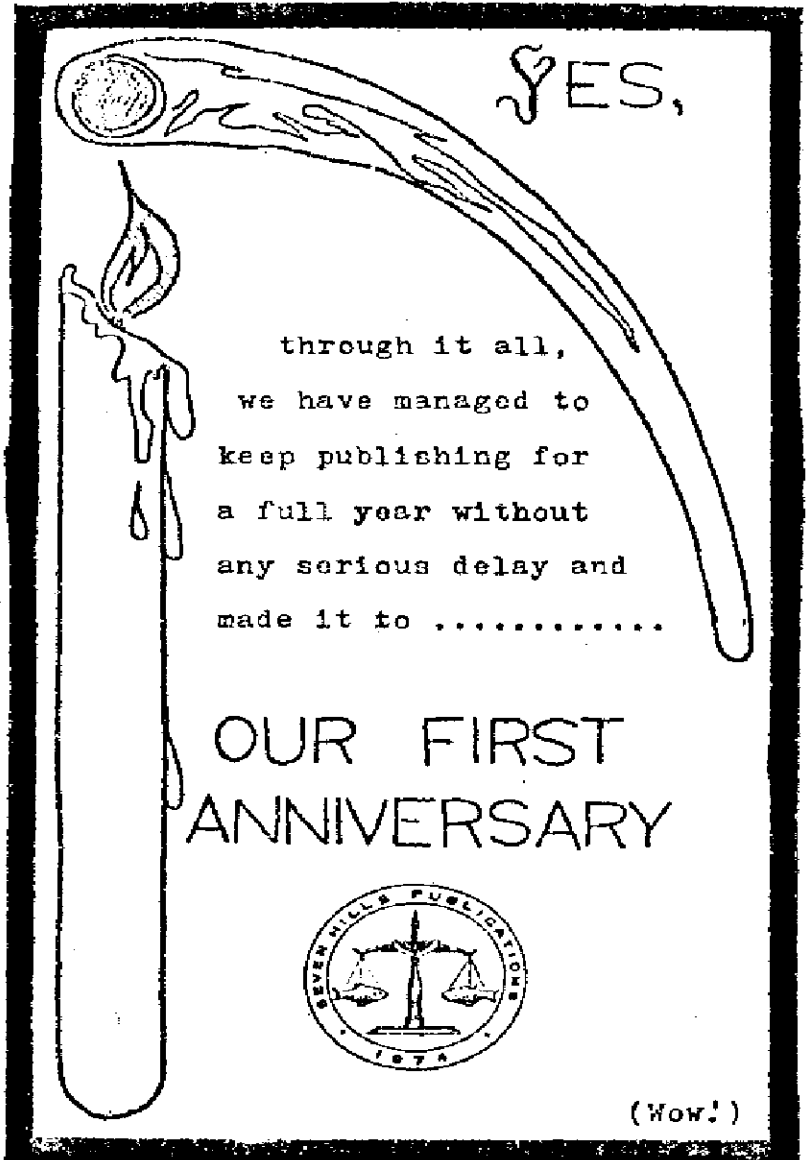
Mail Early! Don't Delay!

LEW HERRINGER: "I seldom trade BI, just sent it along for the hell of it. If you read the game results I'll read 'em, but if you don't I won't miss them. The too bad it is being run as a game rather than as a press-vehicle; I don't think much of VolG as a game, the Black Angles might be interesting. Just sent an NADPS form from Pen & Sword. Thanks." (Lew was refering to my variant line which is running a section of his Variants of the Ghods).

MY REPLY: Arrggghh! Is it my fault that no one writes press! JOHN MORAN: John sent a note to which was attached \$1.00 in us funds. It will be used to finance Larry Moran's extra mailing costs. JOHN, let this be your receipt, okay?

LARRY MORAN: "I'm sorry for not replying to your questionnaire. P&S is a good place and I enjoy it immensely. The maps are helpful and time-saving. However, my main interest nowadays is in playing and I receive two zines which contain only the results of the players moves. To me this is sufficient and the extra frills contribute in only a small way to my enjoyment. Unless you want to compete with DR or DW its not worth the extra effort as far as I am concerned. These other zines (DR & DW) provide me with valuable information and contain lengthy and interesting articles which in my opinion, compensate for the lack of games.

If you insist on going to all that extra work I don't want to discourage you. I read every word of P&S and follow the other games closely. The only criticism I can offer is that I would rather you didn't comment on the games, eg, pg.2 line 17, pg.3 line 29, pg.5 line 1 and comments in press release, etc."

MY REPLY: Hmmm... here's a lot to think about for P&S. I would hate to think that my efforts are being wasted when I could just publish (I'm not sure that would be correct in such a case as this) the results. Most of my reason for doing P&S as it is done is originality. That may be the wrong word considering I use articles and cartoons from other publications, but that's my reason. I have never seen a zine like P&S. I wanted it to be something that was interesting yet not something you had to read all of to enjoy. The short articles are just to let you browse through and get another view. The cartoons to break up the stagnant air of several games one after the other. Maybe I'm wrong to do this - maybe all the majority of players wants is the game results. My survey seems to indicate otherwise but....

