The Emperor announced that Austria now considered herself allied with all nations under the threat of the revolutionary hordes and that he would accept aid from any nation if it would help defeat Russia. "Europe is at a crossroads. The new developments in Russia have made clear that the democratic tide must be stopped here; if not, it will never be stopped. This is not a war against the Russian people, only those leaders who have misguided them. We do not seek victory, only justice. The world must be made safe for autocracy."

#### PRESS:

**TALL HALAF (TPN)** The Turkish govt. has clamped a veil of secrecy over the excavations taking place just outside the city. The excavation is said to have been a post used by the Parthian army just before the battle of Carrhae. No word has gotten out as to the nature of the top secret discovery; the Turkish head of weapons development section was seen leaving for the area of the camp.

**CONSTANTINOPLE (TPN)**: The Turkish government today announced that Turkey will be glad to make peace with Austria-Hungary anytime that the Austrians meet Turkey's modest demands. The generous treaty would allow the Austrians to keep Albania, Bohemia, Galacia, and Tyrolia. The only thing that might bother the Austrians is the necessity of occupying Budapest, Vienna, and Trieste with peace-keeping forces. No comment was available from the Austrian Emperor. Let us hope he sees the folly of his ways, and accepts.

**VIENNA, December 25 (DADA)**: Emperor Franz Josef, head of the Austro-Hungarian Empire today issued his annual Christmas message, to his people. In it, he proclaimed the great victory over revolutionary forces in the provinces of Galacia was but a harbinger of what was to come in the next year for the party that dared put the good Czar Nicholas off the throne. Nothing that forces of England and Germany have also successfully engaged the hordes of democrats rushing over Europe. "The Anglo-Saxon states, England, Germany, and our own Empire, have taken up the Gauntlet of Russian revolutionary aggression," according to the greatest of all European monarchs, Franz Joseph von Hapsburg. "Let us hope that after a final end has been put to the dogwar running Russia that this loose confederation can become a true alliance."

In reference to the dispute against the Ottoman Empire, the Emperor issued a

will for peace, saying that Austria is the victim of an autocratic state, and appealed for it to switch sides and join the fight against General Engelhardt's government. He welcomed the peace offer of France as a genuine act of Christian charity, and announced there would be peace now between the two states. To emphasize the point, he issued the statement while dining on Frog's legs at the reopening of "Austria's here in Gay Vienna."

In closing, the Emperor said: "There is no way the tide of that Austria is leading can be stopped, with the glorious Ottoman Empire's decision to switch sides, our coming victory will be made a quick certainty. This will be the final step in the commencement of the program that will lead to Austria's goal—the making of ~~the~~ Europe and the rest of the world—a place safe for autocracy!!!"

All this rock...I'll try to remember all the people who've asked me to plug their zines (and some who haven't).

Len Zakorka has started a zine for novice players (i.e., those who haven't entered a postal game prior to Sept. 1, 1970). Games are open -- fee is \$3 minus \$.50 each for MFFFCB and/or IFW. ~~ISSUE~~ Members. Len is President of IFW and a long-time GM and player. The zine is NEOPHYTE.

The World News And War Report is a relatively new zine published by John Honsinger (although he is not new to gamesmastering, and also publishes the wargame zine. Don Brandenburg for the Prussian Guard. His address is 1320 Aguiolla Ave, Modesto, Calif. 95350. There are openings for 5 and 7-man Dippy and the Youngstown Variant. Subscription to the zine is \$1.75/year (12 issues). To play a game you must subscribe and pay the game fee-- \$1 for 5- and 7-man, \$1.50 for the YV. Builds are apparently mailed in a separate bulletin, so each game-year takes two months.

Andrew Phillips (address with moves) has openings in his zine SHAAFT for a number of variants. These include Imperialism ~~VVVV~~, Interstellar Diplomacy I, Barbaria, Sectice Scripti, Hyperspace Diplomacy, and Balance of Power Diplomacy (play until all survivors agree to stop, so game could continue until one player controls all centers. Other variants can be opened by interested parties. To play you must sub for the duration of your stay in the game (8 issues/\$1, provide a \$1 sub deposit in case yours runs out before you have time to renew it (or just don't have the cash) and \$1 position deposit which is refunded if you don't resign or drop out of the game. Most people play more than one game, since additional games are in effect free. You've still got to provide the deposits and sub, but you've already taken care of two of those three for the first game. A very good zine.

Don't let ditto masters sit around for a week and then type more on them -- I fear this issue will show why.
