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We have a precedent set in the last moves. Therefore, if you didn't want the unit to retreat to the space you directed it to by tentative orders, then don't list any possible retreats. This rule hereby applies to all DIRIGO PRESS games GM'd by me. All this has been resolved by the situation brought up with RUSSIAN A Rum, which was retreated to Ukr last turn. Don, Doug, everyone...got it? OK.

Also last turn (Fall 1904) it was obvious to most that I had made an error in allowing FRENCH F Mid to succeed in its move to Spasc. It did not succeed and should have been underlined. This meant Spa belonged to ITALY (5/5, no change) and was lost to FRANCE (5/3, remove two). My apologies to all concerned for this error.

GAME OPENING ANNOUNCEMENTS.....

That should read "openings", but that just demonstrates to you how fallable, humble, and human I am (choke, gasp). There are 4 games now opening up in PELLUCIDAR. Well, actually, only two in PELLUCIDAR, and two by carbon copy! Yes, folks, we are going to try them on for size, and see how they work out. Please note that in order to play in the cc games, you still have to get PELLUCIDAR.

The following listing of peoples explains who has first cracks thus far, but don't get discouraged, there is room for 26 players in these games. First, I'd like to state the order of priority for entrance into this particular batch of games. 1. persons who have never played in PELLUCIDAR. 2. persons who have played, or are playing in PELLUCIDAR, but have been killed or done poorly. 3. people who are playing in PELLUCIDAR and done well. 4. people who are playing in two or more games in PELLUCIDAR. (There are a few exceptions to the above, in general I am trying to give novices and/or new people a chance to enter these games.)

The four games being opened are: Game #8: Hyborean Age II (5 players), and games 9, 10, and 11 or regular Diplomacy.

NOTE: If you are on the guaranteed entry listing, you're in. If your name is listed elsewhere, you should be able to get in, but in all honesty I can't promise it. You will be notified within 4 weeks whether or not you have gained entry.

The gamefees vary from \$5 to an absolute high of \$7, depending on who you are. All of this info is disseminated on the Register form itself.

If you send a check or money order in without my form, IT WILL BE RETURNED. Sorry, but this zine is so big now, there has to be a method to this madness. If you refuse to use my method-I don't want you. On the cheerful side, keep in mind that the higher the percentage of people above who actually DO NOT join, the better chance there is of you getting in if your name isn't up there. I expect 50% of the above will not join a new game, so take heart.

73DT FRESS.....

ANKARA-Military and naval sources here indicated that their new joint command center at Troy near the Dardanelles will be completed and headquarter functions will be transferred there this spring. The new command center, often called the Pentagram, is reputed to be the most expensive and efficient in the world.

SOPHIA-Bulgarian government sources here report that the annexation of Bulgaria into the Association of Sovereign States (A.S.S.) has gone as expected. Bulgarian army and navy personnel have reported to various Turkish units for training.

ANKARA- The Turkish Army has announced that the First Army, which took part in the annexation of Bulgaria to the A.S.S., has been renamed the Army of the Byzantine to honor its ready mobilization and accomplishments. Meanwhile, the Second Army is nearing the end of its training in Smyrna. The Navy also announced the transfer of the First Fleet to the Dardanelles to take part in the celebrations surrounding the opening of the Pentagram.

LONDON- On the 64th Anniversary of her reign, Her Majesty, the Queen, bestowed upon the heads of the French and German governments honorary admiralships in the British Navy. Amid shouts of "God Save The Queen" and "Rule Britannia", Victoria called for greater solidarity among the three great West European powers. "We shall make every effort", she declared, "to bring a lasting peace to the Atlantic".

VIENNA-Today Empress Khristine Von Beautious at the age of 18 assumed the throne. She will strive to keep Austria whole and powerful in the upcoming war.

DEEP WOODS-Yeah, but is she cherry?

BERLIN-General Gehlen of the German General Staff announced that there was no known enemy of Germany on the continent of Europe. If the "New Germany" ever entered in another conflict it would have to be instituted by someone else. Probably a non-European power. General Gehlen is known for his astute knowledge of European affairs. He has never been known to make a mistake in the area of Diplomacy.

PARIS-Due to increasing civil disorder in the Iberian Peninsula the First French Fleet has been sent there to help quiet things. There has also been a rumor circulating through the capitol about a general European war. This rumor may have some basis in that this government has noted an increase in the stockpiling of arms throughout Europe.