As for my comments on the games, I doubt if I'll stop. I enjoy the comments I make because they seem, to me, to probably be what everyone is thinking anyway. Hell, they don't influence play I don't think, so long as I don't comment directly on a single move or set. Take Page 5, line 1 as an example - I said "You baffled him" after a set of moves. Well, it was the same (and maybe only) set of moves to be used. Nothing new nor nothing unusual. My comment was only to add emphasis to the fact that there was little else to be done. What's wrong with that?

I would be interested in hearing what some of you have to say about this: 1) game results only and, 2) GM comments interspersed in the zine. STEVE BROOKS: From a part of a press release in 1974-AFGD, "I'll get that Mike Lind and his mistress Mary-Ann Wright before this is over."

MY REPLY: Well, Steve, you guessed it. Mary-Ann is my girlfriend and now that the truth is out, Mary-Ann can come out in the open with more of her wild comments, etc. Look forward to them, right, Mary-Ann? Why don't you drop Steve some more of your quizzes, or something of the like???

KNOWLES: Hasn't anyone ever told you that its not very cool to send someone's wife letters through him? Now really, you're more forward than that Ron Kelly character!

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?



DEAR READERS:

Well, we made it. A year. So now what? That's what we've decided to tell you in this little note.

Once all of the games currently in PEN & SWORD are completed, we will cease publication of the zine. In most cases, the games are mostly completed now. 1971-AM, 1973-GJ, and 1972-DM are coming to a rapid end if things continue as they have of late. They should probably be finished in another five months. The other two games, 1972-GG and 1974-OL, have a considerable amount of time left in them - maybe as much as a year or more.

No new games will be begun in P&S from here on out. The zine will gradually lessen in content over this period of time but will not become just a set of moves if we can help it.

Our reasons for this are probably plain - expenses and time involved. We allowed ourselves a margin financially for the zine and we haven't lost too much there. And most of you have been very generous with your fees which helped greatly. Time is the main thing now. The zine has gotten to the point where we either want to expand it or drop it. Expansion is out of the question.

It's been fun for sure - and some work too. But, like they say, you only get out what you put in and we've come out ahead in pleasure. The zine was an experiment and our results come down to this - "It was really a fantastic experience but it's not something we want to continue for any long period of time."

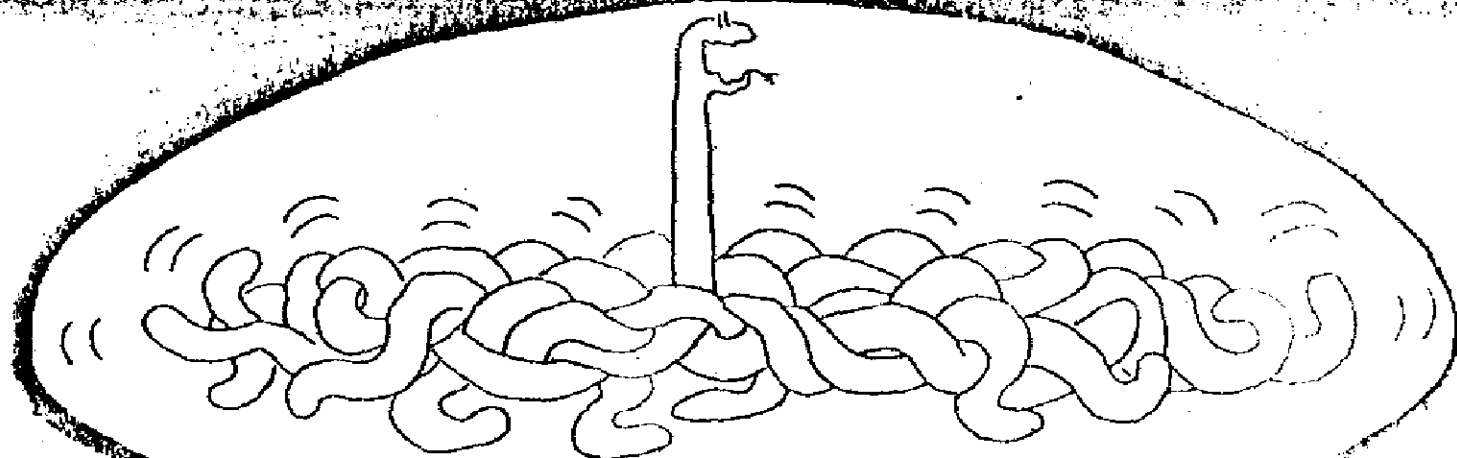
Most publishers probably do it for their ego more than anything else. We're no exception - it's nice to know that you can do something that can bring a little pleasure to people. Our little venture is just about at its end now, we've proved ourselves in a sense.

Now, we feel, is the time to make a decision and stick to it. Maybe this is why so many publishers drop out and leave games unfinished. They get into it too deep and can't phase it out. So, they abandon their players. Now that we've been in their place, we can understand their feelings. It's easy to overextend yourself.

If any of you have thought about publishing, think it over carefully. You'll hate yourself if you end up abandoning your games. Just remember that a single game can mean ten months to two years for completion. And more games may make it cheaper to produce but they will increase your workload too. If you're playing now, write to your GM's before you decide to publish and ask them what it's all about - it's worth your time.

So, that's where we stand. It's been great and all of you have helped to make it worthwhile for us. All of you have been a pleasure to play the game with - after all, it's people that make Diplomacy fun!
