSTRIA

MOSCOW: Intelligence has reported that the Austrian Emperor was seen shooting peasants for sport in the forest behind his estate. Comrade Hagelshawski had been discussing terms of co-operation with the Austrians, however he said that this "typical example of petty bourgeois imperialistic indulgence" could not be ignored. He added that the Austrians were nothing more than "Mongoloid belligerents; not fit for existence in the world community," and promptly declared war. When asked for his reaction regarding the Austrian Emperor's decision to return a case of Vodka unopened, Comrade Hagelshawski replied, "The Emperor has the good taste of a New Orleans ~~Champ~~."

VIENNA, May 1 (SID) The Archduke Mayerling, heir to the Austrian throne, killed himself today in Vienna.

Mayerling's body was found outside the offices of the Vienna Turf Accounting Co. An illegible ticket was clutched in his hand. While no details were available on the motive for the action from the government, it was known that the Archduke was both a heavy gambler and a private pessimist about Austria-Hungary's chances in the war against Turkey.

WASSER-ON-DER-KNEE, May 20 (A&P): In an exclusive interview with our correspondent, Emperor Franz Josef of the Austro-Hungarian empire outlined the role of his nation in the present international crises.

On the veranda of his favorite resort, the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary looked and sounded better than he has in years. In fact, one could almost say he was a new Emperor. Still in grief over the tragic death of his son three weeks ago, he viewed the fact that there was no heir to his throne calmly saying 'I just won't die'.

remarking on the progress of the war against Turkey, the Emperor stated that the lack of opposition in Greece and Serbia was a pleasant surprise to him and just more indication of the docility (sic) of the Austrian people's greatest enemy. He made clear that Austria would not be satisfied until these infidels were driven off the continent. On the subject of relations with Russia, Franz Josef said that Austria had come into an accord with the new government and hoped to work together with it in the future. One agreement has already been made -- ~~only Russian vodka will be sold throughout the Austrian realm.~~

Relations with France are strained according to the Emperor. While he sees the recent declaration of war as a serious development, he says he will 'neither break off relations nor declare war'. All French restaurants in the country have been closed, however. (In a related development, the head of the French Republic's government is still, M. M.L. Compadre stated France's unending love for the Austrian people. Before he could continue, guards returned him to his headquarters in the Imperial Palace's dungeon.) Close friendship with Germany and Italy will continue, like 'one big happy family'.
