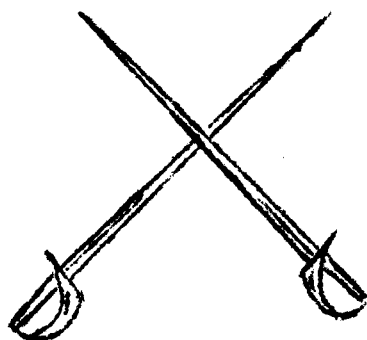
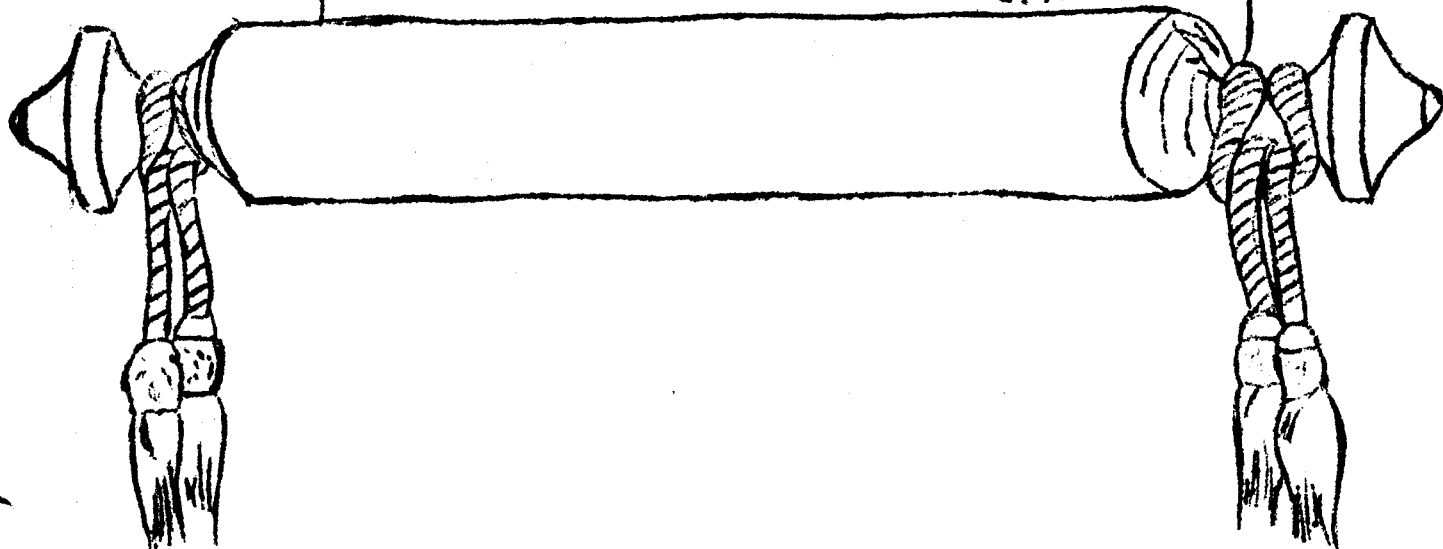


