That Opening Year -- a short resume of classic opening play.

In 1901 each country has a center(s) that it expects to gain for a build. Also, because some areas of the board cause early friction as to whom shall receive a particular center, we find certain battle patters to evolve more frequently in games than others.

Briefly; Austria expects Ser and Gre; England expects Nwy; France expects Spa and Port; Italy expects Tunis; Germany Holand and Den; Russia Rum and Swe and Turkey Bul. France, England and Germany all WANT Belgium.

Inspection shows that the contest over Belgium and the "Balkan" area are the most explosive. Here three countries are meeting, piece to piece, and further expansion almost requires war between two or more of the nations in the area . The other early areas of battle are Iberia (if Italy goes West) The greater Ionian basin, if Italy goes East) and Scandinavia where Enghand, Russia and Germany each get one center-but would like more.

When a country deviates from his "normal* expanision by making assault into another area, or directly attacking a neighbor, he compromises his own country's normal expansion for tangent adventures into areas where can easily be hurt! Failure to strive for classis expansion begs other countries to capture your classic centers—and then continue right into your home county.

This does not mean that adventures are not possible—in fact they are the hart of advanced play! But uncoordinated attacks, and random assaults can only lead to disaster! The reason for this is that the game is a fine example of Bismarkian Diplomacy. A balance of power is finely maintained amoung the seven powers. A foolish power that grows suddenly by stabbing, just as suddenly, becomes the target for all the remaining powers.

The simple keynote is that if you offer another palayer temptation, he will, in good form, succumb to it!

Well here we go sportsfans, popps Rod Walker has blessed it, Larry Peery has carried it, quite a few people have called for it, and now here we have it. A New Diplomacy Organization in the making.

Bob Johnson, the head of the "Constitution Committee in being", has the intirim constitution all set and is beginning to write the final draft from recommendations we are now to send. Larry Peery is getting the master mailing list ready and soon we will have an election! Aren't you thrilled that all of this is being done for you, without your consent, in the name of Diplomacy?? Well aren't YOU!? Aren't you glad that Rod Walker is in there pushing for a NEW organization now, after he pushed for the reform group, after he questioned the DA under John Beshara. (changes his mind a lot, doesn't he? OR DOES HE??)

Could it be that Rod Walker REALLY wanted a NEW organization as soon as the DA came into existance? Could it be that even though he raised "doubts" about "chairman John's" intentions, he was REALLY planning a new organization THEN AND THERE? Could it be that Larry Perry also thou ght we needed a new organization but felt reform would be a better TEMPORARY banner?

Does the beginning of the NEW organization seem a little cut and dried, kind of like John Beshara all over again, except there are about a half of a dozen : do-gooders this time?
