REVIEWS: Book #3: Glory Road by Robert A. Heinlein Ir seems to me that in his later books, Heilein has been deliberatly trying to inject some sex in his books. This is especially noticeable in Stranger in a Strange Land and in Glory Road. Glory Road is a difficult book to reccommend or not reccommend: I like it, but I don't like it, as good Heinlein. It is probably the closest thing to fantasy you'll ever get from this author, but it is still science fantasy. It is possible that the hero is a sort of modern day Conan- and yet there are differences. Most of Heinlein's work is science fiction, and extremely possible to come true. Glory Road is different- the immortal queen of another universe is hardly the most plausible character in the world. If you are a hard-core science fictionite, try reading it as a transition to fantasy. You won't like it the other way round. gfhg