IN DA FOREST-The 23rd through 29th Orc hords of Iberian Things have reportedly deluged over the crests of the Pyrennes and are now flooding into Gascony and Marseilles, after having zonked the First French Fleet and its attached forces. It is reported that the Things have a fiendish thirst for human blood and flesh, especially those of Polish humans as the meat of the Cranium area is so very soft. A plea for aid has been swiftly sent to the Mirkwood-by-the-Saco, and hopefully GOD will see fit to intervene and save the French Scum.

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73M Press.....

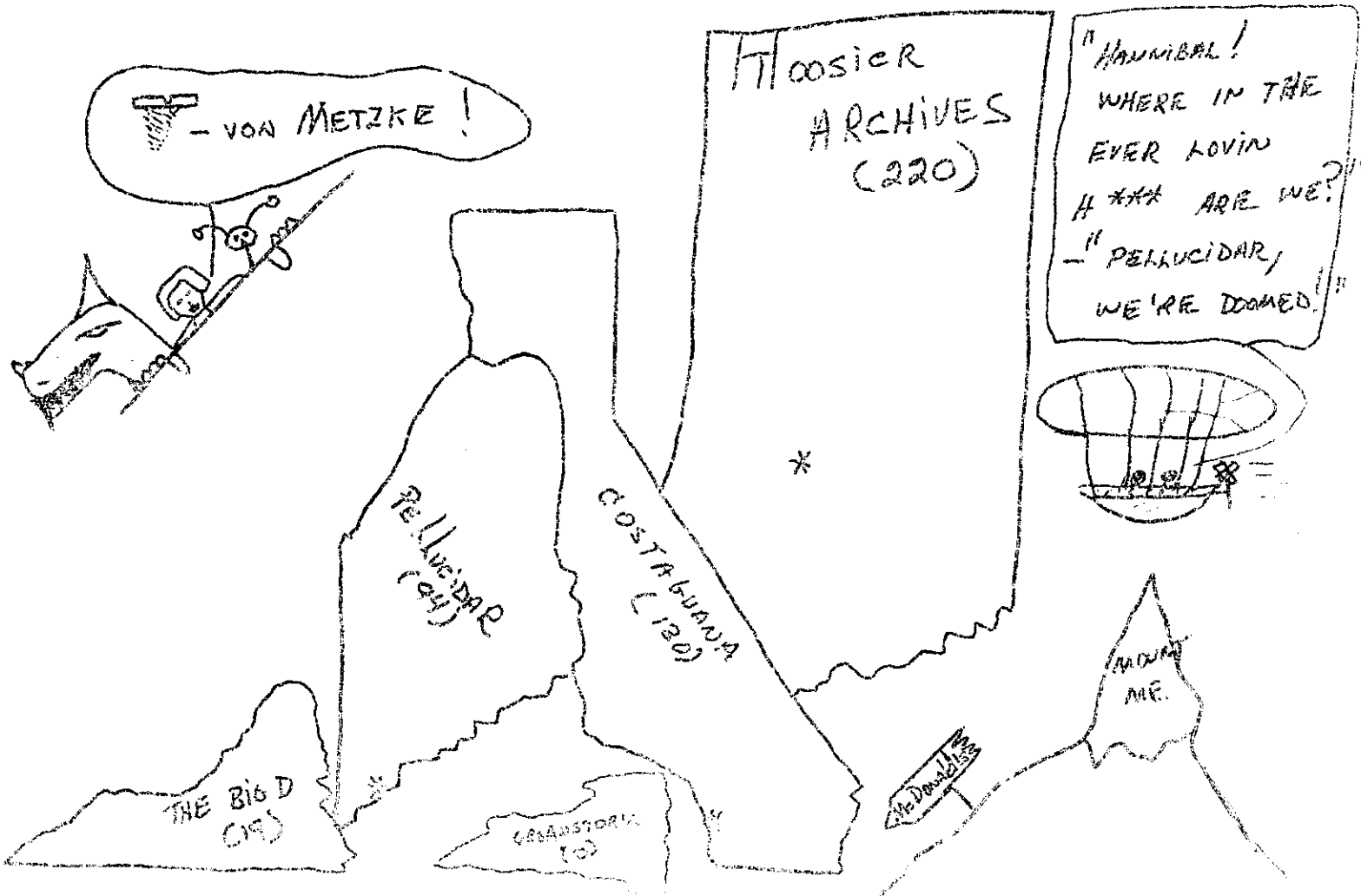
