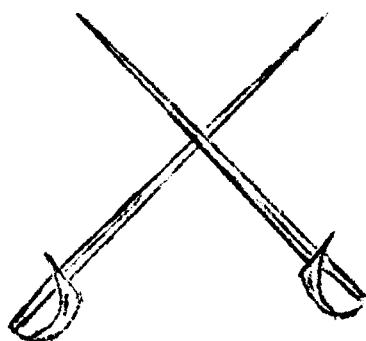
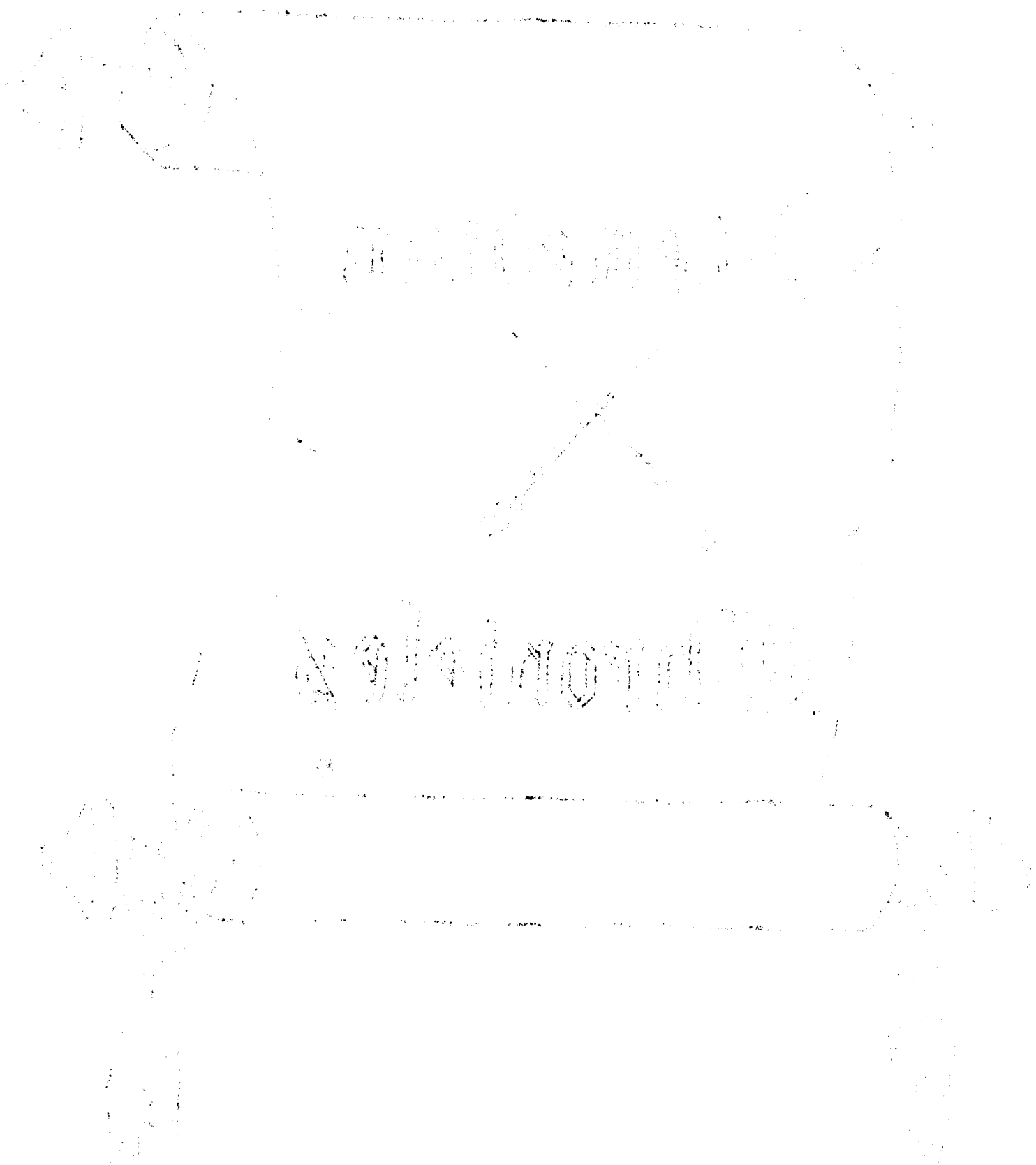

PRESS RELEASES:

NEW YORK (Apr. 1): The United Nations today sent a peace-keeping mission to the Danube.

MADRID (May 10): The loyal government of his most humble majesty Alfonso XI begins by sending our expressions of deepest sorrow to the British government on the death of her beloved queen, Victoria. We further wish to express our horror at the uncalled for invasion of our neutral territory by France against the wishes of HIS HOLINESS, THE POPE. We see however that the army of occupation is enjoying the traditional Spanish pleasures, having in turn been conquered by the grace and beauty of our maidens. VIENNA (Jan. 1): Health lessons will be given by invitation only.

LONDON (Feb. 14): The following is a letter received by the British Embassy in Stockholm, Sweden:

"The oppressed peoples of Sweden request the intervention of Britain to rid the Swedish nation of all foreign invaders, namely, the Russian infidels. The government of Sweden recognizes the British call for peace and freedom in Europe and asks the government of Britain to liberate the Swedish peoples in the name of all Swedish patriots at the earliest possible date."

The government of Britain acknowledges the Swedish plea for freedom, and, as the liberator of all oppressed peoples, has sent a command to the British armies now stationed in Denmark to free the Swedish people from the Russian invaders.