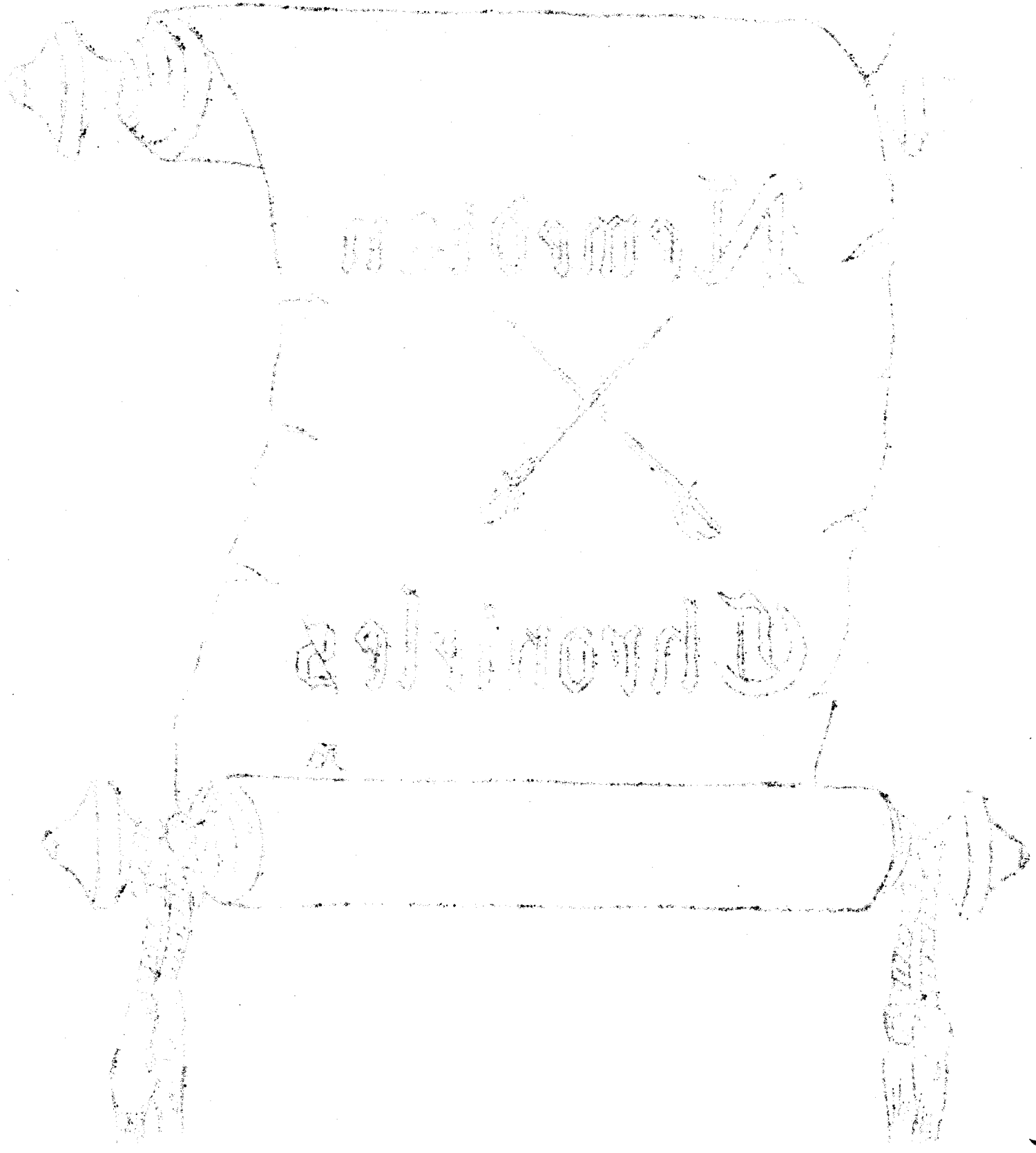

The Austrian army Serbia is dislodged and retreats to Albania. There is an interesting point here in the Russo-Turko-Austrian conflict, which is covered by Rule 41 (see PG #1). The supported Austria attack on Rumania is withstood by the supported Russian army, and hence the A Serbia would be under normal circumstances remain there. In this case, however, Turkey was attacking, with support, from Rumania, an army that was not supported in place. The support from Rumania remains good, even though Rum was attacked, because the attack came from the space into which Rum was supporting, and not from the side, as required for support cutting.

PRESS RELEASES

VIENNA (Feb. 1): Eberhard Fierock, Correspondent in Vienna, Serbia and Albania, said today that Macedonian tribesmen from bases in the mountains have greatly stepped up their night raids on these two territories, of (sic) the choicest stock and other farm products as well as the precious (sic) of the maidens.

Statesmen in the territories of Serbia and Albania appealed to Emperor Franz Joseph today for assistance against the now daily raids by the barbaric hordes of Macedonia. They are losing (sic) all their maidens.
