by a malignant and malevolent Smyth?

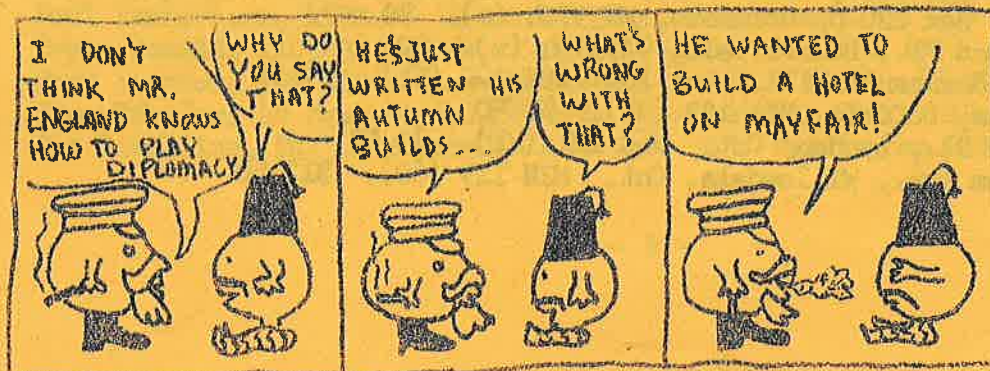
Allow me to quote the May 8 issue of Fol Si Fle, p. 14:

Last night François reached me over the phone to explain that the reason for the non-appearance of Passchendaele over the past two weeks was that the zine will be folding, and an announcement will be going out with the delayed issue this weekend. François is fond of pulling my leg, but he swore on his grandmother's grave, said he was getting married and churning out a lot of little François's, and the zine is late, after all. Randolph is a professional fence-sitter: with the above quote to back him up, he would say "Told ya so....!" if the zine was folding, and if not, "I didn't believe François one bit all along...". While subscribing to Fol Si Fle (Randolph Smyth, 212 Aberdeen St. 32, Medicine Hat, Alta. T1A 0R4) is encouraged, prospective subscribers should be aware of Randolph's wishy washy flip floppy flop flippy character.

Yes it's all true, Passchendaele will be folding with this issue. While I will hang onto the games for the next few weeks, I will be actively looking for new homes during the next month or so. I would therefore be most appreciative if some of the other GMs out there

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would volunteer to take over some of my games, writing me to make the necessary transfer arrangements. Player input (i.e., where you'd like your game(s) to be relocated, don't care, etc.) is also solicited. I expect that most if not all games will be relocated in Canadian 'zines; nevertheless, American QMs are still invited to volunteer their services. I will publish a small issue in September finalizing all the transfers.

Effective immediately all trades with Passchendaele are cut. This does not include mutual subscription arrangements, as I will refund these publishers' subs and therefore am entitled to continue getting their 'zines for as long as my subscription to their 'zines lasts out. I will not discontinue any of my current subscriptions and will subscribe to all 'zines I am currently playing in.

A remittance of all Passchendaele subs will be made quite soon, and no later than October 15, 1981. Patience...

The reasons for folding Passchendaele are, among others, my upcoming marriage on September 5, new hobbies, my new job, and my general disillusion with the current postal service. As Smyth implied, family life is time-expensive and doesn't leave much spare time for publishing, although he could have worded his phrase, "churning out a lot of little François's" in a less, ah, grotesque fashion. Similarly, the transition from a relatively leisurely student life to that of the working world has left me with less spare time. Finally, my disillusion with the postal system needs no explaining, what with the 45 days of CUPW striking we've just gone through...the last one was in October 1980...

I regret that it took me so much time to make this statement official and am also sorry about the tardiness of Passchendaele. While I do not intend to go into my reasons/excuses in detail, suffice it to say that the dramatic changes in my lifestyle have left me with very little spare time lately. Compounding my problems is that I had to retype several parts of this issue as time went by and they became outdated (I had the issue typed up and partly printed back in April, but the problem lied in finding time to print and mail the issue...as time went by, the game deadlines etc., had to be changed.).

The above means that I will have to refund \$44.50 in the coming months. However, I hope to reduce this amount, as I would like to sell my duplicator, a bunch of supplies, and a bunch of old 'zines. Would anyone be interested? I want \$300. for all this stuff (postage included), or \$250. for the duplicator, \$75. for the supplies, and \$10. for the 'zines for anyone interested in buying only some of the material. This is a good deal, as I remember paying \$300. for the duplicator alone...

Those who had signed up for a game may add \$5. to the amount I owe them.

## Will the Prize Game ever get going?

There is no way of knowing for sure, even if I have seven players signed up. What I plan to do is to print the game announcement now and see if I can relocate it (I probably will). If any of the players object to a transfer then the idea may always be scrubbed. For this reason I am not requesting a boardman number for this game yet. (Who is the BMC anyhow? I know that Lee Kandter Sr. has resigned, but have been too much out of touch with the hobby lately to know the name and address of his successor.) I might point out, however, that there should be no reason for the players to object so long as I find a GM of comparable GMing quality who is willing to run the game under the guidelines that I had set. We'll see.
